### Youth Development Day – Selby BC – Saturday 10th May 2025

#### Get Together

The YBA Ladies Northern Counties Teams pre-match Get Together day at York Railway BSC was sunny with a breeze. There was a lot to do with ladies milling about and greeting each other after the long winter absence, County books and chalks to sell, scorecards and game to organise and coach seats to secure for our supporters for upcoming matches.

We started with a short introduction and very warm welcome to President Helen who then welcomed all the Ladies to Yorkshire Bowling Association. Her main ask (in the style of Sean Bean and others) was to "DO IT FOR YORKSHIRE!".

We had 48 ladies attend the day with 44 able to play in 4 rinks of Fours and two rinks of Triples. In previous years we have had three Northern Trophy playing against the other three etc. but this year I changed it up to be a straight game of Northern Trophy team versus Stella Logan team for a bit of extra fun and foster a competitive edge.

Before the game, I gave a quick run-down of the required etiquette, points of note (especially for our new ladies) and looked for interest in having a development day with the County Coach. The development day was well accepted especially by some of our new ladies, and several took the pre-prepared etiquette sheet away to study. I re-enforced that we are there to win but to ensure we also have fun, support our teammates and play as a team both in our rinks and overall.

The Northern Trophy team won the game by 4 rinks to 2 and 84 shots to 57.

Three of our teams won through to the finals but unfortunately the triples were beaten in the semi-final.

There was success in the finals with Sue Allen winning the singles against Cumbria. Our pairs were beaten by Durham.

The fours final was very exciting with Yorkshire well behind to come back to be only one down playing the last end. They laid two shots until the Cumbrian skip moved the jack, and it was down to a close measure which the umpire conceded he could not declare a winning shot, so it was a tied end and therefore Yorkshire lost by one...so close.

### Reminders

Remember for each competition the first drawn in each pair shall be termed the 'challenger' and the second the 'opponent'. Unless competitions are being played on selected dates the challenger shall, at the latest in respect of any round to be played, at least seven days before that round closure, offer their opponent at least two dates, none of which shall be the last day of the period of the round nor be on the same day as a county match or county competition fixed date match.

The time for commencing a match shall be mutually agreed but no player shall be compelled to accept a time earlier than 6pm or later than 6:30pm Monday to Friday; or earlier than 9:30am or later than 6:30pm on weekends.

The challenger in singles matches will provide a marker and failure to do so will mean forfeiture of the round.

Also remember that there must be a draw for the rink before the game starts. At least two rinks must be put in the draw. (Laws of the Sport - Law 1.3)

In the event of inclement weather and no play/no further play being possible, please contact the Ladies' Competition Secretary immediately to decide the course of action to be taken. (BE Rules and Regulations. Page 45 - Appendix F)
