Great news! Our lovely village hall is to get a brand new kitchen in just a few weeks' time. The Hall committee has been working hard to define exactly what we need and how we can achieve it in the small space available - and what we have come up with is a radical re-design.

The narrow sliding door from the entrance hall will go, a new doorway will be created where the serving hatch presently is and IKEA kitchen units will adorn the other three walls in a horse-shoe shape. There will be wall cupboards along the length of one wall and shelving along the length of another to give more storage space and a greater work-surface area than at present.

We also have plans to store the Hall tables out of sight and to create a cupboard under the stairs. The long tables will be stored in the gents' loo. To accommodate them there, one of the urinals will be removed and the hand-basin moved into its place (with a dividing wall between it and the two remaining urinals). The tall cupboard will be removed and the tables will then fill the space immediately inside the main door (to the left as you enter).

The short tables will be stored in the ladies' loo, where the low cupboard presently is (to the right as you enter). Although the cupboard will be lost, a shelf will be retained above the tables.

If you have any views on the proposals for table storage, now is the time to let us know!

## Grafty Gourmet

This is great for those with a sweet tooth. The Italian hazelnut liqueur Frangelico is stocked by some supermarkets and is also available online. Serve with double cream and extra Frangelico.

### Chocolate Tart with Crunchy Hazelnut & Frangelico

#### For the Praline:

150g blanched hazelnuts  
125g caster sugar

#### For the Tart:

300g plain chocolate with 70 per cent cocoa solids, broken up into small pieces  
150ml Frangelico  
150g unsalted butter, softened at room temperature  
4 large eggs, separated  
150g icing sugar, sifted  
200ml double cream, at room temperature

1. For the praline, heat the oven to 180°C. Line a baking tray with non-stick baking paper and set aside. Put the blanched hazelnuts on another baking tray and roast in the oven for about 10 minutes until the nuts turn a light golden colour. Tip on to the baking paper lined tray.
2. Pour the caster sugar into a frying pan and, over a very low heat, without stirring at all, allow the sugar to melt. Once melted you can swirl the pan around a little to ensure the sugar cooks evenly. When the sugar has become a rich, brown caramel immediately pour over the hazelnuts and leave to cool completely. Once hard, break up into pieces and place in a food processor. Process to a fine crumb and set aside.
3. For the tart, base-line a 22cm spring-form cake tin with a circle of baking paper. Place the chocolate and Frangelico in a pudding basin over a saucepan of gently simmering water, making sure the basin does not come into contact with the water. Melt the chocolate then, using a wooden spoon, beat in, a tablespoon at a time, the room temperature butter. If the mixture starts to separate, stir in a little tepid water to bring it together. Take off the heat and leave to cool for 15-20 minutes. Beat in the egg yolks.
4. Place the egg whites in a large mixing bowl and beat to stiff peaks. Gradually beat in the icing sugar. Fold into the chocolate. Whip the cream to floppy peaks and fold into the chocolate. Finally fold in half the praline. Pour into the prepared tin, cover with cling film and refrigerate, preferably overnight, until very firm. To serve, run a knife around the sides and release the spring-form mould. Place a flat serving plate over the chocolate tart and invert. Lift off the metal base and peel off the parchment. Dust the surface with the remaining praline and cut into thin slices. Serve with cream laced with a little Frangelico.

## Minutes of a Planning Committee Meeting held in Grafty Green Village Hall at 7.30pm on Thursday 20<sup>th</sup> June 2019

4. **Approval of Minutes of the Planning Meeting on 12<sup>th</sup> March 2019** – the Minutes were Approved.
5. **Planning Applications**

(i) Public session

There were eight members of the public present. Members of the public living close to the site raised some concerns about application **19/502474/FULL**

(ii) **APPLICATION REF: 19/502474/FULL PROPOSAL:** Erection of a three bedroom detached house with associated driveway and parking on land to the rear of the existing property. Demolition of a detached double garage. ADDRESS: Kitsilano Headcorn Road Grafty Green Maidstone, Kent ME17 2AN

The Committee agreed to object to this application for the following reasons:

1. The scale and height of the proposed development would dominate the immediate vicinity
2. The proposed property would be located closer to Church Road than the neighbouring properties thus emphasizing the dominance of the proposed house in relation to surrounding area. It will be located beyond the current building line of neighbouring properties on the same side of Church Road
3. The height and scale of the proposed development in relation to the size of the site will detract from the character of the immediate neighbourhood
4. The height and location of the proposed development in relation to the plot will adversely affect the sight lines and privacy of the bungalows on the opposite side of Church Road
5. The documents are unclear whether the development is 2, 2.5 or 3 storeys

(iii) **APPLICATION REF: 19/502086/FULL PROPOSAL:** Retention of two mobile homes and removal of concrete base. ADDRESS: Little Willows Eastwood Road Ulcombe, Maidstone, Kent ME17 1ET.

It was agreed that the Council will object to this application and a response previously circulated to councillors was agreed as the council's response to this consultation.

(i) **Public Session** – Alistair Cracknell and Josh Wilson-Holliday from Quinn Estates outlined their proposal to convert two office units at Boughton Place into two large detached houses (19/502685/FULL) . Alistair and Josh talked through the drawings and responded to questions

(ii) **APPLICATION REF: 19/502685/FULL**

**PROPOSAL:** Application for a change of use of two business units (Class B1a) to create two residential dwellings (Class C3), and erection of garages, drives and gates to serve the units. **ADDRESS:** Grafty Green Garden Centre Headcorn Road Grafty Green Kent ME17 2AT

It was agreed that the Council will object to this application on the grounds that the scheme could be re-designed to create four semi-detached houses rather than two large detached houses. As such, the scheme would then better meet the needs of the local area, at a more affordable price. In addition, the scheme would be more sustainable if the semi-detached properties were purchased by people already living and working in the local area.

(iii) **Application Reference: 19/502742/FULL**

**Proposal:** Erection of a replacement two bedroom dwelling and detached single garage (Resubmission). **Location:** Hillside Headcorn Road, Grafty Green ME17 2AP

It was agreed that the Council will support this application, provided it is clear throughout the documentation that the exterior is completely finished in weatherboarding, and painted white, to be in keeping with other houses in the area and the existing property. Some of the documents submitted, e.g. the Heritage Statement, refer to a finish in brickwork walls with weatherboarding above.
