Copies of the proposed constitution will be made available in a recent Homewatch meeting she attended where proposals for ere discussed. She also advised members on the outcome of the PCSO regarding complaints reported by ClIr Balcon at the last rking close to junctions and on the pavement. The solution is very much unity as there is little the police can do. One solution would be for the





council to employ a traffic warden, but as this is unrealistic a polite personal approach when bad parking is observed may be the only answer, but that is a decision for each individual.

Although it is early days the system of subsidising bus services is going to end and alternative strategies for linking rural communities developed.
