WEST ILSLEY PARISH COUNCIL

Chairman's annual report Sean Ryan

Much of the work of a parish council goes on behind the scenes so it's gratifying that in the past 12 months we've had a hand in a couple of projects that nobody could have failed to notice.

The first was the pond. It hadn't been cleared out for 20 years and had flooded in 2007. West Berkshire Council finally responded to requests

for action and made a terrific job of removing hundreds of tonnes of silt and building a bank at the back and a channel at the front to prevent flooding. So far, so good on that score, although the new system has yet to be tested by any torrential rain. The bill for this work came to £12,000 and we were lucky to be asked for only £400 to cover the cost of clearing the ditch at the bottom of the recreation ground. The credit for overseeing it all goes to Alan Bloor, the only councillor not on holiday when the work was being done!

The second big project in the past year - one for which the parish council claims no credit whatsoever - was the resurfacing of the tennis court. Our role was limited to financial support - a donation and a loan to cover part of the cost - for the tennis committee, which has made a great success of it. The court is now in frequent use. It's one of the most popular places in the village. Congratulations to all concerned and thanks to Jo Scriven for handling the money side for the parish council.

Bollards went up at the Ridgeway car park after concern was expressed at one of our meetings that it was becoming a truck stop. Not everyone likes the look of the bollards - they're supposed to have been painted in a colour more in keeping with the surroundings - but at least there seems to be less rubbish in the car park.

We've also seen the new gateway to the village installed on Bury Lane, the latest in a series of measures to slow traffic speeds.

A survey of speeds showed a slight reduction since this was last carried out three or four years ago. West Berks Council believes we don't have a speeding problem in West Ilsley - there's been 'only' one injury in the past five years - but the parish council strongly disagrees. As we see it, the problem is worst at either end of the village and although we've succeeded in having the 30mph sign moved further up the road to Farnborough, giving drivers more time to slow down before they reach the recreation ground, a similar request for the sign to be moved some way up the hill on the road out to East Ilsley has so far gone unheeded. John Mountford has kept up the pressure all year on speeding and will continue to do so.

The play area remains very popular and in good condition, thanks to Dries Hagen's hard work and his success in acquiring replacement parts when needed at very reasonable cost.

The play area exists in harmony with the cricket club, which in turn has maintained good relations over the last year with its neighbours. The club's new code of practice, drawn up after some of the neighbours aired concerns at a parish council meeting, covers everything from strimming times to the retrieval of balls from gardens. It's made an

enormous difference and reflects goodwill on all sides. One property where several balls used to stray during some matches had fewer than five balls in its garden all season, thanks mainly to playing further upfield where possible. The owners of this property have joined the parish council in thanking the cricket club for its sensitive resolution of a difficult dispute.

The recreation ground also saw one of the social highlights of the year - the royal wedding celebration - supported by a donation from the parish council. It was very well attended, a credit to the organisers who worked so hard to make it a special day.

Other matters: a threat was averted to the prescription service which allows people to collect their medicines in the village rather than drive to the surgery, thanks to Fred Carter and the Elliots; and the parish precept - the bit of the council tax that covers our spending - was frozen for the fifth year in a row in line with our view that we shouldn't be adding to anyone's financial burdens in troubled times.

Warm thanks are due to Dries for his hard work on the play area and the mowing rota, Alan for the pond and other environmental initiatives, Jo for managing our money without a single hitch, John for covering transport so tenaciously and Anna Sugden, who's in charge of the most important project for the year ahead - the parish plan.

Alison Banks is to be applauded for another meticulous year's work as clerk - the person who actually runs the parish council.

Thanks also to all those who come along to our meetings for an hour or so on the second Monday of every other month. It's good to hear a range of voices on the issues that affect all of us in West Ilsley. See you at 7.30pm in the village hall on July 11!

THE ROYAL BRITISH LEGION (RBL) –

news from your local branch May 11 – Compton,
Ilsleys & Norreys Branch

The Officers and members of the local branch of
the Royal British Legion (RBL) – Compton, Ilsleys
and Norreys – thank everyone who organised and
donated to last year's Poppy Appeal. The result
was a record collection from our downland area –
thank you all very much. This generosity, together
with the large turnout at the branch's
Remembrance Sunday parade and service, held
last year at West Ilsley, is testimony to the
presently high profile that the welfare of ex-
servicemen and women has at the present time.

The RBL's mission is to support ex servicemen
and their families. In Berkshire last financial year,
the RBL distributed such support to the value of
just over one million pounds. Beneficiaries,
previously predominantly veterans of the two
world wars, now typically are those younger ex
servicemen who have served in conflicts such as
Aden, Borneo, the Falklands, the Balkans, Iraq
and Afghanistan. Casualty figures being incurred
in this latter campaign are, of course, getting wide
publicity.

a) **Outing to Bletchley Park Sunday 3 Jul 11**

Bletchley Park in Buckinghamshire is the historic
site of secret British code-breaking activities

approx 1030hrs and returning at approx 1630hrs.
Cost is expected to be about £15 per head
inclusive of transport and entry. All you have to do

is bring your own lunch or buy it there. It should be a fun and interesting day

b) Branch Annual lunch on Friday 14 Oct 11

The event, after last year's success, will again be held at the Compton Swan 1215hrs for 1300hrs. UPDATE FOR THE COMPTON DAY CENTRE APPEAL , 12TH MAY 2011

Good news about AgeUK Berkshire and their proposed use of the building, see their request below. All those who are more able to go to this club, or have/will volunteer to help, please contact Sheila Craig on the numbers or email address below. She needs to know who is interested to be able to plan the way ahead. This also applies to those who may have contacted me before in any way as not all of you have left contact details. Better to duplicate than lose you !

Thank you for all your replies to me to volunteer to help or go to this centre. We are still hoping to provide day care for those who are more in need, and to continue the use of the excellent facilities at Compton. Finance is the main problem for any new care provider, especially as income from clients from their personal budgets, which are being 'reviewed', and/or personal donations are unknown at present. We are still trying very hard

to resolve this and still have some providers who may be able to finalise a plan.

West Berks Council have stated that they are willing to give the centre to the charity trustees of Compton Village Hall. We have researched costs and the annual non profit running costs for the building will be in the region of £7,200 per year. This means that for example, three users of the building will have to pay £2,400 a year, though with more users, the less they will pay. We as trustees must ensure that this building will be sustainable and not a drain on our charitable resources in the future. If you know of any organisation that would like to use the building please ask them to contact me as soon as possible, as final decisions will have to be made soon.
