

Connecting Shropshire - The story so far...

- Phase 1 and Phase 2 - contract with BT to build and maintain the fibre broadband network
 - Phase 1 - £26m (£8m BT/£10m Broadband Delivery UK/£8m Shropshire) capital only
 - Phase 2 - £4.7m Broadband Delivery UK (BDUK)
 - Phase 1 ends winter 2016
 - Phase 2 ends winter 2017
- Positive partnership with BT but more work to do with challenges to close down contract 1
- 66,000 premises expected to get access to fibre broadband by winter 2017
 - To date 295 structures live (Fibre to the Cabinet/Fibre to the Premises)
 - 54,000 premises with access to fibre broadband at September 2016
 - Take up to June 2016 – 29.2%
- Shropshire aspiration is to give all premises access to superfast broadband by 2020
- Phase 2b procurement to address remaining gaps (estimated 15,000 premises)
 - Balance of BDUK and Marches LEP funding will be used - £11.7m
 - Expected Timescales:
 - Open Market Review - COMPLETE
 - Formal market engagement - COMPLETE
 - State Aid Public Consultation - COMPLETE
 - Issue Invitation To Tender for open procurement – **October 2016**
 - Contract – **early 2017**
- Challenges
 - Sparsity of premises increases the cost of deployment
 - Communications and expectations - not every premises will benefit from 1 or 2



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- To date:
 - 107 cabinets in 26 exchange areas are now live providing over 20,000 homes and business with access to faster fibre broadband
 - Baschurch is covered by BT's Race to Infinity project and is not part of Connecting Shropshire
 - Another 10 cabinets are in plan to be delivered as part of phase 1
 - Additional coverage is projected for parts of north Shropshire in phase 2 during 2017
- We know that all properties have access to faster broadband and there is more work to be done in phases 2 and 2b (next procurement).

Please note that broadband speeds won't increase automatically, you'll need to make the switch by upgrading to fibre broadband with your chosen internet service provider.

- What options are available for those still on slow broadband connections:
 - Contact your internet service provider and ask them to provide a better service. If they can't you should consider switching to another provider
 - Explore alternative broadband technologies, such as fixed wireless or 4G, see: <http://connectingshropshire.co.uk/alternative-broadband-solutions/>
 - Carry on as you are in the hope that your premises will benefit from further work carried out by Connecting Shropshire over the next 2/3 years.
The programme runs till at least 2020 and we remain committed to providing superfast broadband to as many more premises as possible in areas without access to fibre broadband.
