To all the key workers who live within the village who have continued to work through this difficult period, doctors, nurses, carers, pharmacists undertakers, all those in the food industry from farmers to retail store operatives, police, firemen, the manufacturers involved in the manufacture and maintenance of much needed equipment and so many more unsung heroes – we are extremely grateful. All those helping to ensure we all keep well by maintaining good social distancing and remaining in isolation when asked to. Thanks to everyone for their contribution.

Volunteer Group - here to help you

The Parish Council and helpers posted a leaflet to every home within the parish asking for volunteers to help those who needed help whilst in self-isolate i.e. those with Covid-19 symptoms, those living with someone with Covid-19 symptoms and those in the vulnerable category (over 70 or have a medical condition that puts them in high risk). The Parish Council would like to extend a great big THANK YOU to the many villagers

who have volunteered to help others in such a time of need.

Since we sent out the leaflet, we have been told that the extremely vulnerable will need to isolate for 12 weeks.

We would also like to remind those who find themselves in this situation that we are here to help; if you need shopping fetching, a prescription picking up or simply a friendly phone call so that you do feel so alone whilst in isolation, your community really wants to help you. Just phone, text or email one of the Parish Councillors listed below and we will activate the volunteering process. Be sure the make the request for prescriptions well in advance of when it is required, ensuring at least one week of supply.

Please don't be afraid to ask!!

All volunteers will of course maintain the 'required' social distancing and hand hygiene to ensure that anything handed **over is as safe as possible.**

Working from Home

For those who are working from home please remember to give yourself time to breathe within the village; it is looking fantastic at this time of the year and give everyone the necessary space.

Considerate use of footpaths

While many of us are finding lockdown difficult and fresh air is very welcome. Please be considerate on footpaths and cyclists should be considerate to walkers on the leys. On occasion it will be necessary to close the path for your safety while work is being carried out, please respect signage that is displayed. Walkers on footpaths must follow the country code and not cause harm to farm crops or livestock and of course all dog poo must be picked up!

Parish Meetings

In view of the current coronavirus emergency the Parish Council has decided to suspend its scheduled public meeting until further notice, and that position is now reflected on our Council Meetings page. Unfortunately, this includes our normal Annual Parish Meeting in May. We are awaiting confirmation of any new arrangements; as soon as these become clear we will notify everybody.

Parish Council members will continue to operate and function throughout this difficult period and will welcome public comment. The health risks around hosting a large gathering at this time are considered to be unacceptable.

New Mental Health Helpline

A 24/7 mental health helpline has been launched to take pressure off 111 for mental health advice in Oxfordshire and Buckinghamshire.

The round-the-clock helpline will make it quicker and easier for people in Oxfordshire and Buckinghamshire to get the right advice they need for their mental health.

It will operate 24 hours a day, seven days a week and temporarily takes pressure off 111 for people who need mental health care when their situation it is not life threatening.
