In September, guest speaker, Charles Parker returned to talk to us about the A V Roe Organisation at Bracebridge Heath that did Lancaster Repairs. The site opened in 1940 when there were Lancasters based at local RAF stations such as Scampton and Waddington. Although 7377 Lancasters were built from scratch, another 622 were built from components. When Lancasters crashed they were taken to Bracebridge Heath and for every 4 planes taken in, 3 were rebuilt from the parts. They were not allocated new numbers though as they kept the original number and log book from the nose of the aircraft. Salvaged parts were sorted through in 2 locations in Lincoln. One was at the White Hart Hotel garage where women would work during school hours. The other was upstairs at Curtis on the High Street. This location was chosen as it had a lift so that people in wheel chairs could work there. Parts were found that could be reused for the rebuilt planes. Charles brought in some of these parts to show us. After the war, several Lancasters were converted to other things, such as Lancastrians which were for cargo. The site looked as if it would be closed at the start of the 1980s but with the Falklands war, Vulcans needed repairing so the site wasn't closed until 1984.

In October, member speaker, Richard Croft, gave a presentation entitled "The Nunnery at Sixhills". He has been working with the SLHA for the past couple of years on recording as much history as possible about this pretty timber-framed cottage. The SLHA has been researching other timber-framed buildings locally previously, at Thorpe on the Hill and Aubourn. The Nunnery is only a recent name for the grade II listed building that correctly is called Lincoln Lane Farmhouse. It wasn't the house of the farm but alongside it. The history behind it is that originally there was a Gilbertine Priory in the village founded in 1148. The Priory had its own history as Gwladys ferch Dafydd, Princess of Wales was imprisoned there as a nun for 54 years and her grave can be visited. Following the dissolution of the Priory in 1538 a house was built in the village for the last Prior, James Wallis, and his sister Isobel. The timber framed cottage had a central open hall with wings. The SLHA have produced a digital reconstruction of it. This is where science meets history and the SLHA have used it to find out a lot more about the house. Dendrochronology was used to date the timber frame. It's amazing to think that some of these timbers were trees that started growing in the 9th century. They have even been pinpointed to being from Sherwood Forest in Edwinstowe. Timbers from the dissolved Priory were re-used as a floor. The house fell into disrepair following the English Civil War. Post Restoration between 1662-92 it was remodelled internally, encased in stone and 2 chimneys built. Again, there are many different brick types used over the building and some of these were reused from the Priory. This could be seen by the architectural detail on them. Using photographic recording methods, the SLHA were able to date the fixtures and fittings. They could see inside that at one point it had been split into 3 cottages as there was evidence of 3 staircases. Some of the timbers upstairs and over the fireplace have apotropaic scorch marks on them. These were used to ward off evil spirits. Sadly, the house is in a poor state of repair and appears down one side to be suffering from land slip. The cottage's future is uncertain.

We have one more meeting this year before our Christmas break.

Our Late fruiting raspberries have done surprisingly well and we have been picking them right up to the middle of November! Winter crops are flourishing with the sharp frosts having thankfully greatly reduced the white fly on the greens so we have not had to resort to sprays. Fingers crossed as this is being written that the rats have decided not to visit us this year, never far away of course we much appreciate this courtesy.

Local commercial growers have noticed the same with their crops as we have with ours, in that low growing vegetables have survived this Summer with very little watering. However generally produce is smaller and if you enjoy purchasing UK grown fruit and vegetables you may have noticed this already.

Winter is a good time to plan and prepare for next Spring and Summer. I understand that one or two Allotmenters are looking for help with their plots and this means you too would get chance to manage and plan a bit of the ground for yourself. This would be a good chance to have a go without making a solitary commitment. Allotments can be used to grow a variety of plants including flowers. Flowers for cutting, prize chrysanthemums and those for your own herbal preparations, can do well in a nicely dug piece of ground. Contact the parish council secretary and/or pop along and have a chat.

As we tuck into our home grown vegetables followed by fruit crumble and custard we would like to wish everyone a Happy New Year for 2019.
