September 2022

Glad to see that the grain harvest is finished with no more local field fires. Extraordinary to see William hitting the national news as he drove his green tractor alongside the flames to create a firebreak on a neighbour's burning crop!. Without the fire service and quick thinking, the outcome could have been so much worse.

Reminders

The church porch is proving a welcome haven with the tea/coffee and biscuit facilities. We are pleased to see comments in the visitors book on the window sill. A number of Sylvia's jams have been purchased too. The porch is open at all times for everyone.

New notice board. I hope you are impressed with the 'bigger and better' noticeboard sited along the wall behind the bench. We have yet to make full use of its location and size, but hope our information and news will be more visible for visitors and those passing along the road.

The main church building is open for services only. At other times please contact the churchwardens for a key. Their details are elsewhere in the magazine and on the noticeboard in the porch.

The tower masonry. The scaffolding is a very obvious addition to the building for now. Hopefully this means the repairs are underway. Nothing much in evidence, but we can hope

the stonemason will make progress soon. At least the tower area is no longer a danger.

Celtic Morning prayers will continue each Monday morning 9-9.30am in the side chapel. If you have any prayer requests please contact Rev. John Huggins, Rev. Charlotte Coles or the churchwardens, or leave a note in the basket in the porch and prayers will be said at Monday Morning Prayer time or in private if you wish.

Donations to Ukraine can still be taken to the back of St.Mary's church in Lenham. Directions are in place when you get there and is open daily from 9-5pm.

Main items needed are: nappies, baby wipes, baby food/milk (not glass), sanitary items, medical kit basics, pain killers, tinned meat and fish (with ring pulls), blankets and warm socks.

Information

The Wotton Tomb continues to interest visitors from far and wide. The architect is helping to design the next stage of care. More information about the family is being brought to light from many sources. We have been sent a photograph of the tomb in Redgrave in Suffolk of Sir Edward's daughter, Philippa, (married to Sir Edmund Bacon). Her tomb covering is identical to the one of her father in St.Nicolas. The information given in Redgrave is that it was designed by her uncle Sir Henry Wotton, brother of Sir Edward, and constructed by Nicholas Stone, master mason in the Office of Works of Charles1, (the plans are in his notebook)!

Re-organisation of the pews continues. Peter is making the refectory table in his workshop from oak sourced locally.

Funeral of Mike Davidson took place at Charing Crematorium on Monday 22nd August. The chapel was packed and the family gave moving and affectionate memories of his life.

We shall miss his regular presence, generosity and humour at services in St.Nicolas.

Sadness as we were told of the death of Rev. David Wright, vicar of Lenham and Boughton Malherbe for a number years. He had been living at a retirement home in Spain for some time. Our prayers go out to his family here and in Spain.

Village Coffee Time. We are enjoying the longer time available to catch up with friends. The timing from 11am - 2.15pm on Tuesdays, gives the chance for everyone to talk, drink coffee/tea, sample the cakes and biscuits, shop for local vegetables, Sylvia's jams, try out the small samples of eco-products, (reminders that eco-church products will again be available in St.Nicolas when our re-organisation of the space is finished), and teas and coffees from Pluckley Teas. Come and see what is happening. Dogs are definitely welcome!

Another £100 has been given to aid for Ukraine and £100 to St.Nicolas from donations.

Centenary Fete. Such a friendly occasion last Saturday. Another beautiful warm and sunny afternoon in that unique setting under the hill. From our stall we could hear the laughter, and the shrieks of excited children reacting to the Punch and Judy Shows. Our stall made more than £200 for church funds. Thank you to the organisers for their hard work.

Also thank you so much for the support shown to our efforts to maintain and cherish your village heritage, this ancient church, as it has cared for this community over the centuries

Grafty Green Scarecrow Festival

Maidstone Borough Council will be hosting a scarecrow festival where scarecrows from around the borough will be displayed both in retail/High Street locations and at the Wellmeadow Centre in Maidstone on the week commencing 24th October.

I would like to invite you all to take part by making your own scarecrow and either displaying it prominently in your front garden or on the village green, (I have sought the permission of both the Pub and the Parish Council who are agreeable to us attaching scarecrows to the fence posts surrounding the green.

We have arranged with the event organiser at Maidstone for one of our scarecrows to be included in the Maidstone display so please let me know at bromley@ashleylaw.co.uk if you would like to take part so that I can arrange for rules and instructions to be provided to assist you in preparing your scarecrow.

The Village Hall will then be transformed into Scarecrow Central on Saturday 15th October between 10 am and 2pm so that you can obtain a map detailing the location of the scarecrows vote on your preferred scarecrow and obtain light refreshments to sustain you on your trip round the village.

The Outreach Post Office Service Every Tuesday 12.45 pm to 2.15 pm.

As many of you will have experienced recently we have had an intermittent service from the Post Office's outreach service with it being cancelled at short notice. This is frustrating as the Village Hall has no control over the service, (or lack of), provided. I have however had a frank exchange of views with the Postmaster in Headcorn and left him in no doubt as to the frustration and inconvenience this causes our village community particularly the elderly and vulnerable who might not be able to travel to

an alternative venue. I have also spoken to the Manager of Post Office Limited who is responsible for our area to try and find ways to ensure the service is more reliable going forward. Regrettably there are few if any realistic alternative options to the present arrangements. Finally I have agreed to meet with the Postmaster at Headcorn to review the situation towards the end of September. I will provide a further update after this meeting.

It's not all bad news, normal service has resumed for the last two weeks and I am hopeful that this will continue, we have also arranged for OG Plants, (who offer locally grown fruit and vegetables), to visit the hall on a Tuesday between 11 am and 1pm, Sally Alexander will from the start of this month make available some of the Church's Eco Shop products and Sue Burch has kindly arranged a supply of Pluckley Tea which is available to purchase along with homemade preserves.

If you know of anyone who would like to supply locally produced items for visitors to purchase at the coffee morning please let me know as we would like to offer these if it is feasible to do so.

59 Bus News

With Ulcombe Hill now closed for water main work until January next year, and with no suitable diversion route available, the Monday to Saturday bus service to and from Sutton Road, Morrisons, is having to terminate at Kingswood.

HOWEVER, IT IS NOT ALL BAD NEWS!

Nu-Venture has amended the 59 timetable, and has managed to ensure that Grafty Green and Ulcombe will continue to be served.

Since 15th August, on **Mondays and Wednesdays only**, Nu-Venture is operating a service from Grafty Green directly **TO AND FROM MAIDSTONE TOWN CENTRE**.

The bus leaves Grafty Green at 10.00, arriving at Maidstone King Street at 10.53, and returns from the King Street bus stop L2 (close to Greggs) at 12.30, arriving at Grafty Green at 13.22.

It runs via Ulcombe, Chart Sutton, Boughton Monchelsea and Loose, and does not serve Kingswood on those two days.

Bus passes are accepted, but if you do not have one (check the KCC website to see if you qualify to apply for one) the adult return fare is £4-90.

Even though it is only operating for the time being on two days a week, there is now no need to change buses to reach Maidstone Town Centre, and this provides a good opportunity to demonstrate that a direct service to Maidstone is what most people seem to want.

Minutes of a Planning Committee Meeting held in the village hall at 7.00pm on Monday 15th August 2022

Present:

Cllrs B Adams; N Eastwood; R Galton; G Kennaird (Chair); R Turner

Clerk: Mrs Vickie Ford 6 members of the public

Cllr Kennaird opened the meeting at 7 pm

- 1. Declaration of anybody filming/recording this meeting none
- 2. Apologies for Absence None
- 3. Declarations:
 - (i) Declarations of Interest in items on the Agenda none
 - (ii) Declarations of Lobbying none
- Approval of Minutes of the Planning Meeting on 4th July 2022 approved and signed as a true and accurate record
- 5. Planning Applications:
 - (i) Public Session The applicant addressed the Planning Committee with regard to the Hillside application. The previous application for the site had been supported by the Parish Council but opposed by Maidstone Borough Council (MBC) on the grounds of adverse visual impact. The applicant explained that the new proposed building was single storey and represented a complete redesign by an architect. Professional landscaping advice had been incorporated; the proposed new entrance would improve the visibility splay; during construction, large lorries would be asked to travel via Headcorn, not Liverton Hill.

(ii) APPLICATION REF: 22/503594/FULL

PROPOSAL: Demolition of existing stables and erection of a single storey building to form annex accommodation for elderly family members

ADDRESS: Pig And Whistle, Headcorn Road, Grafty Green, ME17 2AS

RESOLVED: to support the application (iii) APPLICATION REF: 22/503658/FULL

PROPOSAL: Demolition of existing bungalow and outbuildings, erection of replacement single storey dwelling and carport/storage structure, and relocation of driveway entrance with new electric gate

ADDRESS: Hillside, Headcorn Road, Grafty Green, ME17 2AP

Cllr Galton asked the applicants how the internal floor area of the new proposed building compared to the previous design. The applicants stated that the overall floor area was slightly smaller but that the footprint was larger as the new proposed building was single storey. Cllr Galton also asked if the applicants had considered any ground problems and they confirmed they had commissioned a soil survey.

RESOLVED: to support the application

All members of the public left the meeting.

6. Practice Direction for Calling Planning Committee Meetings

The Chairman expressed his concern that step c) of the newly-agreed Practice Direction may not allow enough time for a meeting to be confirmed and thus there was potential for an application to be missed:

- a) Relevant planning applications to be publicised alongside provisional meeting date and summary of these arrangements
- b) Meeting may be confirmed by methodology in standing orders
- c) Upon the elapse of a week with no such requests the meeting is to be cancelled
- d) Procedure may be abbreviated where requests received in advance of provisional publication
- e) Consideration of an application may be added to the agenda for an existing planning meeting (or full council meeting) subject to Standing Orders
- f) Provisional meetings to be held on first or third Mondays of month when convenient

The Clerk explained that she did not rely only on receiving notification letters from MBC but checked the weekly lists for applications within the Parish. She also forwarded the weekly lists to the Planning Committee Chairman to check for applications within, or relevant to, the Parish.

RESOLVED: the Clerk to forward the weekly lists to Cllr Galton in addition to Cllr Kennaird.

The Meeting closed at 7.15 pm

Grafty Gourmet

This is a great barbecue recipe. Cooked on kebab skewers this chicken with a spicy, sweet sticky glaze are sure to go down well.

ORIENTAL BARBECUED CHICKEN

12 Chicken thighs, boneless and skinless
2 tablespoons of soy sauce
1 tablespoon of sesame oil
1 thumb-sized piece ginger, grated
4 Spring Onions, sliced

For the glaze
4 tablespoons of Korean chilli paste (gochujang)
2 tablespoons of clear honey
Juice of ½ lime
1 tablespoon of soy sauce
1 teaspoon of sesame oil
2 tablespoons of sesame seeds

- 1. Mix the chicken in the soy sauce, sesame oil and ginger. Thread each thigh on two long metal skewers, so that each skewer pierces one side of the thigh. Keep threading the chicken, making sure it's packed onto the skewers tightly. Chill until you're ready to cook. Mix the ingredients for the glaze.
- 2. Heat the BBQ. Cook the kebab for 5-8 mins on each side (depending on the heat). Once nicely charred but not fully cooked through, start painting on the glaze. The honey will catch if cooked for too long the key to nice sticky chicken is applying the glaze in layers, turning the kebab often.
- 3. Once the glaze has been used up and the chicken is cooked through (about 20 mins in total), transfer to a plate and leave to cool for 5 mins before serving scattered with spring onions.



2. Is Microsoft Teams free

For the free version of Microsoft Teams? Anyone with any corporate or consumer email address can sign up for Teams. People who don't already have a paid Microsoft 365 commercial subscription will have access to the free version of Teams.

3. Do you need to install Teams to join a meeting?

All you need to join a Teams meeting is a link. Select "Click here" to join the meeting in your meeting invite to be taken to a page where you can choose to either join on the web or download the desktop app. If you already have the Teams app, the meeting will open there automatically.

4. Is Microsoft Teams better than zoom?

Zoom is better for external meetings; Teams is better for internal meetings. It's beyond easy for external participants to join a Zoom meeting from anywhere on any device—all you need is a link. This makes it a great option if you host a lot of meetings, large or small, with people outside your organisation

The anniversary this month is 30th September – 170th anniversary of the birth of Sir Charles Villiers Stanford, an Anglo-Irish composer, music teacher, and conductor of the late Romantic era. Born to a well-off and highly musical family in Dublin, Stanford was educated at the University of Cambridge before studying music in Leipzig and Berlin. He was instrumental in raising the status of the Cambridge University Musical Society, attracting international stars to perform with it.

While still an undergraduate, Stanford was appointed organist of Trinity College, Cambridge. Aged 29, he was one of the founding professors of the Royal College of Music, where he taught composition for the rest of his life. From 1887 he was also Professor of Music at Cambridge. As a teacher, his pupils included rising composers whose fame went on to surpass his own, such as Gustav Holst and Ralph Vaughan

Williams. As a conductor, Stanford held posts with the Bach Choir and the Leeds triennial music festival.

Stanford composed a substantial number of concert works, including seven symphonies, but he is best-remembered for his choral works for church performance. He was a dedicated composer of opera, but none of his nine completed operas has endured in the general repertory. Some critics regarded Stanford, together with Hubert Parry and Alexander Mackenzie, as responsible for a renaissance in music from the British Isles


