The Parish Council met on Monday January 13th. The next scheduled date for Parish Council Election is February 13th.

Flooding in the Village. West Berks Highways Dept has stated that 'due to a budget reduction, it would not be possible to fund the upgrading of the drainage system during this financial year'. The Chairman had discussed the matter with them and was informed that the upgrading was not on the schedule for 2003/2004. He agreed to discuss the matter further before the next meeting. In the meantime the Highways Dept. has agreed to routinely clean the existing drainage system.

Main Street. It appears that the road known as Main Street, although it appears on the electoral role, has not been formally named. This has resulted in some confusion when contacting the emergency services. It was proposed that the appropriate steps be taken to formally name it. If after consultation, The Royal Mail and the Emergency Services have no objection, the residents of 'Main Street' will also be consulted by letter.

Parish Precept. The Council set a Precept for the year 2003/2004 of £1965.00. That is an increase of £305.00 on the previous year. The increase being mainly due to extra expenses relating to Parish Elections.

The next meeting of the Parish Council will be on Monday 10th March.

I would like to thank All Saints Church for their kind donation to the Beale Park Trust Fund of £79.20 which was collected at the carol service back in December. The park has a programme of environmental and educational activities which aims to offer opportunities to all groups regardless of ability or financial state. VOTERS LAMENT

Now that we have been disenfranchised from the lowest levels of government as our elected representatives have quite rightly stood down from office rather than sign a declaration of details of property and other financial interests, it appears the requirement of disclosure may be unjustified.

The unadopted standards were imposed upon the Parish councillors without consultation. Rod Smallwood, chairman of a Hertfordshire Parish recently commented "we are an elected body with absolute sovereignty in our Parish, although we have no powers of decision and are not paid". Parish Councils have objected to the code and a High Court Judicial Review is being prepared.

As West Berkshire District Council has imposed an unelected interim council upon us, while bi monthly requests for nominees costing £45 a time are publicized, perhaps a record of any decisions taken might be made public in our excellent "clarion" the West Ilsley News. Name supplied upon request.
