1	No Apologies for Absence
2	Alex MacLennan, Recreation Manager, Forestry England – Ash Chalara disease is affecting all the Ash trees along the riverside walk and they need to be removed (the disease is county wide). This will happen over the autumn. In the longer term it is hoped a community project can be established to replant a variety of new trees along the riverside.
	An update was given on the various events that would be happening around Kielder forest, during September there would the Dirty Reiver and a 4X4 event. Events are being programmed which were cancelled from 2020 due to the pandemic. It is hoped an event list can be established and published locally.
	Extensive repair work on the North Shore of the lakeside way is about to commence and money is allocated for an annual maintenance programme.
3	Cllr J Riddle, Local Services, NCC – During July Cllr Riddle, Mr A Olive, Tynedale Area Manager, Highways, NCC, met with Mark Halliday to look at and discuss various highway issues that concerned the parish council. To date some action has been taken and works orders are in place for others.
	Mr Varty expressed concern at the lack of passing places on the Donkleywood to Lanehead road. The need for passing places on a single track road is determined by a risk assessment conducted by NCC Highways. It was agreed a risk assessment by carried out.
	Any road closure order has to be entered onto a national database, but information there is not specific enough as road closure dates can cover a long period of time, but in reality the closure could only be two or three days. Obtaining a parish council link for road improvements is being looked at.

Cllr Riddle stated that utility companies can apply as and when they require work to be done on the highways but communications between the utility companies themselves does not take place, which would be the most sensible solution.

The underground drain at the far end of Stannersburn was mentioned and it was agreed to inform A Olive, NCC, of the problem.

NCC agree they must work smarter to keep the roadside gullies clear. A new 'gully sucker' machine had been purchased and it hoped to GIS all the drains/gullies for future reference.

There is a roads maintenance programme but most work is reactive.

Public Transport in the Tyne Valley is being looked at.

Cllr Riddle has money allocated to him, to spend on his area (9 parishes), on capital projects, not revenue/running costs.

The Community Chest can cover revenue costs of projects.

Some good news -

The Northumberland Line, will reopen 6 train stations on the east coast.

The battery factory proposed for Blyth will create many jobs. NCC have allocated £24k funding to Kielder Observatory towards a digital project.

This raised the question on the electric charging point within the village, linked to the Tearoom. After discussion it was agreed to ask a representative from National Park to update the parish council on the proposals for Falstone tea room and to upgrade the electric charging point.
