Firstly, a message from our President Mick McAuliffe.

Hi Everyone

The season may have ended but there's still plenty going on to update you about.

I'm really pleased with the response we have received to the proposed mini-tour planned for next July. Todate 26 members have signed up for the tour which will be based in The Vine Hotel, Skegness. I am currently in discussions with 5 Lincolnshire clubs who have expressed a wish to play matches against us on Friday, Saturday and Sunday during the tour. They will all be talking to their committee members at meetings in the next couple of weeks. Once I get confirmation from them all, we will be able to select the three clubs who seem best equipped to host us in July.

This week I have received confirmation from the Ceredigion County Bowling Association that they would like to play a match against Brush during their proposed tour in June 2021. You may remember that we

were originally due to play this match in June 2020 before the Covid19 pandemic came along. This may be the first time that Brush have played a team from a different country. Those longer-serving members amongst you may know for sure? It's certainly something for us all to look forward to next year especially as I've been told that they've promised to sing for us!

The Brush Night Quiz is back. Unfortunately, due to Covid19, we are unable to run our usual programme of clubhouse quizzes throughout the Winter. However, we won't let that stand in our way. On the original scheduled dates, we now plan to run virtual quizzes using the Zoom platform. We used this format earlier in the year and it all went surprisingly well. Bowls England have started the process of planning the Bowls program for the 2022 games. The host city is Birmingham but the venues being used for the Games stretch from Coventry to Royal Learnington Spa in the east to Cannock Chase Forest in the north west of the region.

The Games start on 28th July 2022, running through to 8th August 2022.

Bowls England have announced that Alistair Hollis has been appointed as Team England's Lawn Bowls Team Leader for the 2022 Commonwealth Games.

Alistair will act as the liaison with Commonwealth Games England (CGE) on key areas of team preparation including playing kit, maximising home advantage, accommodation, anti-doping and safeguarding education.

During the Games, he will provide logistical support on behalf of our selected team including scheduling, communications and transport.

The Bowls Games will be played at Victoria Park, Royal Learnington Spa. You can sign up to the Bowls England Newsletter, via their website to get information on ticket and volunteering opportunities. In the Spotlight.....




Sadly, the world of bowls lost David Bryant in August this year.

He was universally recognised as the greatest bowls player that ever lived.

Clevedon was the town where he was born and bred, and where he took up bowls as a teenager in the 1940's. And it was as a member of the Clevedon Bowls Club at the top of Chapel Hill that he amassed the vast number of trophies at international level.

He won the world outdoor singles title three times, the world outdoor triples title once, and claimed five gold medals (four of them in the singles) at the Commonwealth Games between 1962 and 1980. He also teamed up with Tony Allcock, who recently retired as CEO of Bowls England, to win the world indoor pairs title six times.

At national level, he was England singles champion outdoors on six occasions, and won the England indoor singles title nine times. He also won the national outdoor fours title four times, the triples and pairs three times apiece.









He was awarded the MBE in 1969, and the CBE in 1980, but perhaps the honour that he most treasured came when he was installed as Pipeman of the Year. Even millions of people who know nothing about bowls, but who caught a glimpse of the sport on TV in the 1980's, will remember him affectionately as 'The Man with the Pipe'.

A keen fisherman, rose-grower, and a dedicated family man, David Bryant enthusiastically endorsed the idea that bowls is a sport with high standards of behaviour, was well known for his good sportsmanship, and, when he lost, always did so with grace.

Bowls was in his blood and in the words of the great man himself "Bowls is a young man's game which old men can play" "I'm not an athlete, more a gymnast and golfer soldered together".

In 2007 Pete was honoured by the Queen. He was awarded the MBE for Services to Scouting in Sheffield. He received the honour at Buckingham Palace from The Queen.





Whilst sport has always featured in Pete's activities, he doesn't claim greatness in any of the sports he's played, except for darts. He was President of a Junior Football Club in Sheffield which fielded 12 teams.

Pete and Sheila love cruising to different parts of the world. To-date they've been on about 35. They like to go to the warmer climates, but exceptions have been Antarctica and seeing the Northerns Lights in the Arctic.



Peter and Sheila moved to Loughborough to be nearer their family. They joined the U3A and through this Pete joined Brush Bowls Club in 2015. Pete is one busy man. He is Treasurer of Bowls Loughborough, Chair of Loughborough & District Scouts and Treasurer of Loughborough Bowls Tourists. In 2016 he became Events Manager for Brush Bowls Club, and in his words 'is still doing a most enjoyable job, seeing Club Members having a good time'.
