#### Village Hall

The roof replacement and installation of new windows has now been completed and the builder has been paid. There is still some tidying up to be done to the rear of the hall – the clerk will contact Mr Garratt to clear up. Andrew Paris will see to sticking privacy film to the windows overlooking the neighbour.

There was a detailed review as to how the building project had been handled and particularly how the liaison with WREN had operated. These are still a few outstanding issues to resolve so it was agreed to hold a closed meeting to finalise matters.

The official opening will be delayed until the hall has been re-decorated.

Andrew Paris to prepare a detailed decorating specification and the clerk will then send out for quotes for the area which are inaccessible for volunteers to paint.

#### **Risk Assessment**

The Finance Office produced a draft risk assessment. It was agreed that all parish councillors will read this prior to the next full parish council meeting and raise any additions or amendments as required.

#### Fund Raising

Andrew Paris has set a quiz and flyers have been distributed. The quiz will be on Saturday 21<sup>st</sup> July, 7.00 pm for 7.30 pm in the pub with a pie and peas supper. A raffle will also be held, and any donations of suitable prizes will be appreciated.

#### **Roads and Hedges**

The grass on School Lane is now very high and is obscuring sight-lines for motorists, especially at the junction with Kirklington Road. County Cllr Bruce Laughton will be contacted to get this sorted as soon as possible.

The gulley's in the village are due to be cleared out imminently.

Comment had been received regarding the "Borrowers' Tree" on School Lane. The tree and its surrounds are outside the brief and mandate of the parish council – serious problems can be reported to County Council Highways.

Some signs are obscured by overgrown vegetation – further pressure will be put on the County Council to get this trees/hedges cut back. Please note: - all highways issues – potholes, condition of roadside furniture, street lights etc – can be reported directly on the County Council website - www.nottinghamshire.gov.uk – or by calling the council on 0300 500 80 80. The more people that complain about an issue, the more likely the problem is likely to get resolved.

#### Allotments

There is now only one allotment in use. The parish council is considering grassing the rest of the allotment areas and maybe planting a few (fruit) trees. If there was a demand for allotments, then the grass could be easily rotavated and allotments allocated. **The parish council would like to have any feedback you may have on this idea please!** 

#### Stained Glass Windows

Much of the old Victorian glass was saved from the old village hall windows. A request has been received from Edingley old Methodist chapel for some of this glass to repair the windows in the chapel. Andrew Paris will make contact and find out more about what they require and will report back.

#### **Open Meeting**

A parishioner with interior design experience offered to help with the hall colours and curtain design.

#### **Finance**

Unanimously agreed to a further VAT payment for the village hall roof – the VAT will be claimed back on the council's next VAT return. Unanimously agreed to pay hall cleaners.

#### Planning

Householder application for proposed extension and alteration to existing dwelling with new detached swimming pool and pool house and new detached cart shed (re-submission) - Halam Lodge, The Turnpike: minor addition to previously approved plans – agreed unanimously to support application.

Householder application to demolish existing garage and construct two extensions for integral garage and new front entrance and main staircase - Applegarth Radley Road: Andrew Paris declared an interest in this matter and left the meeting. Agreed unanimously to support this application.



## Report from the Parish Council Meeting held in the Village Hall on <u>Thursday 9<sup>th</sup> August 2018</u>

### **Present**

### Village Hall

Andrew Paris has fitted the opaque window films as requested by a neighbour.

There is still some debris to be cleared from behind the hall – the Clerk to organise with builder.

The specification for the decoration was discussed. Andrew Paris to revise and pass on to Clerk.

The possibility of improving the hall acoustics, possibly with a lowered ceiling was discussed. This would require further grant funding.

Chris Bevans reported that the hall bookings are starting to improve after the hall's closure during building work.

There is still some unauthorised parking of cars at the hall; further action will be taken if this interferes with hall bookings.

#### **Risk Assessment**

The draft risk assessment was discussed, and some further additions and amendments will be passed to the Finance Office for a final draft at next meeting.

### Fund Raising

The village quiz was a very successful event with over £300 raised towards decorating the village hall. Many thanks to all who made the evening such a success.

Another quiz will be held in January. The catering for the next quiz was discussed.

#### **Roads and Hedges**

The verges have now been cut as requested. The footpaths around the village are very overgrown and many of the pavements are overgrown and/or covered in moss and vegetation. The County Council will be asked to attend to these.

There is a lot of weeds and debris in the gutters – a road sweeper visit will be requested through County Cllr Bruce Laughton. The notice board outside the church needs attention – the Clerk to organise.

The situation with the allotments will be monitored. The parish council would like to have any feedback you may have on ideas for the allotments please!

#### **Roads and Hedges**

The public footpaths have not been strimmed or cleared this year, and there are some over-hanging trees on the footpath above Church Field with are causing problems – Clerk to contact County Council Footpaths Officer.

Road signage coming from the Edingley direction is obscured by hedges – Clerk to contact Highways.

Gulley sucking and weed-spraying has been requested now that harvest is over.

County Cllr Bruce Laughton told the meeting that grants for new village signage was still available – it was debated whether new modern signage would be appropriate or wanted for the village. Cllr Laughton was asked to send details of the types of sign available.

Street lighting – since the installation of the new LED street lights there is a very dark area just outside of the school gates. Cllr Laughton was asked to look into the possibility of an additional street light at this spot to help with road safety and the general safety of children now that the darker nights are coming.

#### **Present**

#### Matters Arising

1. Best Kept Village Competition – the judges had made some positive comments about the village. It was agreed to include a summary of these in Halam News. It may be possible to organise a village litter pick next year during the judging period.

2. Reduction in bus services through Halam – County Cllr Laughton reported that the reductions have been put on hold for the next six months while the usage is monitored. The Chairman requested that, prior to any reductions, there should be consultation with the village/parish council.

#### Village Hall

Hall re-decoration - the third quote has been received and the preferred decorator is to start soon; preferred date is during half-term.

Edingley are to hire the parish council projector and speaker again for a further payment of £100.

Bookings seem to be picking up slightly, including an over-night stay for a Girl Guide group

#### Fund Raising

£81 was received from the raffle at the recent MacMillan coffee morning at the Waggon – many thanks to Julie Paris and everyone involved in helping at the coffee morning.

Cllr Bruce Laughton was thanked for agreeing to fund the printing of a special village newsletter for November. This newsletter will give some information about the four men commemorated in the village war memorial.

#### Roads and Hedges

Some of the pavements are covered in weeds and/or moss and are dangerous to use – information has been passed to County Council. County Councillor Bruce Laughton to follow up.

The public footpaths haven't been strimmed or cleared this year and some of the styles are in a dangerous state. Specifics to be passed to Cllr Laughton.

The overgrown state of Halam Beck was raised. The Beck seems to be flowing freely, and in fact some vegetation higher upstream helps to slow the flow and helps to reduce flooding further downstream. The area under the road bridge is now kept clear.

Car parking on Radley Road opposite Gray Lane and St Michael's Close is causing difficulties for residents trying to emerge from these side roads. Please park your car(s) with consideration for other road users – a reminder that it is an offence to park opposite a road junction. Please do not obstruct the footpaths by parking on the pavement.

#### Street Lights

Street lighting – since the installation of the new LED street lights there is a very dark area just outside of the school gates. Cllr Laughton will ask Highways to look at the possibility of improving the light output from the existing street lights. An alternative would be an outside light mounted at the school.

Please note: - all highways issues – potholes, condition of roadside furniture, street lights etc – can be reported directly on the County Council website - www.nottinghamshire.gov.uk – or by calling the council on 0300 500 80 80. The more people that complain about an issue, the more likely the problem is likely to get resolved.
