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About the Faith as Art Workshops

Traditionally, the Methodist Church has used words and hymns to tell the Christian story. Images can sometimes be more powerful and memorable, making them an accessible medium that can inspire many different interpretations of the same image. We all know the saying, "A picture paints a thousand words." These workshops are about inspiring faith through art.

Early Christian churches used images to portray the Christian message, as many contemporary artists do today. To date, the Faith as Art workshops have covered works from the Methodist Modern Art Collection, Lent, Creation, Advent, and most recently, the Parables of Jesus. Many of the artists studied reflect our culture of the 20th and 21st centuries and are also from cultures and traditions that differ from ours.

We have reflected on the themes and responded to them not in words but in acrylic, pastels, watercolour, pencil, and collage. All the artists, of whatever ability or training, have been challenged, stretched, and taken risks to try new media, styles, and concepts. 








A House Built on the Sand
