COLLINGHAM BUSINESS CLUB UPDATE

A particularly fruitful meeting of the Business Club was held on Wednesday, 12th February, at the usual Royal Oak venue.

The Government's plan to redefine the national public rights-of-way map in 2025 was discussed, the local input to which is being managed by the County Council (<u>link</u>). Making sure your favourite footpaths get safeguarded in this process includes first checking that they are on the current plan; this can be viewed on a website via <u>this link</u>.

Alongside the rights-of-way discussion, members were updated on the Trent Vale Trail project, which aims to link the settlements along the river with an upgraded combined footpath/bicycle track, enabling the trafficked A1133 to be avoided. Details of the project and its routing can be found on the "<u>trentvaletrail.org</u>" website. It was agreed by those present that more should be done to promote local use of the world-class natural amenities in the Collingham area, perhaps by activities along the lines of the "volksmarching" events held so successfully in Germany.

Feedback on the inaugural "co-working space" initiative was provided, with another session planned for February; the first session was well-supported, with further details being available on the Facebook page at <u>https://bit.ly/2QZnHJf</u>. Finally, members were updated on progress with *The Home of the Future* demonstrator, full details on which can be found online.
