Your Voice Matters - Help Shape Our Village's Future: Chaddleworth The Community Plan is making excellent progress thanks to the fantastic response from residents at our initial feedback sessions. Your input has given us valuable insights into what you love about our parish, what concerns you, and what improvements you'd like to see.

What You've Told Us So Far: It is clear you Chaddleworth's peaceful, character and strong community spirit, with many praising the people, The Ibex pub, and beautiful walking areas. Feedback for improvements included introducing a village shop, managing speeding traffic, creating better footpath connections (especially key village locations), between developing community green spaces. Many have also called for enhanced village hall facilities and better communication about local services and events. We'll use this feedback to support the main Survey in September which we'll need everyone to complete.

What's Happening Next? We're now moving into the second phase of our planning process. Over the coming weeks, we'll be meeting with local organisations and key stakeholders to gather their perspectives before creating a comprehensive survey for every household in the village.

Important Date Change: We've moved our village-wide survey from summer to September to ensure maximum participation by avoiding the holiday period. However, you'll be able to learn more about our progress at the <u>Village Fete on 21st June</u> where our team will be available to answer questions.

Meet Your Community Plan Team: A dedicated group of volunteers is driving this important work forward: Piers King, Dave Jennings, Gill Hunter, Karen Hoar, Martyn Lisby, Dave Young, Phil Cole, Lee Allen, Issy Bush, Kevin Brady, Rev Mike.

Any of these team members would be happy to discuss the project with you.

Volunteers Needed! As we approach September, we'll need additional helpers to ensure we reach every household in Chaddleworth. We're looking for volunteers to help with door-to-door visits and survey collection.

Why is this important? A strong response rate will demonstrate that our results truly represent the community's views. This gives us the credibility we need with West Berkshire Council and could unlock valuable seed funding to turn our improvement plans into reality.

Get Involved: Whether you want to volunteer, ask questions, or simply stay informed, don't hesitate to approach any team member. Together, we can create a Community Plan that reflects what matters most to everyone in Chaddleworth.




