POLICE SQUAD!

Update from the Eynsham Neighbourhood Police Team – Richard, Helen, Issy and Liz:

Following the lovely weather over the summer period the team have been taking part in a number of events in the area. The Ride for Respect which came through Stanton Harcourt on its journey to Carterton was a spectacle which many people were able to enjoy. Richard and Helen have been out with the Speed Indicator Device in Sutton and Stanton Harcourt.

Over the summer months there have been reports of criminal damage to property and vehicles in Stanton along with reports of theft from Sutton. Two people have been interviewed by police about the offences in Stanton however no charges have been brought at this time. Also in Stanton 2 people have been dealt with by officers after causing damage to crops in a field.

As we approach the Autumn and the change from British Summer Time we would like to offer advice regarding security of your homes and garages, particularly as the darker nights draw in.

The team will be in Stanton Harcourt on Saturday 12th October (at The Harcourt Arms) from 10am-2pm carrying out Bike Marking and Registrations. Please bring your bikes to the pub if you would like them marked – this is free of charge.

We will also be at The Harcourt Arms on Wednesday 23rd October from 12noon -3pm where we will have supplies of Bogus Caller Stickers, Halloween/ Trick or Treat Posters and other crime prevention advice dependent upon what you would like to talk about.

She thinks the Licensing Act 2003 was a big step forward in allowing flexible licensing of pubs, bars and one off events through Temporary Event Notices (TENS)



Did you know? Known by their distinctive forked tail feathers, red kites were reintroduced in England in 1989 after being on the brink of global extinction due to egg poachers! Four Swedish birds and one Welsh bird were released in Buckinghamshire, and it's their relatives that now fly over our heads.

Red kites like to eat small animals like mice but sometimes as big as pigeons and rabbits, and at Christmas they hunt children that have been behaving badly.

Location, Location, Location

Recent planning news includes:

- The Fox was denied permission for 'change of use', Parish Council urged refusal to district planners who provisionally approved the application. Nasser has been working hard to restore the building to its former glory on the outside. And was hoping to turn the carpark into a garden in due course, but continues to welcome feedback from villagers prior to any future planning application. - The Cricket Club have been approved for a bar license despite objections from parish council. Concerns were raised that the bar could open frequently enough to affect business at the remaining pub in the village, but as a voluntary organisation this is unlikely to occur. When asked about the situation the Harcourt Estate commented "*The Estate is pleased to be able to provide the village with facilities for the Cricket Club, which it has done for several decades now for free and for the Clubhouse to be used in conjunction with cricket matches. However, the Estate is keen to ensure that all local enterprises thrive and therefore support regular social events being held at the village pub.*"

It's important to appreciate all the resources available in the village whether its the land provided for the cricket club and playgrounds by local estates or the volunteers to run them. Hopefully if we all work together we can support everybody!

Telephone Banking Scam!

We've been asked to warn you about a telephone banking scam that is occurring. People are being called and asked to phone the number on the back of their card about their account.

The scam works because they hold the line open and pretend to be your bank when you dial them and they can ask you your details (and you think it's actually your bank)

If you are in any doubt about a caller do not give out any details and politely hang up. Call your bank another time if needed, or using another phone, or call someone you know well in between to ensure the line has been cleared!

SuperScrippers

Parish Council have asked that we look at reducing the costs of Village Voice, the costs being printing and delivery by the young folks who get a few pennies for shoe leather.

On The Buses

The number 18 bus route is under review due to the budget cuts and significant subsidy required ~£180k for around 161 people per day. The Councils preference is to reduce the service to every 2 hours instead of every hour, rather than restrict its overall route.
