Much has happened in the Village since December

Consultation on the Sherwood Arrow bus timetable has led to the timetable reverting to its original form without any reduction in the service. Thankyou for all your hard work in that matter Cllrs. Johnson and Healy.

The repairs to play equipment at Hadleigh Park are underway.

The hedge adjacent to footpath no. 9 has been reduced as requested by residents.

The Tennis and Bowls club have received a grant of £8,000 from the s106 Community Grants Budget.

The Parish and District Council election polling will be taking place on Thursday 2nd May in the Lower Hall of the Village Centre.

We have a new noticeboard outside the coop.

Council are reviewing the dog fouling problem in areas of the village.

A bin has been placed alongside the Bus Stop on Mansfield Road at the bottom of Cocketts Lane.

A new bin has been ordered for the corner of New Hill and Chapel Lane.

Council is reviewing with NCC the matters associated with a resurfacing on Cotton Mill Lane.

Defibrillator Access Points in Farnsfield

Farnsfield Community First Responder Scheme, whilst providing emergency life support for residents of Farnsfield over the last 20 years, via East Midlands Ambulance Service, has worked hard to put Public Access Defibrillators in our Community. The money you so kindly donated has been converted into five Public Access Defibrillators, placed at strategic points within our village. The points of access are:-

- The Plough Inn, Main Street, Farnsfield, (outside wall of Car Park) NG22 8EA. (24 Hours)
- St Michael's School, Branston Avenue, Farnsfield, (outside wall of Car Park) NG22 8JZ (24 Hours)
-) • The Village Centre, New Hill, Farnsfield, (outside door to Lower Hall) NG22 8JN (24 Hours)
- Farnsfield Cricket Club, Station Lane, Farnsfield, (inside Club House) NG22 8LA (evenings only)
- Cockett Farm Shooting Ground, Cockett Lane, Farnsfield (inside Club House) NG22 8JQ (10-5pm daily. Sunday 10-3pm Closed Thursday) If you have cause to ring 999 in an emergency and the

emergency services advise you to collect a defibrillator, they will guide you of the nearest defibrillator. You will be given a four digit code to open the box and access the equipment. We have also provided defibrillator familiarisation and CPR training in a number of locations. If anyone/group would like us to put on some training for them, please contact us. Last year one of our defibrillators was used with a successful outcome, which only confirms that lifesaving defibrillators really play an important part in village life. That's because Mayenne is a well-kept secret and is a beautiful, peaceful, rural area of France situated in the north of the Pays de La Loire. It is, however, the perfect place to get to know France – not the France of the Riviera or the hustle and bustle of Paris – this is the real France; the people are friendly and are proud of their association with Farnsfield. In 2018 a group of 54 members comprising adults of all ages and children visited Farnsfield for a long weekend. Thankfully the weather was kind to us all and a varied itinerary ensured a great time was had by all. The exchange visits usually take place every 18 months and, as the time approaches for the return visit from Farnsfield to Andouillé, we are now looking for new members who would be interested in joining us. We currently have French families in Andouillé who are awaiting an English family with which to 'twin' and with which to build bridges. Forget Brexit, that is something for politicians to argue about; twinning is about making friends with a foreign family and learning about a different culture and way of life which will enhance both the lives of your family and your new 'extended' French family.

Farnsfield Community Spaces :is made up of local volunteers who do things on an individual basis but also in small groups. We have no committee or meetings but a series of events that people can sign up to. We have a facebook page Farnsfield Community Spaces which has 35 members and an instagram page farnsfieldcs. News and events are posted here and shared to other Farnsfield pages. We have been supported by other groups in the village and this helps us to raise more volunteer help. NSDC have been very helpful too collecting the black bags that you may have seen on Cockett Lane and Longland Lane.

The Millennium Wood Project (Parish Council) is underway with Woodland thinning during October 2018. Some bulbs were planted of native bluebells and snowdrops with money raised by plant/seed and shrub sales. The Veg Stop is helping us by March 2019 selling jars of seeds in their shop and the table outside Croeso continues to be popular. Since May 2015 we have raised £1,590 and with this we have bought 6 fruit trees for the community allotment and put £360 towards the container sited there. Approx £978 has been spent on bulbs, s eeds, bird feeders as well as materials that generate more income such as compost and labels. We are working on some signage for the woodland and repairing the bench.

We have 4 local walks that a volunteer has produced and the plan is to print them off and make them available to residents.

Litter picking continues to be a feature of the work of the group and 2 grabbers are out on semi permanent loan to volunteers who collect litter on Longlands Lane and Cockett Lane. You may have noticed piles of plastic tree guards and bottles etc in the woodland and these will be collected on the litter pick on the 6th April if we can get the volunteers.

Bulb planting has taken place on the corner of Far Back Lane and Broomfield Lane and the crocuses and Snowdrops have been lovely.

The community allotment continues to grow wild flowers and meadow flowers for Community Spaces and we would love to have more people join it. We have gained some funding from the Community Foundation and will be buying 4 Bramley Apple trees for the community. Situation tbc

We have a new noticeboard outside the Coop where Community Spaces will advertise events too
