Action you are required to take at the conclusion of the audit

The Accounts and Audit (England) Regulations 2011 (SI 2011/817) set out what you must do at the conclusion of the audit. In summary, you are required to:

- Prepare a "Notice of conclusion of the audit and right to inspect the Annual Return", in line with the statutory requirements. We attach a proforma notice you may use for this purpose.
- Display the "Notice" for a period of at least 14 days, along with the certified Annual Return*. [The Annual Return must be displayed so that at least Sections 1, 2 and 3 are visible. - Keep copies of the Annual Return available for purchase by any person on payment of a reasonable sum.




