### 1. Introductions

Members of the meeting introduced themselves.

## 2. Minutes of previous meeting

Updates on previous actions were as follows:

Action: Rob Collett to look at keeping the three trees in place – Action carried over

Action: A site visit with the Management Company (once appointed) and the neighbours on the eastern boundary should be made as early as possible. – The Management Company would be HML Andertons

Action: Richard Bloom to address the fallen fence panel along the eastern boundary – carry over

Action: John Geoghegan to draft a letter to new residents. - complete

Action: Ashton Carruthers to find the approved external enclosures plan - complete

#### 3. Update on development

Most of the entrance work had now been completed, with the exception of one drain which was still to be connected. That would take place in the spring of 2018. More of the hoarding on the Anstey Road front would be taken down in the new year to be replaced with heras fencing. Work was ongoing within the site, and the entrance had been peeled back to allow access to the first completed houses. Externals were being finished on the first houses, with planting being started the week commencing 11/12/17.

Construction would continue down the eastern side of the site one the first plots were completed – construction on plots 10,11 and 12 were due to start in January.

## 4. Questions/concerns from the community

Following questions from the community, the following was discussed:

- Residents commented on how smoothly the entrance works had gone from the public perspective.
- The dwarf wall along the eastern boundary would have railings on top. These railings would take 4-6 weeks to be manufactured, prepared and delivered.
- The dwarf wall with railings would continue on the western side of the entrance fronting Anstey Road.
- The pavement outside the entrance to the site would not be re-surfaced for its whole length by the developer – this would be the responsibility of Hampshire County Council. Miller Homes were only obliged to make good any damage done through the course of their activities. The tarmacking that had been done by Millers would need re-doing as it was not in an acceptable state in the long-term.
- Bollard lighting would be installed throughout the site, and would be overseen by the Management Company once Miller Homes had finished on site.
- The showhome plot 3 was anticipated to be in operation from January 2018.
- Several plots were being handed over imminently, though none were yet occupied.
- Action: Richard Bloom to remind contractors to keep radios at a respectful level especially when near neighbouring properties.
- A site visit had taken place with neighbours to discuss the boundary at the western end of the site. Residents have been asked to put forward a proposal about what they would like to see.
   There may be an issue with keeping the trees on that boundary should the existing boundary fence with John Eggars Square be maintained.
- The boundary at the eastern end of the site was unclear due to the ecological buffer zone.
  Action: Tony Souter to keep Roy & Stella Light informed of boundary discussions on the other side of the site.
- The letter to new residents was circulated to the group and approved for distribution. **Action:**John Geoghegan to organise distribution of letters.
