243. APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

244. MINUTES

RESOLVED: That the Minutes of the meeting held on 2nd February 2021 be approved and signed by the Chairman when able to do so.

245. MEMBERS' INTERESTS

None declared.

246. POLICING AND COMMUNITY WARDEN REPORT

Community Warden Karl Aylett reported as follows:

- February was a quiet month.
- Better weather is starting to bring people out again.
- Shared job role as Community Connector is now active so time will be shared between this and warden duties in Minster.
- Recruitment of three Community Wardens is to commence.

Cllr Day asked whether any fines had been issued to those flouting government restrictions and using the skatepark. The Warden responded that none had been issued.

Cllr Jones commented that he has witnessed electric scooters being ridden on the pavement. PCSO Butterworth responded that this is illegal but that enforcement is difficult.

Cllr Burden expressed concern that lorries don't seem to be stopping at the roundabout at the top of Tothill Street, and instead continue left towards Manston regardless of any traffic already on the roundabout. Cllr Gimes responded that she would raise this at the next meeting with TDC.

PCSO Adrian Butterworth reported as follows:

247. COUNTY COUNCILLOR & DISTRICT COUNCILLORS REPORTS

Cllr Roper reported as follows;

- Public Space Protection Orders are in force for three years, to help address antisocial behaviour. £100 fines can be issued for offences.
- Local elections will go ahead.
- Thanet Multi-Agency Taskforce is working with people and families with complex problems. More information is available on the TDC website.
- Covid numbers are reducing and the vaccination programme is working well although there may be some supply issues arising.
- Covid testing continues and is important particularly with new variations developing.

Cllr Day enquired whether lorry drivers at Manston who test positive for Covid are included in local Covid figures.

The Clerk asked if funding would be provided to venues acting as polling stations for the local elections, in order to make them covid-safe. Eric James from the village hall had asked. Cllr Roper responded that he should approach Democratic services at TDC.

248. CHAIRMAN'S ANNOUNCEMENT

Cllr. Mrs Gimes reported that there has been no confirmation yet that remote meetings can continue be held after 6th May 2021 so it is possible that a face-to-face meeting may be held in June.

An email has been received from Monkton Parish Council in relation to the light pollution created by Thanet Earth, asking if Minster Parish council wish to work collaboratively with them and other neighbouring parish councils to address this. It was considered and felt that we cannot help

The Clerk reported that the new solicitor at TDC has been contacted by our solicitor, with a response to one or two queries and this matter should now continue to completion.

254. COMMEMORATING THE ATTWELL FAMILY

Members were asked to consider a fitting way to remember the family who served the village for many years.

AGREED; To support Karen Brazils proposal to place a memorial bench on the grass area opposite Attwells.

AGREED; To liaise with developers about the possibility of having a street named after the family.

255. SHED PROJECT

Cllr Burden gave an update on the Shed Project and asked members to consider allowing use of the pavilion for the group as a meeting place only.

AGREED: That the pavilion can be used (subject to availability) as a meeting place for the group.

256. DOG FOULING IN MINSTER

Members views were sought on how to address this ongoing problem in the village following complaints received from local residents. The Assistant Clerk is aware of two youths in the village, regularly walking two small black dogs who have been seen allowing their dogs to mess on the pavement in Tothill Street. The Dog Warden can view CCTV and give words of advice or a fine. Suggestions were also made to put up signs reminding dog owners to be responsible or a 'name and shame' approach.
