<p><b>Remember:</b> the hazard is object/situation/system already in place. In the locality you are assessing what hazards and risks would you expect might cause some significant harm.</p> <p><b>Some common hazards:</b>            Slip/trip/fall hazards            Manual handling hazards            Electrical hazards            Substances (including dust)            Display Screen (VDU) hazards            Fire and smoke hazards            Inadequate/faulty work procedures            Poor lighting            Faulty equipment/machinery            Vehicular traffic            Environment/site hazards            Stress-inducing tasks</p>	<p><b>Remember:</b> the risk is the chance of injury or damage to health from the hazard. Road – collision with vehicle	Low – no incidents reported	General public particularly children	Yes - Fencing provides a barrier between the playground and road. Climbing/Play equipment – falling	Low – no reported incidents	As above	Yes - Wet pour. Annual inspection. Smaller slide now provided for younger children.	Playground Safety Report RoSPA	
Equipment when Cricket in play	Low - no reported incidents	As above	Yes - play area closed by Cricket Club when Cricket is in play.	None	<b>Yes</b>
Equipment failure	Low	As above	Yes - Regular playground visual, physical, inspections & Annual inspection	Maintenance to be undertaken if necessary to remove any risks. Playground Safety Report RoSPA	
Grass/mud – slippery	Low – no incidents reported	As above	Monitored	Repair wear and tear areas if necessary.	
Trees tripping/falling on roots	Low – no incidents reported	As above	Monitored	Action if necessary Tree Survey	
Trees Falling branches	Low – no incidents reported	As above	Playground inspections Trees monitored by Tree specialist	Tree Survey	

Litter Injury from broken glass, waste	Low – no incidents reported	As above	Provision of litter bins. Weekly playground inspections	None	
Undesirable people & antisocial behaviour within the play area	Intimidating behaviour, people feeling unsafe	As above	Incidents of Antisocial behaviour will be reported to the Police	Action if necessary	
Contamination of surfaces with Coronavirus	Contracting the virus, causing illness or death	Children, adults, staff	Signage stating 2m social distance rule, anyone with symptoms does not enter, only one adult should accompany their children, limit capacity of multi-play equipment, promote good hand sanitation, no eating in the play area.  Use signage to warn users that it cannot be guaranteed the area is COVID 19 free  Due to the cost it is not practical to clean the area after each use or to provide hand sanitisers. Hand sanitisers also contain alcohol and are flammable increasing the risk of theft	Continue to monitor
