### **Council News**

At the last Council meeting the two vacancies on the Parish Council were filled by co-option. It was pleasing that there was interest from a number parishioners to serve for the last year of the current Parish Council prior to the election for a new Council in May 2020. After following the procedure for appointing new councillors, the successful applicants were Trevor Dann and Joanne Nesbit-Bell.

Trevor has lived in Hamble for nearly 20 years and owns a successful business that undertakes re-manufacturing and recycling of industrial refrigeration and air-conditioning equipment and had previously served in the Royal Navy. Jo has lived in Hamble for the past three years and has enjoyed village life and learning about its history. She has worked in local Government for the last twenty years in a number of different administrative roles. They are welcomed to the Council and it is hoped their various skills can contribute towards the work of the Parish Council.

Regarding the Local Plan you may have seen a number of site notices displayed inviting consultation comments throughout the Borough but these are not new site allocations. The Planning Inspector has asked that the sites have these notices displayed for completeness in the process.

The Parish Council's Planning Committee has met with consultants for the County Council regarding the possibility of having a Demand Responsive Transport Service to improve traffic issues on Hamble Lane. The Committee gave background information on the current situation and its views on the priorities for improvement. The Committee is also following up the damage and maintenance to the footpaths in the Square.

The Council has been informed that the Local Area Committee will have a special meeting at the end of June to consider the GE Aviation planning application which is for the erection of up to 148 dwellings on its car park and sports field. At the time of writing this Council News, the papers for this meeting, including the planning officers recommendations on this application, had not been published.

### Council News (continued)

Our local police continue to hold their Beat Surgeries at The Mercury Library & Community Hub and they have also attended a recent Council meeting to update the Council on occurrences of crime over the last month. This included 9 anti-social incidents plus thefts from cars. sheds and yachts. The Police emphasised the need to make sure your property is secure to help to avoid these types of crime. The Council has also been provided with a quarterly report of neighbourhood policing in our area. This is available from the Parish Office or online in the Council's agenda pack papers for its meeting on 10th June.

As part of the youth outreach programme for the Hamble peninsula the Borough Council has successfully secured funding from the Hampshire Police Commissioner to operate Friday Night Football from the Hamble School. The project seeks to promote a positive environment of engagement amongst our young people.

In response to matters raised by a few parishioners regarding defibrillators in the village, the Council has undertaken a review of the current situation. For your information there are defibrillators located at Blackthorn Surgery, Copse Lane Dental Surgery, Hamble Sports Complex, Coopervision, GE Social Club, Port Hamble

Marina, Hamble Point Marina, Mercury Yacht Harbour, Royal Southern Yacht Club and Hamble Lifeboat Station. The Council will be publicising details of these defibrillators to make the public more aware of their availability.

The Council has successfully undertaken its annual audit, end of year return and Annual Governance as statutorily required. These are available for public inspection. The Clerk has also complied a list of its projects and work streams so that the Council can set its priorities, as it would be impossible to complete them all. It was agreed that if anything new is added in the future it will need to replace one of the previous commitments.

The D-Day 75th anniversary commemorative event on the Quay went off very well and was well attended. The Council wish to thank everyone that contributed and participated to make this a successful occasion. The Council is now looking towards working with other local organisations to commemorate VE and VJ anniversaries in the future.

### **MESSAGE FROM THE CLERK ON ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR**

It has been some time since we have mentioned the problem of dog mess despite the fact that it is a regular feature of the contact we have with customers and residents, as well as with the grounds staff that are often having to deal with it. Hirers of our sports facilities have been increasingly upset by the state of the playing fields and despite all of our efforts to check and clear them before games are played, people still end up on occasion coming into contact with it. In reality the problem is not confined to just the playing fields but other public areas of open space are often blighted by it. Earlier in the year the ground staff cleared back the walk way through Woodpecker Walk and within hours of clearing a new area, were finding it contaminated by mess.

Over the next few months we will be regularly reviewing CCTV footage on our sites to identify offenders and to gather evidence. Where we have gathered evidence we hope to work with the dog warden at Eastleigh Borough Council to deal with the problem. We will be installing new signage to help act as a reminder and we will be having a couple of weeks of action where we will be highlighting dogs mess on our land through the use of temporary spray paint. All too often, when we refer to anti-social behaviour we think about the action of a small minority of people involved in vandalism and public order offences, but this is also anti social behaviour in every sense and requires a community response. Don't let

people ruin your public open spaces. If you see someone not cleaning up after their animal, try to identify who they are and let us know.

At the Council's last meeting the Police were asked about whether people should be encouraged to take photos or footage of anti-social behaviour or other criminal activity. They stated that if people felt able to take footage without putting themselves at risk it is very helpful, both in recording the incident and being able to identify the offenders. What isn't helpful is then posting or sharing it on social media especially when young people are involved. The Police are often building an evidence base against repeat offenders and this type of footage is often crucial in bringing charges. Publishing evidence usually results in one of two outcomes; the victim being approached by the offenders family and making reparations which results in the victim withdrawing their complaint or people trying to take matters into their own hands. This can result in the offender ending up as the victim and action being suspended. So if you witness an incident and you can record it safely, do so and contact the police and share it with them directly.

The Neighbourhood Policing Team are available at The Mercury before the next Council meeting on 8th July from 6pm and at the Beat Surgery between 11am and 12.30pm on Friday 5th July, if there's anything you'd like to discuss with them.

### **WWI PEACE CELEBRATIONS**

After the First World War it was decided that the day for the national celebration of victory and peace would be on Saturday 19th July 1919. Hamble's Peace Celebration started at 9am at the church when the bells were rung and the Union Jack hoisted on the tower. The Roll of Honour was decorated with flags and streamers of rambling roses.



At 2pm the children assembled on the Quay under the direction of the School Headmaster, as well as the Cadet Corps who headed a procession to Avro's airfield and hall where the main celebrations took place. On arrival they sang the National Anthem and the Union Jack and other flags were hoisted (front cover). This was followed by the children's sports, but owing to the wet weather the tea was held in Avro's social hall (Avro's social hall was opposite to where the entrance of Aquila Way is today.)

Afterwards the adults sat down for their tea while the remainder of the sports took



place. Plenty of good things were provided and thoroughly enjoyed. The celebrations were concluded by dancing in the hall.

Admiral Sanderman had intended to present to each child a peace mug, but these hadn't arrived in time.



### HAMBLE LOCAL HISTORY SOCIETY

In recognition of the centenary of Hamble River Sailing Club (HRSC) the Society arranged for its Chairman, Ian Underdown. to give an illustrated talk about its history on this important occasion for the Club.

The Club was founded on Wednesday 6th August 1919 when nine men, seven local and two who came to Hamble at the end of the war, met on the Village Green and decided to form Hamble River Sailing Club with "its object to encourage the racing of small vachts and boats". As they did not have a clubhouse it used the Bugle Inn for its meetings and started its races from the pub's garden.

The first races were on a handicap basis with the Hamble One Design the only class of boat sailing against other individual designed boats mostly fishing boats. As well as races for keelboats there were races for centreboard boats and the dinghies that raced with the Club were heavy clinker or carvel built and usually kept on moorings. In 1921 some X One Designs, that were gaff rigged at that time, took part in the handicap races and the Solent Sunbeam designed and built as the result of a request from three Hamble based vachtsmen raced with the Club from 1923.

In 1925 the Club wanted a cheap centreboard dinghy for the use of its young members and local boat builders Luke Brothers designed and built the Hamble Star that went on to race with the Club for over 40 years. By 1928 the Club had sufficient members and funds to build its own clubhouse overlooking the foreshore in the Bugle Inn garden. During the interwar vears the Club organised an annual regatta with other village residents that was a big event in the area. Club activities were suspended during the Second World War, and after it, the nature of the Club changed with more dinghies racing and fewer keelboats.

When its 21-year lease at the Bugle Inn terminated the Club moved to its current site at the top of the ferry hard and initially only had a Nissan hut for its clubhouse but, during the 1950s, built a wooden clubhouse in stages. During this period it was hosting dinghy open meetings, Area and National Championships and its members were champions in many events nationwide.

By the 1960s, HRSC was one of the premier dinghy sailing clubs in the country and started its renowned early season Warming Pan weekend open meeting. In 1972 six of the 13-man Olympic sailing team were club members of which two brought back medals. During the 1970s it replaced its wooden clubhouse in phases, with the current clubhouse being completed in 1980. In the early 1980s there was a decline in dinghy racing but in 1982 the HRSC Winter Series started what was to become one of the leading race series in the country. In the 1990s the colourful sail Foxer dinghy revived regular dinghy racing at the Club.

In the new millennium a cadet and training programme was developed that reinvigorated the Club and greatly increased its membership resulting in it becoming a RYA Training Centre. This was followed by other initiatives that has made the Club as it is today.

There can be very few sailing clubs in the country that can boast such a successful history. The Club has had European and World Champions as well as Olympic medallists and numerous National Champions in a wide range of classes. It also provided the first British Olympic Sailing Coach and subsequently an Olympic Team Manager. Its members have won big races such as the Round the Island Race and played a prominent part in America Cup challenges.

Club members have played a leading

role in the boating industry. The country's top boat designers such as Uffa Fox, Ian Proctor, Angus Primrose and David Thomas have been members, as have leading mast manufacturers and sailmakers.

During his talk lan highlighted some of the people that played an important role in the Club during its history from the Luke brothers, retired fishing smack skipper Robert Williams known as Uncle Bob and Gregory Robinson to his son Nick Robinson, Bill Hobbs and more recently Peggy Dorothy. At the end of the meeting lan was thanked for his research which provided a fuller more accurate story of the Club, particularly from some of HRSC committee members and members that attended. Those present were amazed and fascinated by his pictorial history of HRSC with many pictures that had not been seen before.

**75 YEARS AGO** - Landing Craft on Quay A letter was read from Luke Bros associated with Mathway Marine stating that they had been advised that a number of badly damaged landing craft were being sent for repair, but unfortunately the width of Back Street is insufficient to enable the craft to be unloaded in their yard and they asked permission to erect a temporary skid on the Quay on the understanding that they removed it immediately after the craft are delivered ..... Permission to be given ...

Back Street was renamed Rope Walk in the early 1960s

**75 YEARS AGO** - **Spilcroft Water Supply** ... that the Military camped in the field below the Spilcroft Allotments are using water through the Council's meter, and suggested that some action or arrangement should be made, as the camp were without water...**JULY 1944** 

**50 YEARS AGO** - **Scrubbing Facilities** .... Asking if the Council would consider providing a second pair of posts to accommodate larger boats ... It was agreed to reply ... that the facilities provided were intentional to stop bigger boats using the Hard. **JULY 1969** 

**50 YEARS AGO** - **Inshore Rescue Service** Expressing sincere thanks for the second cheque bringing the total donated by the Parish Council to £1,000. Advising that they have now been able to pay for the Inshore Rescue Launch ...the Hut has been erected at Petters and trials have taken place on the Rescue Launch and passed with 'flying colours'...
