CHAIR'S UPDATE

When can I?

Position Now

- All non-essential retail now opens in village incl. hairdressers and personal care salons
- Outdoors Up to 6 people can meet outdoors (or two households) in our gardens and on the Rec or Memorial Hall Grounds
- Outdoors Fleur de Lys and Prince of Wales can offer drinks and food outside (only). No indoor drinking. Takeaways continue at pubs and restaurants.
- Indoors Children's activities allowed (up to 15 people) at the COVID-19 Secure venues like the Memorial Hall, and the Hamdon Youth Centre, and schools
- Indoors No other community or social activities allowed yet between households
- We can stay away overnight in self-contained accommodation (your own household only, not mixed with others)
- No international holidays allowed yet

Assuming the Government confirms on May 10th that we can all move to Step 3 of the Roadmap these are some of the things that will change in the village from May 17th:-

17 May (at the earliest):

- Outdoors Up to 30 people now allowed to meet together in gardens and public green spaces.
- Outdoors entertainment allowed
- Indoors only 2 households together or maximum of 6 people from different households
- Indoors community activities in venues can re-start i.e. clubs, pubs, indoor sports. Social distancing and masks still required (1 metre spacing) where more than 2 households are meeting together.
- Masks required in shops and public venues and on public transport
- Government decision awaited on when international travel might become allowed. We'll update you in the June newsletter on what the Step 4 changes will be once they are confirmed.

Free COVID-19 test packs available for all

The UK's successful vaccination programme together with the lockdown and social distancing measures are beginning to show real results. As of 19th April, over £36m vaccinations had been given giving a good level of protection. Deaths and infection rates are substantially on a downward trend and providing we all continue to be sensible and follow guidance, it is hoped this trend will continue.

The Government are encouraging all of us to pick up two free lateral flow test packs each week even if we don't have symptoms. Testing on a regular basis (which we can do at home and which gives us the result there and then) will help to identify people who are carrying the virus without symptoms (this can be 1 in 3 of us). By self-isolating if positive, we will help to reduce the spread even more, speeding up the return to normal life. You can pick up the tests for free from local pharmacies.

Business grants available

New Government grants are available for nonessential retail and the hospitality, leisure and personal care sector to help businesses whilst they move back to normal working. Please see the District Council website for more information on how to claim: deadline 30th June.

Recreation Ground: New Rules For Dogs?

The Sports & Recreation Trust, who do such an excellent job in looking after the Rec on behalf of the Parish Council, came to our last meeting for a joint discussion on how best to keep our Recreation Ground clean and disease-free. Like in many villages, the majority of dog-walkers are responsible and proud of their neighbourhoods, picking up their dog's poo and either putting the bag into the many dog poo bins provided by the council around the village and on the Rec, or by taking the bag home and putting it in their own rubbish.

But regrettably over the last year when perhaps more people have been at home walking their dogs, they have noticed a big increase in dog mess not being picked up and this has now escalated to an unacceptable level. Leaving your dog's mess for anyone to step in is just not on! Football teams have to scour the Rec picking up mess before they can

begin to play a match, and our young kids are at great danger of catching Toxocariasis, a parasitic disease from worms that can cause blindness and serious illness in humans.

So, something has to change! Unless the position really improves over the next month, the Parish Council, in conjunction with the Sports & Rec Trust, will need to consider what measures may need to be introduced for control of dogs on the Rec. In the meantime, it is anticipated that the District Council's Dog Wardens will be patrolling the area more frequently and without warning, and signs will be displayed at the perimeters of the Recreation Ground reminding people of their responsibilities. As a dog owner you are responsible for your dog's behaviour, including picking up and binning its mess. If you are caught letting your dog foul you risk a fine of £1000.

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So please, let's all make an effort this coming month to improve the situation. Always pick up and encourage others to do so. If you see any dog's mess on the Rec, or even on the footpaths elsewhere in the village, please report it to the District Council. This is a very easy process. Click on the 'Report It' link on the Home Page of their website. This will then give you the option of clicking on the link for 'Dog Fouling' and then to 'Report Dog Fouling'. The more a problem is reported, a clearer picture emerges about where these problems persist and then where the District Council's resources can be targeted'.

Speed Indicator Device

Our new equipment ("SID") which monitors the speed of cars through the village is now up and running, which is good news. Our thanks to the volunteers who move it for us. The first location was up by Stanchester School outside the Co-op. Total number of cars over the two-week period were 13,019 incoming and 11,587 outgoing. The data downloaded showed that during the day 89% of incoming traffic and 75% of cars going out of the village were under the 30mph speed limit. But the bad news is that there were some much higher speeds, mostly around school collection time, late afternoon 'coming home from work' time and in the evenings. This needs monitoring and we all need to do our bit to slow down! The second location (at the end of April) is down in West Street by the Rec.

We are allowed to keep our SID in each location for a period of two weeks before having to move it. Evidence of excessive speeding is required to be recorded over a very lengthy period before Highways will consider any approach by the parish council for traffic calming measures, but it is at least a valuable first step.

George Mitchell - "One From The Plough"

On the weekend of 11th-12th September 2021, Stoke Performing Arts Group are planning a free open-air event on Ham Hill to celebrate the life of George Mitchell.

Not many people know about George Mitchell, but he was behind the massive Union rallies on the Hill in the 1870's. It was a time when the farm labourers, whilst working on the rich agricultural lands of Somerset, were starving and living in hovels. They had no-one on their side. The farmers, the landlords – even the clergy- all combined to "keep them in their place".

But George Mitchell was on their side. He was born a poor agricultural labourer in Montacute but fought his way out of poverty and never forgot his roots. He knew that only way the farm labourer was going to get a wage he could actually live on was to join the new Agricultural

Union. He was passionate about persuading people to join the Union. 20,000 people came to Ham Hill from far and wide to attend his Union rallies. Can you imagine what it was like down in the village, to look up at the Hill (before the Monument was there) and see the banners waving, hear the bands playing and the sound of 20,000 voices cheering the speakers?

We might not get quite 20,000 people! But we want to do George proud and celebrate an unsung hero of our area. We will have narrators and short sketches of scenes from George's life, as well as music. It's going to be a lot of fun. We will need performers and behind the scenes helpers and would welcome new members to join our group.

With the next planned step in reducing the Covid restrictions due to take place on 17th May, our intention is to hold a SPAG meeting once it has been confirmed, and to advertise the details a.s.a.p. We know it is a leap of faith – but it's something to look forward to, and we look forward to having you with us.
