Minutes of Mentmore Parish Council meeting held on Wednesday 6th June 2018 at Mentmore Village Hall at 8pm.

C/48/18. Chairman's items and welcomes

The Chairman opened the meeting and welcomed everyone.

C/49/18. Attendance and Apologies

Apologies were received from Councillor Butler.

C/50/18. Disclosures of Interest on items pertaining to the agenda – Councillors to declare any interests.

Councillor Langley declared an interest in accounts submitted for payment.

C/51/18. Minutes from previous meeting.

It was PROPOSED, SECONDED and APPROVED that the minutes from the parish council meeting held on the 2nd May 2018 were correct and were signed by the Chairman.

C/52/18. Public Question Time.

A member of the public raised the issue of traffic travelling through the village. Reports of HGVs driving to skip businesses on the airfield are driving through the village before 7am. The Chairman said that we need evidence. The Chairman stated that Mentmore Parish Council can submit a complain. Waste King are covered by an S106 agreement, but other operators are allowed to operate through the parish. The resident asked whether we could have a weight limit, the Chairman would like to get a 7.5 tonne weight limit through the village, the freight strategy is being reviewed. The chairman mentioned there will be a new principal council in the future, he hopes that their thinking might be different on that subject.

C/53/18. Police Matters.

The police were not present at the meeting. Thames Valley Police Police Officer Phil Duthie is being replaced by Police Constable Matt Crocker.

C/54/18. To receive reports from District and County Councillors.

Aylesbury Vale District Councillor District Councillor Cooper reported:

Aylesbury Vale District Council Planning and Enforcement - the enforcement officer Gary Dunne has left, and Councillor Cooper will try to arrange a meeting with another Enforcement Officer. Horses Helping People have complained about the bomb explosion recently which was detonated near the stables.

Aylesbury Vale Broadband – a report was shown on BBC South about the failure of the business set up by Aylesbury Vale District Council. Aylesbury Vale District Council are expected to lose £200,000 on the deal and there is a possibility of further loses.

Oxford-Cambridge Arc Expressway – the route is almost guaranteed to be route A which is the closest route to Mentmore. Consultation will initially be with local authorities, followed by public consultation, this is expected in the Autumn.

Housing development is estimated to be approx. 1million homes between Oxford and Cambridge, the increase in the Vale is expected in the Winslow – Buckingham areas.

District Elections – are planned for May 2019, but this is could be delayed with the new council.

Bucks County Councillor Wight reported:

Brownlow Bridge Damage and Closure

Unfortunately, the bridge is no longer safe for use, by cars, cyclists or pedestrians, necessitating a full closure for a period of approximately three months.

Transport for Bucks is working with the Canal and River Trust, who are responsible for repairing the bridge. As Transport for Bucks was due to replace the traffic lights on the bridge over the forthcoming school holiday period, and it is hoped that this work can be done once the bridge is made safe again.

Diversions will be in place throughout this period.

Crafton road improvements

Road surface improvements were recently undertaken to improve road surfaces in Crafton with some of the additional funding released to tackle some of the damage from the winter weather. We will be continuing to get as much road surface work done before the autumn throughout the division.

Healthwatch Bucks

Healthwatch Bucks works closely with Bucks County Council and the National Health Service in order to improve patient care and experience. They do this through inviting patients to express their ideas and opinions and provide feedback on health services in Bucks, so that it can be considered and acted upon by the health authorities to improve service.

Their priorities for 2017-2018 are Mental Health and Wellbeing, Prevention and Primary Care, and Transition to and within Social Care. They do online reporting of patient surveys and provide signposting to services, which helps service users understand what they can expect from the NHS and other health and care services. They often direct people to information that is already in the public domain but is hard to find. This includes information to help people understand any choices they may have regarding these services.
