WHAT'S HAPPENED?

Bramley Parish Council update

At the Parish Council meeting in March, a number of matters were discussed, including:

- Surrey County Councillor Kevin Deanus stated that the deadline for Surrey submitting their plan for local government reorganisation is 21st March, they are in favour of two unitary bodies whilst the Boroughs are in favour of three unitary bodies. The final decision will be made by the Government. Surrey have suggested five different options for the two bodies.
 - Only a third of Surrey currently have Parish Councils; Cllr Deanus thinks the parishes could gain more power.
 - There will be an elected Mayor from 2027 with strategic powers. The Police and Crime Commissioner role will likely form part of the Mayoral role.
- Cllr Deanus advised that speeding strips had been installed south of the village near Singh Concrete and north of the roundabout on the A281 in Bramley and both evidenced general compliance of speeds within acceptable parameters, as it stands Surrey highways would not support a change of the

- speed limit in those locations. Cllr Deanus is also looking into reducing speeds in the wider Bramley area, but this will take time. This will include 20mph reviews in some locations.
- Waverley Borough Councillor Jane Austin stated that Local Government Reorganisation for Surrey is
 progressing on 21st March Surrey County Council submitted a proposal for a two unitary structure
 and 8 of the 11 district and borough councils submitted a proposal for a 3 unitary structure to
 government. Initial feedback expected in the coming days. Full detailed proposals will be submitted in
 May. For more information click on this <u>link</u>.
- Cllr Austin has met with Open Reach to discuss the progress of their work in Bramley. SGN have now fixed most of their issues in Bramley thus enabling Open Reach to carry out more work in their ducting which they will coincide with the drainage works to be done in the village next week. Cllr Austin has also spoken to Asda requesting a more detailed update on the progress of the remedial work that they are carrying out. Cllr Austin also advised there will be ongoing roadworks in Shalford starting with SGN replacing the gas works in Kings Road next week with a road closure expected for three weeks. Following that there will be between 10 to 12 weeks of roadworks on the A281 in Shalford for traffic calming measures.
- Asda Community Fund Update Cllr B Stern reported that the Committee were making progress with
 the residents' requests particularly the village hall. He asked Cllr Coleman, chairman of the village hall
 committee, for an update. Cllr Coleman stated he had a quote for approximately £10,000 to
 redecorate the village hall which had been approved by email by most of the committee members.
 The work will be carried out by Village Handyman Services who will work around the current bookings
 thus protecting the income stream.

For those who are new to the village... Bramley Wheels is a volunteer organisation that gives Bramley villagers lifts to medical appointments. If a villager requires a lift, then they can ring 07599 430763 between 10 am and 12 pm Monday to Friday (excluding bank holidays) and a lift will be organised for them. Ideally a couple of days' notice is helpful as this gives us time to find a driver. If you know of anyone in Bramley that might find this service useful then please pass this information on to them.

We are always on the look out for new drivers - even if you could do one lift a year it spreads the load.

We also need a few more people to take the calls - it's a mobile so if you have the phone you can still go out and about with it. On average we get about 5 calls a week, so it's not very onerous or time consuming.

The survey is open for comments until Sunday 20 April.
