C/22/119 In respect of the passing of CIIr Hales

The Council stood and held a two minutes silence in respect of the passing of Cllr Hales. The Council agreed a small donation to be made in his name to the Charity specified by his family. Cllr Foord dissented.

The Clerk asked if the Council wanted to hold co-option, she said that a call for a by-election was not legally necessary because there would be full elections in May 2023 and the death had occurred within 6 months of this election. The Council agreed to put up notices with the intention of holding co-option at the January meeting.

C/22/120 Apologies

C/22/123 Minutes of the Council Meeting held on Thursday 17th October 2022

a. To approve and sign the minutes of 17th October 2022

The minutes were agreed and noted as a true record of the meeting.

- b. To deal with matters arising not on the agenda
 - The Clerk had taken 12 hours for the FOI request. This would need to be paid as overtime. This was agreed.
- c. To deal with any correspondence
 - The Clerk said that TVBC had confirmed that a final payment of £9828.97 from the Re-opening the High Street Safely Fund (RHSSF) was due to be paid on Monday. There would be no further payments.



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C/22/124 County and Borough Councillor Reports

- Cllr Ward had circulated a report before the meeting. There were no comments.
- Cllr Drew had circulated a report before the meeting. He said that HCC Highways was reducing its CO2 emissions. He said that HCC's financial problems had been wrongly reported in the national press. He said that HCC aims to spend money wisely on the services it was necessary for HCC to maintain. He said that other Councils and Local authorities had invested away from their core services and had subsequently run into difficulties although he acknowledged that an investment in telecoms (Kingston upon Hull) was an exception. He pointed to an HCC website to get grit bins re-filled.
- iii Cllr Drew commented that HCC had now resolved the policy issues for the OLR project, which was supported by the Traffic Management team. He said that the project was affordable with the ClL money but the cycle element would put up the cost. He acknowledged that in general the principle was that safety improvements would be accident led.

C/22/125 Stockbridge Business Assoc.

C/22/126 Infrastructure Issues

b. Trout Pond

The Clerk explained that the EA had not issued the licence in time. She said it was very likely that the project would not now take place until October 2023. She said she would be writing to the donors and grant authorities to ask them if they would be prepared to hold the funds over into 2023.

c. Pocket Park/Land Behind the toilets

The Clerk explained that TVBC would need to see community support behind the project (C/22103c). Cllr Jackson expressed reservations but Cllr Halle felt that if the area was opened up there could be many advantages. The Council agreed to ask for community input in the next newsletter.

d. Cycle Path

Cllr Porter said he had walked the path (C/22/103d). He said the surface did not need replacing. The hedging needed cutting back and the path needed clearing. The Clerk was asked to obtain quotations for the clearance work



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C/22/127 Christmas

Cllr Foord commented that the Christmas event had gone well and there had been no problems with the Christmas lights. He said he did not anticipate any deviation from the quotations.

C/22/128 High Street

A presentation by Cllr Halle on the 8 improvements put forward by the TPWG had been circulated before the meeting. Cllr Boney commented that he was pleased to see progress on the pathway on Trafalgar Way. He said that he felt the way forward was for individual projects on the High Street to be dealt with separately. He commented that marked parking bays was one such project that would make the best use of space for parking. He felt that HCC would do the camera survey anyway. He said that the difficulty for Stockbridge was that they would be asked to pay £35K and there would be no guarantee that the community would get what it wanted out of the project. Cllr Halle was of the opinion that SPC could go to HCC with TPWG's 8 ideas and that the Council would still be in control of the outcome. Cllr Lawrence was sceptical of being able to finance the changes. Cllr Foord said he was against the white lines because he said it would make Stockbridge look like a car park. The Council considered the 8 items individually. The Councillors gave their individual preferences but it was agreed to move formal voting to the next meeting.
