News

Parish Council Tax

The 2024/2025 tax contribution for the Parish which is within your annual Council Tax bill is increasing from April. This follows years of the Parish Council fortunately managing to keep it very low. However, with rising running costs and the need to invest, renew and maintain it means that an increase is necessary.

The annual precept (the amount the Parish Council receives to cover the costs of the Parish) is currently £8,000 – this will be increasing to £20,000.

So on average the annual cost will increase to £64, however it is charged on your council tax band so your individual property cost will vary depending on your tax band so some will pay more than this and others less but as an example a council tax band D property will pay circa £55 per year.

A full detailed update will be posted on the HPC website very shortly.

Hartlip Police Surgery

The surgery gives residents the opportunity to speak to Hartlip's local community police officer PC Jez Chittim and raise any local issues or concerns with him.

PC Chittim attended with a colleague and there were free UV security pens on offer to mark up your valuables.

HPC would like residents to come along to meet PC Chittim at future surgeries. He is proving to be very engaged in Hartlip matters particularly around the issues of fly tipping which is sadly a regular occurrence in Hartlip and the surrounding area.

Fly tipping was of course hot on the agenda and he asked that as many residents as possible report any fly tipping using the link detailed under the Report It! section below.

Most of the fly-tipping has been on the highway, but private land gets targeted too and then it's the landowners responsibility. In October HPC cleared one fly-tipping incident on HPC land at a unbudgeted cost of £420 alone. HPC has built contingency costs in to the budget going forward

But it still continues with usual areas of Matts Hill Road, Warren Lane (top and bottom), Mount Lane (under the motorway bridge), Yaugher Lane, Place Lane, Dane Lane, Lower Hartlip Road, Cowstead Lane, Bull Lane and that's just over the last few months.

PC Chittim has requested that the Environmental Response Team (ERT) visit Hartlip with him, clear it of all fly tipping , conduct a full assessment as to what preventative measures they can put in place in the first instance and then assess its suitability for any enforcement action and the possibility of covert CCTV and HPC will keep you updated via the news alerts.

So please come along to meet PC Chittim and chat to some of the other residents at future surgeries. As a Parish we are lucky to have such an engaging Police Officer for our community.

Plans for future surgeries will include a crime prevention officer offering help and advice and also talks on cyber-crime and fraud.

Finally, a Kent Police/Hartlip monthly newsletter has been produced by the Police and this will be available via the Hartlip Parish Website soon.

Waste Collection



New waste contract to bring changes Published by Swale Borough Council on 14th February 2024

From Monday 25 March the new contract with Suez will see a fleet of brand-new vehicles collecting food waste, dry recycling, general waste and garden waste from more than 65,000 homes across the borough

The new contract will mean some changes to the existing collections to improve their reliability and efficiency.

Most households in the borough will see the days their waste is collected change, and there will no longer be kerbside collections of textiles, batteries or small electrical items.

The council will be writing to every household in the borough to let them know what changes to expect from 25 March.

"We're sure these new rounds will mean better collections in future, but we do need to ask people to be patient when the changes come in.
