SOCIAL EVENTS AT THE BRUSH



Our Club President Mick McAuliffe.....

It was always my intention to retire from work at 60 and 5 years ago that is exactly what I

did. I had no idea how I was going to fill my days. I had worked long hours all my working life, I didn't know anything else. Did I think that I would be playing bowls at Brush? Definitely not! It was only by pure accident that myself and Lesley came to live in Loughborough in 2015. We were looking to move to our "forever home". By chance, I passed through the town and spotted a building site on Beacon Road. I went home to Lesley and said "I think I've found us our new home". The rest is history.



I left Gateway Grammar School at 18 years old, having done my A Levels, and got myself a job at British Shoe Corporation based in Braunstone. It was the first job I'd ever applied for and I was still there 24 years later! My career progressed well and I rose up the ranks pretty quickly. In 1998 I was awarded a gold watch for long service.



But later in 1998 British Shoe Corporation folded and I found myself working for Philip Green - ex British Home Stores. Later in my career I worked for Warner Bros. What an experience that turned out to be! I was literally working every day with amazing characters like Bugs Bunny, Tweety Pie, Scooby Doo and Harry Potter. It gave me my first opportunity to travel to the Far East, mainly China and Thailand. Having first been there on business, myself and Lesley went back several times later, to experience it for ourselves. Whilst at WB I even had the chance to share a red carpet with Tom Cruise (the movie star) whilst attending a film premiere at the Odeon Leicester Square in London.

Myself and Lesley joined the Charnwood U3A soon after moving to Loughborough. We signed up for several things that we had never done before and that included bowls. I have always been very competitive - it probably stems from being one of six brothers! We both bought second-hand bowls and within a few months we were hooked. My highlights so far are winning the 2 wood pairs with Mick Spencer in my first season, winning the Maiden singles and captaining the Peregrines to promotion last year.

Leicester City has been my biggest passion for most of my life. I started going down to Filbert Street in my teens back in the early 70's when Peter Shilton, David Nish and Peter Rodrigues were playing.





Bowls has sort of taken over our lives in the last few years. I joined the committee 3 years ago and now have the "dubious pleasure" of being your President. I must have some sort of masochistic tendency! Seriously though, I sincerely hope that I can help to move the club forwards. We have a great club and I'm very proud to be part of it. Making

new friends through bowling has certainly helped myself and Lesley to settle into our new life in Loughborough.
