SUMMARY FROM THE PARISH COUNCIL WEDNESDAY 14th FEBRUARY 2024

Below is a summary of some of the topics and discussions which took place at the Parish Council meeting held in February.

Planning

Joint Local Plan (JLP) – Preferred Options Consultation

Notes on the JLP prepared by Mr Barry Coward were discussed along with information from Haseley Brook Action Group. The Parish Council agreed that the latest proposals for housing in the area is good news. Development at Chalgrove airfield has been removed and Harrington is not included on the list of possible sites.

Resolved that, based on discussions, Cllr Wakeling will submit a response to the consultation on behalf of the Parish Council.

The Parish Council thanked Mr Barry Coward for reading through the latest JLP and producing his report for the Parish Council.

It was noted that the consultation period had been extended to 26th February 2024

Report by District / County Councillor

District Councillor Georgina Heritage had circulated her report prior to the meeting. Cllr Heritage added that she had attended a meeting at which the new joint Air Quality Action Plan (AQAP) was adopted. The Plan focusses on reducing traffic emissions. It was noted that while most areas across both districts have very good local air quality there are several hotspots (Air Quality Management Areas) which include Henley, Wallingford and Watlington.

South Oxfordshire District Council (SODC) are providing financial support for residents and businesses who were affected by flooding during storm Henk between 2nd and 12th January 2024. Cllr Horwell will publicise the information and link via social media.

Little Milton Village Shop

A joint meeting of representatives from the Village Shop, Village Hall and Parish Council has taken place. The latest financial projections for the shop look a little better than they did towards the end of last year, mostly due to improved turnover and a significantly lower projected wage bill. However, given the lower number of paid hours the need for volunteers to help with the shop is critical.

Solar panels on the village hall and shop, as a means to lower energy costs (which remain a large part of the shop's outgoings) is to be investigated, along with sources of grant funding. Future CIL monies could contribute towards the cost. The project will be approached in a collaborative way to ensure it is paid for optimally and within the governance structures of the three entities.

Multi Use Games Area (MUGA)

Cllrs van der Merwe, Horwell, the Parish Clerk and Mr Paul Connolly met with the contractor on 24th January 2024 to discuss the refurbishment of the MUGA. The contractor suggested works may start mid spring / early summer.

Costs have risen by 15% from the original quotation. Total cost is £62.5k (originally £54k). Upgrading the surface to a longer lasting and superior synthetic surface was discussed. Upgrading both courts will increase the cost by approximately £4k. To stagger costs the upgraded surface could be applied to the football court and a tarmac surface laid on the tennis court first (which must be done anyway) and then provide a synthetic surface at a later date. The parish council will decide on how to proceed with the surfacing at a future meeting.

Playground

Four quotations to replace the wooden fence around the playground, including the access gate were presented. After discussion it was agreed to award the work to the company with the lowest quotation. **Resolved** to replace the wooden fencing at a cost of £5,750.00 excl. vat. Agreed to contact County Councillor van Mierlo to ask for grant funding towards the cost.

Next Meeting

The next Parish Council meeting will be held on Wednesday 13th March 2024, in Pine Lodge, commencing at 7.30pm.

RECTOR'S PINT

Easter this year may coincide well with the Spring daffodils, and that is because Easter is relatively early, on March 31st. The dating of Easter is taken from the Gregorian calendar, and it can occur on any Sunday between March 22nd and April 25th, a wide parameter. The Eastern Orthodox Church has a different dating system, taken from the Julian calendar. Here, I'm confining myself to the Western Gregorian dating. Over a 500-year period (from 1600 to 2099) Easter will most often be celebrated on either March 31st or April 16th, so we are spot on this year!

Easter Sunday always occurs on the first Sunday after the Paschal full moon, the full moon that occurs after the Spring Equinox. In the Christian story, the Last Supper, the final meal Jesus shared with his disciples on the night before his crucifixion was a Passover feast, itself one of the principal festivals that was always celebrated on, or near, the time of a full moon. That is the theory at least, that the dating of Easter links us to the Jewish lunar calendar, but there are plenty of well-qualified commentators who say that in practice it has not always worked that way!

Whatever its origins, there have been many calls to standardise the date of Easter over the years, not least from within the Church. In 2016, our present Archbishop of Canterbury, Justin Welby said he believed that the date would be fixed by 2026 to either the second or third Sunday in April.

For many, perhaps most people, the significance of Easter has primarily become linked to cute bunnies, fluffy chicks and chocolate eggs. But for Christians, Easter Sunday is

a celebration of the claim of the actual and physical resurrection from the dead of a man whom his followers very quickly came to believe was God. I do the job I do because I believe that claim to be true.

I suppose it might make practical sense and would be convenient for us all to fix the date of Easter as a part of the school holiday and as the centrepiece of a set bank holiday weekend. However, in a world in which everything is directed towards our own convenience, and in where so much is standardised, I think it is wonderful, however impractical, that we have held onto a tradition which is *not* simply for our convenience and there is nothing standardised about Easter! It is a reminder that God does not follow our agenda, but that we are invited to follow his, however 'inconvenient' that might be.

In this, I remain a traditionalist, although in the event of change I wouldn't fight too hard against it. The meaning, not the date is the most important thing, and every Sunday is a 'Little Easter,' the Commemoration of the Resurrection.

Alleluia, Christ is risen!

FRIENDS OF WELLS FARM

Feb has been very mild for sure. I recall trying to plant a hedge mid-February about 10 years ago to find it began to snow and got so cold we had to abandon the work party. Same date in 2024 and it is 16 degrees! Early Feb I saw a small tortoiseshell butterfly and a small white as well as a couple of bumblebees. Blackthorns started flowering from the 10th and the daffodils are coming out. There were even celandines in flower in Long Meadow! So I am just recording these occurrences as a future record. Oh and two chiffchaffs were calling at the allotments mid-February. I have not heard them this early but looking at the British records database it appears some of them are either migrating from the Mediterranean much earlier or even staying here over winter.

Wells Farm now has an almost perfect habitat for yellowhammers. Our wild canaries. The like areas with nice hedgerows and rough grass areas nearby where they nest on the ground. This is partly why the signs along the bridle path ask people to keep their dogs on the path and not wander off to disturb nesting birds. So please keep your dogs on the paths.

Resident badgers are very busy and as we move towards April, the cubs will start to venture out. I recorded three of them removing one of my trail cameras from a fence and playing with the Velcro tether. Glad I had a second camera watching the first!

Some of you may have seen my post about an incident reported to me by a resident when walking their dog one Friday evening. They came across some people hare coursing, with their dogs chasing the hares across the fields and killing them. Sadly hares have been absent the last two times I have checked for them. If you do come across such activities report them to the wildlife crimes officer or BBOWT if on our reserve.

I hope you have seen the progress made one the hedge laying along the bridle path on the north east corner. There will be a work party on 17th March which will be the last time we can do this. Look out for the notice boards indicating dates in case I can arrange others. Meet at the barn 10am then head up to the north east corner. We do Midland style which basically involves stakes for support and twister binder or heather across the top to hold things securely.

Lastly, please keep your dogs under control and tidy up after them. I found a poo bag chucked into the area where our school children do forest school. Who does such a thing???

VIEW FROM VIEWS

Typical/sods law we have just participated in the "Big Farmland Bird Count" parking ourselves on 3 successive days in a spot that, whenever we walk past, 2 to 3 times a week, there are usually birds of all species flying around (Greenfinches, Yellow Hammers, Jays, woodpeckers, fieldfares, to name but a few) but on the 3 days nothing except the normal birds we see every day, Blue & Great Tits, Dunnock and Chaffinch, and not really many of these. I mention 3 successive days as the first day it was late in the day, usually more bird activity in the morning. The second day dull and, the third day as it was really nice and sunny, we thought this would be the day, but no. The only redeeming factor was that on the third day, a Yellow Hammer decided to perch not 10 yards from us and, stayed for at least 10 minutes just resting or just doing things that a yellow Hammer does. Of course, by siting ourselves by a hedge we missed the many Skylarks and Buntings that, are most found in open fields, of which we seem to have a plenty.

Last month I stated I would not mention the weather well, this month I feel I must, as a lot of happenings/decisions had to be made and, previous decisions altered for the coming season, due to crop failure, as we thought. After a long period of rain over the winter towards the end of January we were beginning to feel the worst was now over and we began to make plans for the spring then, once again on the 6th/7th/& 8th February the heavens opened once again dumping a further 40mm of rain over already saturated land. I have never in all my life known such flooding, our river meadows have been more or less underwater since the beginning of November, save a respite of two periods amounting to about 10 days in all. It seems that the Wheat crop is surviving except in the odd places where it has been under water for a period, the Rape has all but disappeared, and the Barley that we thought had also disappeared, actually looking as if most will recover, so plans we had made may now have to be rethought.

I think the reason that this flooding has been so bad this season, is because, after a wettish late summer followed by at least 100mm more rainfall between November and the end of January, than the same period last season. Our main issue this winter, has been to find the drains that obviously were not running as they should, to cope with all this extra moisture. These were laid by our predecessor in the 60's, to take water from the various springs that are plentiful hear. Anyone who knew dear old Gilbert Pickett will have heard him say Gt Milton was built on springs. One particular area of the farm has been extra wet and, on examination of the above drains it was evident they were not running as they should, were found to be full of matted roots, which would have let some water flow but not this year, in some instances we extracted a sausage of these some meters long. It seems odd as to why these roots get into the drains in this particular area, I think there could be two reasons, one we have planted trees and a hedge over them, two I reckon that during the very dry periods we have had these plants would be searching for moisture and the obvious place is a drain, as drains in other areas don't seem to suffer in the same way.

We are participating in one of the first initiatives to be involved with as a farm cluster member, in conjunction with the "River Thame Conservation Trust", to monitor the river for mink prior to the introduction of the native Vole, who have been forced out of existence by foreign Mink, emanating from the release of the animals from Fur farms many years ago, by activists against the trade and, irresponsible individuals. The fur trade has now been banned.

On the brighter side of things, we learn that Michael Gove has announced that there will be encouragement to build on Greenfield sites, and redundant Offices and shops for housing. Interestingly this initiative is now holding up the planning on a M & S store in London, there is good reason for this as, it seems to me to be a scandalous waste of materials to continue to pull down perfectly good buildings and, throw the debris away, all the carbon used to build etc. Like our own Council in Oxford now want to move the county office and presumably do the same with the existing buildings to be replaced by some other useless buildings that will add to the destruction of our lovely city centre. Another sanctioned expenditure is the electrifying of the buses, a worthy cause, but is it necessary in one hit. They can afford to spend money on these, but not on the upgrading of our "jerry" built schools, or provision of school minibuses to the extent that disabled children cannot access our study centre, when we are expected to provide disabled facilities.

If anyone is interested, it is worth accessing Rick Stein's programme BBC 2 14/2/24 and see the way agriculture may be going.





As you might imagine the issues raised with me week by week are many and varied. Many emails are campaign emails drafted by a particular lobby group for constituents across the county to send to their MP. However a good number of emails are from constituents who have a particular problem that they want to raise. Some of these I can help with others I have to steer elsewhere. Among the issues raised it is not infrequent for people to have concerns around NHS services, which is something that I can sometimes help with. Problems with accessing GPs are not uncommon nor are concerns with accessing NHS dentists.

I was therefore pleased to see recent Government announcements which I believe will help with both of these in due course. The Pharmacy First initiative is very welcome. This is an approach to make better use of the skills of pharmacists whereby they can offer treatment for some common health conditions themselves without the need to visit a GP or have a prescription. Pharmacists will be able to treat conditions including sinusitis, sore throat, earache, infected insect bite, impetigo, shingles, and uncomplicated urinary tract infections in women without the need for patients to see a GP or have a prescription. I have always felt that pharmacists have been undervalued and under used and so am delighted to see this avenue for treatment opening up.

I was also pleased to see the launch of the NHS Dental Recovery Plan. I know that it has not always been easy to access NHS dental services in the constituency and this plan seeks to encourage more dentists to offer treatment on the NHS. As always these things take time to roll out and I look forward to seeing this implemented locally with greater access to dental services available through the NHS.

Another common issue raised with me is the state of our roads. Towards the end of last year the Government announced substantial additional funding for resurfacing road. This money, £8.3 billion, is money redirected from the cancelled Phase 2 of HS2. Oxfordshire will get a total indicative additional funding allocation of £82,340,000. This will be spread over a period of time from 2023/24 to 2033/34, and in reality it will take that sort of time to plan for and resource the repairs needed. The money will be passed to local highways authorities to spend and in order to ensure transparency on the spending the local authorities are required to publish information on their websites on the spending. By mid-March we should see a summary of the plans for the next two years. I will be looking to see a fair allocation to rural areas where I believe the state of the roads is particularly poor and where public transport is most lacking.
