Do, please, come along and have your say on the way the Hall is run, the fees we charge, the things we spend our money on, the events we organise, and so on. Better still, why not offer your services as a committee member? We'd love to have some new faces on the team, particularly younger folk and folk new to the village who could bring a new perspective to our deliberations. We have formal meetings only every 3 months and, in-between, groups of people take forward ideas for village events, investigate Hall improvements or undertake minor tasks to maintain the Hall, so the commitment is not huge.

Contact me if you'd like more info, or just turn up on the night – you can be assured of a warm, friendly welcome. Alternatively, if you have any ideas for future events or comments you'd like to make, do please email me at the address below.

If you would like to help on a particular project but not commit to an on-going role, here's an idea: We need help to run our **fete** – it's too big a job for the Hall Committee alone – so why not offer to lend a hand with that? Any assistance, large or small, on the day (**2**nd **September**) or beforehand, would be much appreciated. Indeed, the fete won't happen unless someone like you lends us a hand. So do contact me or Jon Thompson (01622 851351)... please! We need to know <u>now</u> if the proposed fete this year is viable.

We have leafleted most of the parish with appeals for help that have so far bourn little fruit, so please get in touch immediately if you can help in any way. The annual fete used to be a tradition in the village but died because of lack of volunteers. We have revived the concept in recent years but it will wither again if we can't get enough help.

Last month I trailed an idea to use the land at the rear of the Hall as a mini allotment for villagers. The area is unused at present and can become a bit of a wasteland if untended. The soil is poor, but the idea is that the Village Hall and Gardening Club would assist anyone interested to create raised beds (eg using sleepers filled with compost) in which they could grow whatever they wished for their own use. So far there has been little interest shown so, if the idea appeals to you, this is your last chance to let us know. A decision will be made on this at our AGM in a few days time.

Perhaps your own garden is dedicated to flowers or is purely a children's play area – or perhaps your children would like their own flower or vegetable plot – or perhaps you would just like to garden more convivially with like-minded neighbours, sharing ideas, labour and produce. Grafty Gourmet

A great seasonal recipe that only takes 15 minutes to prepare. The slow cooking process is well worth the wait. The lamb is so tasty and tender after cooking. It just falls apart.

Slow Roasted Lamb Shoulder

5 garlic cloves, peeled, plus 1 full head of cloves separated but unpeeled 3 table spoons of rosemary, chopped, plus 2 large bunches rosemary 2 tablespoons of soy sauce 1 shoulder of lamb

4 onions, peeled and cut into large

chunks

150ml of dry white wine

300ml of strong chicken or lamb stock

- 1. Heat the oven to 140 degrees C, (120 degrees C if using a fan oven). Using a pestle and mortar, make a paste with the 5 peeled garlic cloves, chopped rosemary and soy sauce. Slash the top of the lamb shoulder 5 or 6 times make the cuts around 1cm deep. Then rub the paste into these cuts, spreading the remainder over the flesh.
- 2. Place the onions, unpeeled garlic cloves and half the rosemary sprigs in the centre of a large, deep roasting tin, and sit the lamb on top of it. Season it with lots of black pepper and a little salt, then scatter over the remaining rosemary. Pour the white wine and the stock into the roasting tin and cover with loose fitting foil, folding the edges tightly around the tin.
- 3. Roast in the oven for about 6 hours, until the lamb can be easily pulled from the bone using a fork. Then turn the oven up to 170 degrees C, (150 degrees C if using a fan oven). Remove the foil and roast the lamb for a further 20 minutes, until the top has become crisp and it has turned a rich dark-brown colour. Leave to rest for about 20 minutes, then serve with some roasted vegetables and the juices from the pan. If the juices look a bit fatty, pour into a jug and skim the fat off the top with a spoon.



All our yesterdays ... Sandway



This photograph, circa 1920, is of Hills Grocery and Drapery Shop at Sandway.

In 1882, it was owned by Raymond Thomas Thurstun and in 1907 was sold to Thomas Hales. John Percival Hills took over the shop from Thomas Hales in 1915 and remained until the 1930s, when Mr. and Mrs. Mickeljohn followed - Mrs Mickeljohn being remembered for being one of the few ladies of the time who wore a wig!

In the early 1950s a Mr. and Mrs. Giles took over for a short while before selling on to Mr. and Mrs. Henson in 1954. The Hensons remained until their retirement to Grafty Green in 1972, when the shop finally closed. They then moved to Ashford Road, Lenham.

The Post Office at Sandway was opposite the shop and was closed down in 1948, and moved across the road to the shop premises. When the shop closed the Post Office moved again, this time to Platts Heath Shop. Previous Post Masters included: 1882 - Robert Hughs; 1907 - Frederick Sitford; 1930s - Miss Sitford, daughter of Frederick, who carried on until 1948.



Term time is busy for many people with work or study, and this time last year was no exception for me: The last push to get an assignment submitted, was followed by bags hurriedly packed and the next morning, off we set: a rush at the airport, blue skies over land and sea, confusion over driving to our hotel, a late dinner and then – nothing. No rush, no bustle, no commitments – just time to do whatever, whenever, however – or to do nothing but sit, enjoy and reflect:

on the beauty of the surroundings; on the last year; on one's family or friends; on one's faith and Church life; or on the future.

Taking time to reflect on one's faith is a bit like a holiday. It gives us time away from busyness:

Jesus really wants us to open our hearts to him.

If it's a renewing of our faith we may rediscover the joy of prayer and a life with God at our side. In Romans 12 we can read:

"Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewal of your mind, that by testing you may discern what is the will of God, what is good and acceptable and perfect."

Whether we are turning to Christ for the first time, returning to faith, or seeking to strengthen our existing faith, the Lord will be there to guide us further. With this sort of nurture, we can develop the energy, thirst and curiosity to explore and learn more, enabling a deeper walk with God, even if life becomes hectic again.
