


and through traffic next year.

New Crossing at the Co-op

The Parish Council has been liaising with HCC to install a new crossing point outside the Co-op. The planters were only ever a temporary measure and HCC will not renew the licence for them next year. The proposed crossing will be smaller than that installed outside the public toilets. It will take up a smaller footprint than the planters but will work in the same way, by stopping cars parking in front of the crossing island and thus create a passage for the less-able to cross the road. The crossing will only take up one parking space on either side. The proposal will also create a motorcycle parking bay on the Greengrocer side. This is being included to stop oversized cars and vans from using the parking space as this can create problems for a wider vehicles on the High Street passing the traffic island. It is also hoped that it will make it easier for cars exiting the Vine Yard.







Old London Road

HCC has now produced a design for the proposed changes to Old London Rd (see left). The intention behind the improvements is to slow up the traffic as leaves the White Hart roundabout. The design narrows the carriageway to single file. This should slow traffic and make the crossing safer for school children and residents. There have been a number of near misses at this crossing, as cars try to overtake one another, even when children have been crossing the road to and from school.

The Parish Council is yet to approve the proposals which also include a wide access ramp at the school end entrance to Old London Road to mark the difference from an A road to a residential one.

It is hoped that the use of Old London Road as a rat run to avoid the A30 roundabouts can be addressed in this design.

As and when the above changes to the road layout are agreed they will be paid for by a CIL (Community Infrastructure Levy) grant from TVBC that was applied for by the Parish Council in 2020. The feasibility study for the design was paid for by the Pariah Council in an attempt to solve finally these long-standing issues.

Power failures at Winton Hill and Old London Rd

Residents of Old London Road, Winton Hill and Little Dean experience disproportionally higher and more frequent power failures than other areas of Stockbridge. The Council approached SSEN about the problem and they will now be doing upgrade works on the transformer close to Old London Rd which should help supply. SSEN maintain they can't link the area with the more reliable High Street because that would overload that supply. SSEN explained that power surges are caused by animals dis-

rupting the lines, either by knocking the posts or by dying on the line and SSEN will need to shut off the supply and then surge power through to jolt things back into place. These annoying surges are difficult to avoid in rural areas.

SSEN are concerned with overly dominant trees around the Winton Hill transformer and would like the trees to be more radically cut back than legally they are allowed to do. However, no one seems to know who owns this piece of land. Can you help?



Lancaster House Site

The Council has finally (after two years) acquired the Lancaster House site from HCC, for no charge. SPC was interested in acquiring the site in order to safeguard it from being used for development because it was regularly noted in the TVBC Local Plan as a potential site for housing. Instead, the Council wanted to ensure that it could be used for the benefit of the community. The Council has not developed any specific plans for use of the site and would be interested in hearing suggestions from members of the community. The Council has considered various ideas such as a nature trail, wild campsite or community forest but no decision has been made. A Working Group with community members will be

formed to take the project forward and to organise clearing parties. The site was previously that of a Workhouse and the Council would be interested in providing more information about this which can be displayed on the Council's website or a history board.

However, for safety reasons the Council asks that the site is not visited by members of the public yet.

Speedwatch and new SLR



The Council would like to revive the Speedwatch group that ran a few years ago, in order to encourage drivers to drive within the speed limits. The group will need volunteers to monitor the speed of each vehicles and relay that information to the authorities. Drivers cannot be fined by this process, but it is hoped that they will be nudged into better driving behaviour. If you are

interested in volunteering for Speedwatch please let the Clerk know. The Council is also liaising with Longstock Parish to share the rotation of a new Speed Indicator Device. These displays work best if they are moved around every two weeks so a sharing a rotation with a neighbouring community is an excellent way of spreading the cost and effectiveness.

A Quick Round- up of News

The Council has still not been updated by HCC with the results of the parking survey that was held in June. Many residents and traders are eager to know what HCC is planning (if anything) and how their proposal will affect Stockbridge. The Parish Council will be meeting with HCC when the survey results have been evaluated. Next year is the 80th Anniversary of D-Day. The Council is considering what events would be appropriate to mark this important event in our history. If you have ideas or would like to be involved please contact the Clerk. The annual Stockbridge Christmas lights event is going to be held on

Friday 1st December, an exciting range of events to make it a special occasion is being planned. Details will be posted on both the Council's and SBA's websites. The Council has raised awareness with HCC and TVBC that there is no **disabled parking signage** around the High Street's disabled bays. This makes enforcement less easy. The Council is keen to rectify this. HCC is considering plans this autumn for balancing the Authority's budget up to the financial year 2025/26. HCC held a public consultation this summer to seek residents' views on how they might do so, given it is confronted by a significant projected shortfall.
