## SOUTHERN WATER

The very high recent rainfall has adversely affected river levels and groundwater levels to an unprecedented level. SW has reluctantly decided it had no option but to reinstate tankers in the catchment including at "Furzedown Lane WPS" – the misnamed site at the foot of Wiremead Lane – and at Mullens Pond (only 1 tanker) in order to prevent sewage discharge along the Pillhill in Wiremead Lane (including by Waterloo Cottage), at Manor Farm in Abbotts Ann, and elsewhere in the catchment. At present, we do not know how long these tankers will be required in the Parish and elsewhere but they are being reduced on a daily basis.

Much discussion is taking place with SW regarding the possibility of overpumping in local rivers. Please refer to the Amport Parish Council website for the latest information.

It will allows you to choose:


- Where you want homes built and how many
