# From Professor Mark Chapman

(The Vicar is on annual leave.)

Dear Friends,

In the past few months I have been doing the rounds of Oxford college chapels and have been to more choral evensongs. Chaplains I have taught have been getting me to preach before I retire! The chapels themselves are all rather different – I have preached in dinky little baroque chapels, an enormous gothic chapel, and an audacious neo-Gothic recreation of a fancy church from northern France with impressive windows. I have preached on all sorts of different themes depending on the set readings. I even preached on the book of Nehemiah which is all about building the walls of Jerusalem after the exiles returned from Babylon. In fact, one of the things I will miss most about our garden is the splendid wall which separates our house from Cuddesdon House. It was recently repaired and is looking very spick and span. It was presumably built originally to keep animals and people from straying into the park around the old Bishop's Palace.

This all got me thinking about walls A few years ago when I was leading a tour around Oxford for the new students at the College I was asked whether the walls around the colleges were built to keep the people out or to keep the students in. I laughed, but the more I thought about it, the more interesting I found the question – there's a double function to walls. Walls keep people in and walls keep people out – prisons are an obvious example. I am old enough to have spent some time in East Berlin – on several occasions, I waited to cross at Checkpoint Charlie and Friedrichstrasse station. There were two very different political systems separated by a wall with a very secure gate. But alongside the physical wall there was also a mental wall of mutual suspicion which characterised the Cold War. And there are so many contemporary examples of walls of separation – in the gated communities of South Africa or in America which separate affluence from poverty. And most poignantly we have the wall that separates Israel and Gaza – a wall that was breached with such disastrous consequences.

For Christians, we are often reminded that God doesn't live behind walls or in Temples – God doesn't need security and can't be protected by walls. Instead, God goes outside the walls of the city – in Jesus, God leaves the containment of the walls of the heavenly city and goes to the world outside where he dines with the tax collectors and mixes with the outsiders and cures the lame and the possessed. God's love for us all is glimpsed as he takes the risk of leaving the protection of his walls, and moving out into the messy and dirty and beautiful world that he redeemed. And that is an invitation to all of us – to move out from beyond our own walls to see how we can share that love in whatever ways we can with the world outside.

# SAVE THE BAT AND BALL



Last month saw lots of meetings as we worked to find a way to save the pub. There were many twists and turns in the run up to the June Parish Council meeting, as the information we had changed almost daily.

The Parish Council had to decide whether or not to trigger a four month moratorium on its sale. This delay would have allowed the village time to raise the finance to buy the pub from the owner Admiral. On the other hand we also knew that Ben Moss, the owner of the Lamb Inn in Little Milton, was very near to buying the pub. Any delay would have disrupted this sale.

In fact, Ben came to the Parish Council meeting in June to explain the progress made with Admiral and the money already spent on solicitors on both sides. Ben talked about his long-held ambition to buy the Bat and Ball. He plans to run it as just the sort of family, community pub that we all long for.

So, in the end the Parish Council decided not to trigger the moratorium.

Since then we've heard that the sale is still progressing. We hope that the Bat and Ball will be re-opened in the autumn after a refurbishment.

There is no doubt that the mere threat of triggering the moratorium has concentrated Admiral's mind. They have moved much faster than they might otherwise have done. So once again thank you very much indeed for your support. And a very big thank you to Ben Moss for his perseverance and commitment to our village.

## PARISH COUNCIL

In May Admiral announced that that they intended to sell the Bat and Ball. Because the pub is an asset of community value (ACV) we had the opportunity to decide whether we wanted to bid for it, although we had to make our minds up by 7th June. If we decided to bid, then there would be a moratorium until October while we prepared our bid, and no other sale would be allowed during that period.

Ben Moss who owns the Lamb in Little Milton was very interested in the pub when it was first vacated and now he has made an offer to buy it which Admiral have accepted. Mr Moss seems very enthusiastic and committed to the project, and the sale is well advanced. On this basis, the Parish Council felt that the best chance for the long term future of the pub was to allow the purchase to proceed, so they decided not to trigger the moratorium.

The Parish Council is very appreciative of all the work done by the group who obtained the ACV, particularly the contribution from Nicko King. This work has not gone to waste because it seems very likely that Admiral's decision to sell after 18 months of inactivity was brought on by the pub becoming an ACV.

You can read more about the decision not to trigger the moratorium elsewhere in the Newsletter.

The Parish Council has been thinking about introducing measures to try to reduce speeding, particularly on the road in from Wheatley. However, possible alternatives such as an electronic sign triggered by speeding vehicles or white gates on the verges are both too expensive for us to be able to afford. But we are having the traffic speed measured on the road near the College to see how many people are speeding.

Obtaining a lease for the Community Orchard is taking a very long time because of difficulties with the solicitor. A new solicitor has now been employed so hopefully things will move a little faster.

Some of the newly planted fruit trees in the orchard are thriving but others are not doing so well, and one has died. The amount of roots the trees had was small which has made it difficult for them to bed in properly. Plans are in hand so they can be watered in dry weather, and work is nearing completion for the grant application to fund future developments.

**Whooping cough**, a bacterial infection that affects the lungs, has been rising in many countries since December 2023. It is a cyclical disease and a peak year is long overdue. Vaccination in pregnancy and childhood are important for protection but both have fallen in recent years. It is treated by antibiotics. The NHS launched the **Pharmacy First Service (PFS)** on 31<sup>st</sup> January (see [NHS Pharmacy First Service \(PFS\) | NHSBSA](#) ) Appointments can be booked directly with participating pharmacies for the treatment of 7 common health conditions namely sinusitis, sore throat, earache, infected insect bite, impetigo, shingles, uncomplicated urinary tract infections in women. Pharmacists can offer advice to patients and supply NHS medicines where clinically appropriate. This will help reduce the pressure on Morland House Surgery. **Group Consultation Clinics** – A group clinic is currently being offered for the menopause and probably other conditions. 




