113.	<ul> <li>Questions from the public.</li> <li>The following questions were raised: <ul> <li>Could the Parish Council minutes be published in the Fletching Parish Magazine? It was thought that there is not enough room in the magazine to do this, but the minutes are posted on Parish Council website and on the notice board outside the village hall.</li> <li>Could a permanent football net be placed on the recreation ground for children to play with because at the moment, they kick a ball against a cricket sight screen which is being damaged? This is a matter for the Recreation Ground committee but the Parish Council will suggest it to them.</li> <li>Could the email to Wealden District Council showing the Parish Council support for the application to list the Rose and Crown as a community asset be posted on the website? 116.	Minutes of the meetings held on 7 <sup>th</sup> August 2017. It was <b>resolved</b> to accept the minutes of the meeting held on 7 <sup>th</sup> August 2017 as a true record and they were signed by Cllr Dickens who chaired that meeting.	
117.	<ul> <li>Planning applications.</li> <li>WD/2017/1431/F Splaynes Green Farm, North Hall Lane, Fletching. Demolition of the existing farmhouse building and the erection of a replacement dwelling and garage. Demolition of existing dilapidated sheds and associated poultry farm buildings with the erection of a two storey dwelling and garage in their place. It was resolved to recommend this application for approval.</li> </ul>

	<ul> <li>WD/2017/1892/LDE (Certificate of lawful development application for existing use). Stationing of residentially occupied mobile home. Malling Farm, Down Street, Piltdown.</li> <li>Cllr Dickens confirmed that the mobile home has been occupied for more than 10 years. It was agreed to recommend that the mobile home should be tied to agriculture so that it can only be used by people associated with the farm.</li> </ul>	
	<ul> <li>WD/2017/1384/F The Marles, North Hall Lane, Fletching. Demolition of existing agricultural barn and erection of contemporary dwelling, new access, landscaping and associated infrastructure.         There was a lengthy discussion regarding this application and when a vote was taken, 2 voted in favour of it, 1 voted against it and three Councillors abstained. So, whilst the Parish Council do not object in principle the following points and concerns were raised during the discussion which the Clerk was asked to pass on to Wealden District Council:         <ul> <li>the new building will not be on the same site as the existing barn, but it is understood that this was to preserve two old oak trees.</li> <li>the footprint of the new building is larger than the existing barn, but it is understood that this is because it will be a one and half storey building that will lie low on the land to reduce the impact.</li> <li>the glass will be clearly visible from the road especially during winter.</li> <li>the main concern is that the site is in an Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB) and that the modern design of the building is out of character and not appropriate for the area.</li> </ul> </li> <li>WD/2017/1814/F Replacement of existing porch on street front with new. Removal of porch on south front and replacement with window. Remodellind of the east and south elevations of the single storey service wing to include new steps and porch. Removal of modern partitions on ground floor and restoration of southern chimney breast and fireplaces. Alterations to bathrooms at first floor level. Remove bathroom at second floor level and form new bathroom in another room. Clinton Lodge, High Street, Fletching. Clir N. Collum declared a prejudicial interest because she submitted this application and the Parish Council declined to comment.</li></ul>

The Parish Council is concerned that the Recreation Ground request grants every year and that it should be more self-sufficient. This request is for maintenance work that the Charity should be able to cover. As a one-off gesture of good will the Parish Council agreed to pay a grant for half the amount requested i.e. £370. 	Cllr Sainsbury asked for it to be recorded that she did not agree with paying the grant because the Charity should not be reliant on the Parish Council each year and it should raise their fees, if necessary, to cover their own costs.	
120.	Burial Ground Maintenance: -New grass cutting specification for 2018-2021. Cllr Dickens and the Clerk have reviewed and revised the grass cutting schedule which was circulated prior to the meeting. It was <b>resolved</b> to accept the new schedule which will be used for obtaining quotes for the new contract starting next year.	B. Dickens
