Query over motorhome(s) parked in Puddletown:

If the vehicles are parked on double yellow lines this would need to be reported to the Enforcement Officers at Dorset County Council: <u>customerservices@dorsetcouncil.gov.uk</u>.

Regarding vehicles parking on the grass verge, where no waiting restrictions are present on the road, parking on a grass verge or pavement is not illegal. However, a driver may be open to prosecution if their vehicle is persistently damaging a verge, parked dangerously, or causing an obstruction. If the verge is damaged, because of the parking, please report to Dorset County Council.

For vehicles parked close to a junction (there are complaints of this in Butt Close also)

The Highway Code advises drivers not to stop or park opposite or within 10 metres (32 feet) of a junction, except in an authorised parking space. This allows motorists emerging from, or turning into, the junction a clear view of the road they are joining, enabling them to see hazards such as pedestrians or cyclists.

NOTES FOR ALL PARISH COUNCILS:

Silent 999 calls have increased and the large majority of these are "pocket dials". If taking your phone out with you, please ensure that the screen/keypad is locked, to avoid any unnecessary calls.

If you accidentally dial 999, please do not hang up. If possible, please stay on the line and let the operator know it was an accident and that you do not need any assistance. Silent calls to 999 are never just ignored.

Nationally, all emergency services are experiencing record high 999 call volumes, which is believed has been impacted because of an update to Android smartphones.

The update, issued between October 2022 and February 2023, added a new SOS emergency function for devices to call 999 through the power button being pressed five times or more on devices.

If you have an Android phone, you can check your emergency settings to turn off the functionality added in the latest update, if you wish to.

Go to 'settings' then 'safety and emergency' and slide the button which says 'emergency SOS' to switch the functionality off.

Improving the way you contact us

We receive thousands of digital contacts from residents and visitors every month and contact overall to Dorset Police has recently been reaching record levels.

It is important for us to use the best systems and processes to ensure emergency lines are kept open and non-emergency calls can be answered from those who are unable to contact us online.

We have been looking at ways to ensure we can meet the needs of our communities as quickly as possible as well as ensuring that members of the public are directed to the correct agency, such as the local authority, who may be best placed to deal with their request for service.

Following the launch of our new website in March, we have seen a huge increase in the quality of information captured on digital reports completed via our website, ensuring we are able to record crimes effectively and task officers and staff appropriately.

Why are we making these changes?

We are asking members of the public to use these web forms when contacting us digitally instead of sending an email to ensure we have all the relevant information we need and can respond as efficiently as possible – meaning we get you the advice, information and help you need as soon as possible.

Our non-emergency email was withdrawn from 5 June 2023 and digital contact should be made via our website. Alternatively, you can still contact us for non-emergency enquiries by calling 101.

What to do in an emergency

If a crime or incident is in progress or someone is in immediate danger, call 999 now.
