### **PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE**

### Village survey

Andrea has kindly collated the data from the village survey and a full copy can be found on the village website or downloaded here:

A few headline results; 73 households replied (which is around 57%). All of the facilities/amenities within the village were ranked highly with the Pub receiving the highest score followed by the Church/churchyard and then the Cricket Club in order of priority. There was an error in the questionnaire and the village Netball should have been included (instead the Cricket Club had 3 questions), which we apologise for the oversight. The results do provide us with some useful information to base decisions on, so thank you for those that took the time to complete.

### Dog waste update

Dog waste bins have been ordered and will be installed around the recreation ground once delivered and new signage has been erected. We will continue to monitor the situation and see whether these initial actions have the desired effect.

### Speeding

Speeding is still under review and it is really down to the positioning of a permanent VAS (Vehicle Activated Sign) - additional meetings are being held to try and resolve this.

### Pond and flooding

Funding for the dredging of the village pond and flood works has been secured and we will keep you updated on the timing of these works.

Remembrance Sunday Parade and Service 14th November 2021 Compton – this year the branch event will be in Compton. The parade will form up in the Foinavon car park at 1030am and, led by Pipe Major Ian Knight from the Oxford Caledonian Pipe Band, march to Compton Church where the service will commence around the War Memorial which is situated in the church yard, at 1055am. The Last Post and Reveille will be played by Trumpeter Aimee Jones. The service, with Chaplain Rev Clive Jones officiating, will then continue inside the Church. We are fortunate; and indeed proud, that this event has gained a reputation of being very well attended by RBL members, uniformed youth groups, parents, and supporters. The Church has a limited capacity but we will do our best to give everyone attending the best experience that we can, Covid restrictions permitting. At time of going to press face masks for adults are required to be worn inside the Church.

<u>Blessing of Compton's Book of Remembrance</u> – during the Remembrance Sunday service a book of remembrance, containing biographical details and brief histories of those men and one woman whose names from WW2 are inscribed on the war memorial

, will be blessed and presented to the Church. This nicely presented book is the result of the hard work and dedication of one of our RBL members - Pat Warn. It will be kept near the entrance door to the church, where visitors with an interest in the memorial can refer to it at will.

The Poppy Appeal lunch Friday 29<sup>th</sup> October — we have chosen a Friday, as our guest speaker will be Newbury's Member of Parliament Laura Farris, in order to fit in with her busy schedule. The event will take place in the Foinavon but will necessarily have to reflect the present need to be mindful of social distancing and peoples' Covid19 sensitivities. Consequently, attendance will be restricted to about half the usual number of attendees. If the weather allows we are also looking at possibly using the pub's tentage. Timings will be noon for 1245hrs lunch and the cost covering two courses and table wine will be £25 per head. Proceeds will go to the Poppy Appeal.
