VACANCY FOR NEW PARISH COUNCILLOR Dunton Green Parish Council currently has a number of vacancies and so this is your opportunity to be involved!

Councillors have three main components to their work:

1. Decision making

Through meetings and attending committees with other elected members, councillors decide which activities to support, where money should be spent, what services should be delivered and what policies should be implemented.

2. Monitoring

Councillors make sure that their decisions lead to efficient and effective services by keeping an eye on how well things are working.

3. Getting involved locally

As local representatives, councillors have responsibilities towards their constituents and local organisations. These responsibilities and duties often depend on what the councillor wants to achieve and how much time is available.



This is a voluntary position and is unpaid. Training will be funded.

To be qualified to be co-opted to a parish council a person must be 21 years of age or over, and a British subject or citizen of the Republic of Ireland, and either: Be a local government elector of the parish,

or have during the whole of the twelve months preceding the day on which s/he is nominated as a candidate occupied as owner or tenant any land or other premises in the parish;

or her/his principal or only place of work in the twelve months preceding the day on which s/he is nominated as a candidate have been in the area of the parish;

or have resided either in the parish or within 3 miles thereof during the whole of the 12 months preceding the day on which s/he is nominated as a candidate.



A postcard from...Chigasaki

I love living in our community in Dunton Green. I love the greenery of the environment around us; I love the diversity of the people who live here; and I love the growing sense of community spirit in our locality. But like many others in our



area, I travel away from home very frequently – sometimes for work and sometimes just for fun. Whenever I go away, I like to take some time to explore other communities and to understand how people elsewhere live.

I would like to share some of these observations from a recent trip to Japan, when I visited Chigasaki.

Chigasaki is about one hour south by train from the centre of Tokyo – Japan's capital – in a region called Kanagawa. Its sheltered bay is famed for abundant wildlife, great views of Mount Fuji (the enormous natural icon of Japan) and amazing waves. Often

referred to as Surfer's Paradise Japan, it is now home to scores of silver surfers. These former *salarymen* rise early, don their suits and parade to the beach, as they once did to the train station in the time before retirement. As in our own community the population of Chigasaki is aging rapidly. As more people enter their twilight years, the residents have created a number of new



initiatives to keep older people safe and keep them engaged in the locality. The female residents of Chigasaki have historically been well integrated into the community, thanks to their children, as many made firm friendships at the school gates which continued in later life. The men – on the other hand – have struggled to find

a similar level of cohesion – since many previously worked long hours in Tokyo and had little to do with their own neighbourhoods.

In response to this a number of them have joined together to do something that is allowing them to become more involved in the community and to provide a useful service for the wider population. They are providing an after-school shuttle service.

In Japan, there are many after-school clubs which students attend. Some focus on sports - such as football, baseball or tennis; some are more academic – teaching languages, coaching maths, etc. Most of these clubs do not take place on schoolgrounds, so students must travel to reach them. Parents with busy working lives cannot always find the time to give lifts, so the retirees of Chigasaki have stepped in.



Every day the group transports over 100 children of all ages between their schools, activities and homes. Previously run on donations, the group is now funded by small contributions from parents. All proceeds are re-invested into running costs and training – it makes no profit. The goal is to serve 200 students by the end of the year.

Speaking to providers and users of the service, it is clear that it has been a great way to help bring the community closer together. And who knows perhaps the idea might catch on elsewhere.

RECEIVED BY DGPC FOR COMMENT:

17/03609/FUL Former West Kent Cold Store Rye Lane Erection of 35 apartments, including the provision of affordable homes, together with access, parking and landscaping.



DGPC Comment Only- Having deliberated, the Parish

Council can neither support nor object to the application but wishes to make comments about concerns that it has in two key areas: the ratio of affordable housing across the full Ryewood development and parking across the development. This proposal does incorporate 40% affordable housing. Whilst this is commendable, the Parish Council would have liked to have seen a much higher proportion in this application to go some way to redressing the reduced allocation (20%) of affordable housing that was negotiated for the rest of the development on the grounds that it was uneconomic to provide 40% across the development. When the District is crying out for smaller, affordable homes this was an opportunity to make a more significant contribution towards affordable housing stock. With regard to parking, this new proposal does go beyond the unrealistically low parking allocations that must be met by the developer. However, there are already significant issues on the development in relation to the lack of parking provided and a scheme to provide more parking for the current development would have been welcomed. AMENDED PARISH CONSULTATION Amended plans showing an increase in the

number of parking spaces and an updated ecology survey work.

DGPC-Object plus Comments: Whilst the Parish Council accepts that parking provision for this application has been increased (as a response, presumably,

to the high volume of comments and concerns raised in relation to the original version of this application), there is still an acute shortage of parking provision across the development as a whole. The Parish Council would like to see further parking increases to help alleviate the constraints already affecting current residents of Ryewood.

STILL NO UPDATE ON THIS APPLICATION (reported in the Spring edition of Dunton Green News)

18/00967/FUL9 Lennard Road

Demolition of existing garage and rear conservatory. Erection of two storey extension to create two-bedroom house. Single storey rear extension. New crossover and dropped kerb. *DGPC-Support. Note for SDC: There have been precedents set re: the creation of second homes in Lennard Road; there are concerns about the growing parking constraints in Lennard Road as a result of these developments.*

18/00890/HOUSE 9 The Orchard

Removal of existing pitched roof bungalow roof. Addition of first floor extension with flat roof. Building to be finished with white render to math surrounding houses with western red cedar or similar cladding. *DGPC-Objection. The Parish Council recommends refusal of this application on the following grounds:*

• The increase in the number of bedrooms (and so the increase in the capacity of the dwelling) is not matched by any increase in parking provision. The Parish Council is concerned that what is suitable in terms of paring provision for a two-bedroom property is not adequate for a four-bedroom dwelling.

Över-intensification of the site

• Adverse impact on neighbours in relation to loss of light from the addition of a first floor (more imposing than the existing pitched roof).

NOTIFICATIONS OF DECISIONS:

Granted: 17/02392/HOUSE 30 Kingswood Road

Two storey and single storey rear extension *DGPC - Support* Granted: SE/18/00277/HOUSE Broughton Carriage House London Road Demolition of existing wall. Erection of a single storey rear extension, loft conversion to the side/middle. Erection of new wall and relocation of side gate. Alterations to fenestration. *DGPC-Support*

<u> Granted: SE/17/03982/CONVAR 24A Hillfield Road</u>

Removal of condition 7 (garage shall be kept for parking at all times) and variation of condition 8 (approved plans) of application reference 17/00293/ FUL to convert garage into habitable use and amend the approved plans. *DGPC-Object plus Comments: Parking provision for what is now proposed as a three-bed dwelling (as opposed to the two-bed dwelling that was granted planning permission in 2017) is insufficient. The condition regarding the garage and that it be kept for parking at all times was imposed for a good reason. Permission granted for a new crossover does not negate this parking need nor does it override the original concerns or reasons for this condition. Granted: SE/17/03947/HOUSE The Coach House London Road*

Demolition of two existing outbuildings and erection of a single storey rear extension. DGPC - Object The Parish Council seeks to protect the greenbelt and has concerns about this application as a result. Having already received approval for an extension of the property the Parish Council is not persuaded that there are any 'very exceptional circumstances' under which this application should be approved. Prior consent for a different proposal should not be deemed to create precedent nor give any expectation that a revised

proposal has some implied right to approval. There is a concern that existing outbuildings are to be demolished to extend vet further the residential footprint of the house creating an even larger dwelling within the green belt. The Parish Council respectfully requests that SDC reviews the extent of the extension of this property over time to ensure that the proposal does not exceed the permitted size of extension to the original dwelling and reviews the claims that the applicants' consultants make regarding 'very exceptional circumstances'

SDC Granted: The proposed constitutes permitted development under Class D of Part 1, Schedule 2, of the Town and Country Planning (General Permitted Development) Order 2015 (as amended).

Withdrawn: 17/03423/FUL Great Dunton Farm House London Road Proposed dropped kerb *DGPC - Object* Refused: 17/03690/HOUSE 1 Meadow View London Road

Vehicle crossover, hard standing and path to property DGPC-Support Refused: 1. The proposed development, by reason of its failure to demonstrate adequate visibility splays and the lack of turning provision, will result in hazardous highway conditions and harm pedestrian safety. As such the proposal would be contrary to policy SP1 of the Sevenoaks Core Strategy and policies EN1 and T1 of the Sevenoaks Allocations and Development Management Plan.2. The proposed development, by reason the removal of the existing nature hedgerow and vegetation would result in harm to the character and appearance of the local area. As such the proposal is contrary to policies SP1 of the Sevenoaks Core Strategy and EN1 of the Sevenoaks Allocations and Development Management Plan.

Granted: 17/03952/HOUSE 24 The Sidings

Erection of a single storey side extension (subsequently amended to: Erection of a single storev rear extension) DGPC- No comment

Granted: SE/17/03904/HOUSE 9 Donnington Road

Erection of a two-storey rear extension. Alterations to fenestration. DGPC -Objection: The Parish Council has reservations about this proposal and recommends refusal on the following grounds: 1. that the change to the front elevation (removal of the bay window) is detrimental to the character of the street scene; 2. Removal of the bay window would detract from the look and character of this set of buildings and so adversely impacts the design and appearance of Donnington Road; 3. that the double height extension to the rear will be overbearing for the neighbours at No. 11 and will result in a significant loss of light to their property.

SDC-Refusal-The proposed extension would result in a detrimental loss of light to the adjoining neighbouring property at no.11 and therefore does not comply with Policy EN2 of the ADMP.

Grantéd: SE/17/03948/HOUSE Wingfield Morants Court Road

Dropped kerb DGPC- Comments Only: The applicant already has an existing dropped kerb and access on the eastern boundary. It is not clear from the application as to why another access point is required. If the intention is to close up the existing access and open up anew access point further from the bend in the road then there would be support for this from the Parish Council as the new entrance would have better visibility splays.

Granted: SE/18/00079/HOUSE Midway London Road

Increase ridge height to accommodate room in the roof with gable to rear and ingle storey rear extension. DGPC-Comments Only: There have been numerous planning applications over the last13 years, some refused, some granted, some implemented, some not. The changes to the roofline in this latest application are significant and will result in a very unusual roofline. Will the dwelling be in keeping with other properties if the proposal is approved? The Parish Council has some concerns but does not think it has material grounds on which to object.

Granted: SE/18/00118/FUL Taj Tandoori 118 London Road

Single storey glazed conservatory extension to restaurant: Reconstruction of existing timber outbuildings; External decoration and reconstruction of existing flat roofs. DGPC- Support (with comments) Whilst in principle the Parish Council supports the proposed application there are a few concerns which the Parish Council would expect SDC Planning Officers to look into. Namely: a) Is Tai Tandoori the owner of the land on which the conservatory side extension is planned? There are recollections that the area which is now planted with shrubbery was once part of a wider pavement area. Could the ownership of the land be confirmed) Concern about the advisability of the car park space at the rear to the corner of the plot, whereby vehicles will have to exit & enter the space on a corner / junction.

Granted: SE/18/00116/HOUSE 201 London Road

Demolish existing standalone garage and conservatory and erection of a single storey rear extension & integrated side garage. Existing crossover to be widened. *DGPC-Support.* Granted: SE/18/00218/HOUSE 19 Mill Road

Proposed garage conversion into habitable accommodation DGPC-Support



PARISH COUNCIL RECEIVES OVER £22,000 IN CIL PAYMENTS

The Community Infrastructure Levy (CIL) was adopted by SDC in February 2014. It allows local authorities to secure funding for infrastructure to support new housing developments. This is done by requiring developers to pay a standard charge per square metre of qualifying new development. It will help to pay for

things such as schools, health facilities and transport improvements - all things that are necessary to support new and existing residents.

Under new legislation, when a development takes place, that town or parish council will receive a proportion of the CIL received. The CIL legislation states that the proportion will be either 15% or 25% depending on whether a neighbourhood plan has been adopted for the area in which development takes place. Following the introduction of a CIL charging schedule, Sevenoaks District Council's Cabinet resolved on 13 November 2014 that "all Town and Parish Councils, irrespective of whether they have a Neighbourhood Plan in place, be given control over the 25% higher rate of CIL."

CIL receipts can only be used by DGPC for infrastructure . A list of the type of projects and further details can be found on our website. There is no accurate forecast or indication of what CIL monies will be awarded to the Parish each year so there is no way to budget for its receipt. It is paid out by the District Council only twice per annum. CIL money cannot be used to fund day to day expenses and ongoing maintenance so this payment will not reduce our precept or parishioners' Council Tax. DGPC will issue a list of how the funds have been spent at the end of each year. Money not spent within 5 years of being allocated must be returned to the developer.

To date DGPC has received the following: 2016-17 £3,598.44 and 2017-18 £19,021.88 (totalling £22,620.32)

Possible future projects include LED lighting upgrades for Parish Council owned street lights and additional recreational equipment.

There is a CIL funding pot that SDC holds which organisations can submit bids for. The details are available on their website: www.sevenoaks.gov.uk (or via the link on DGPC's website).

Late note: An additional sum of £2,218.75 has also now been received for 2018-19.



Online Crime Reporting

You can now report crimes online with Kent Police.

This service was introduced to help residents have an alternative to calling 101. To help Police in their investigations when you make the report, please ensure you have (if available):

- the date and time of the crime/incident
- details of any stolen or damaged items (i.e. IMEI number for your mobile, vehicle registration)
- the contact details of any witnesses
- information about any evidence that could help an investigation

Currently it is not possible to upload attachments, this function will be introduced later. There are separate sections within the form for you to add the different information required at this stage.

Once submitted, you'll receive a reference number and a copy of your report (if selected). Please note this service is not to be used for emergencies—that is still 999.

IN CASE OF EMERGENCY: Did you know...

- ⇒ That if you call **112** from a MOBILE phone *instead of 999* the emergency services will have a clearer picture of where you are if you need help?
- ⇒ That you can call 999 from ANY phone even <u>mobiles without a</u> <u>SIM card</u> and you will get through?
- ⇒ That we already have TWO Public Access Defibrillators in Dunton Green? One is located on the outside of the Pavilion building in the recreation ground and the other is outside The Bed Post on the shopping parade. DGPC also has plans to install a third later this year outside the Village Hall. ANYONE can use these in case of emergency and they will only work if they are needed - you can't electrocute yourself or anyone else!

Want to get involved in addressing speed in your area



We are looking for more volunteers to work with us to address local speeding. We have five speed boards that can be loaned to residents (min group of 3) Residents can set up speed watch in 30 or 40mph zones after they have been risk assessed by Kent Police.

You can train online to be a volunteer at www.kent.communityspeedwatch.co.uk or we can do the training face to face at the District Council Offices. Training takes approximately one and a half hours. If you would like to set up a speed watch group, please contact us at community.safety@sevenoaks.gov.uk

Speed watchers from 1 Jan to 31 March in total recorded 811 vehicles speeding - 3 of those are now at active enforcement stage where Police would look to intercept and give a ticket if seen speeding - 211 of those are 2nd time offenders and received letters. Volunteers have undertaken 745 hours of Speedwatch time and have undertaken 106 sessions.
