#### NHS Flu and COVID Vaccinations

ollowing one of the warmest summers on record, autumn has arrived and seasonal vaccinations began on 1st October 2025.

Your pharmacy is once again offering NHS Seasonal Flu and COVID Vaccination services to all eligible patients on a walk-in basis at no cost, regardless of where you live. Those who prefer to book ahead can make appointments through the NHS National Booking System using your NHS App.

#### Who is eligible?

- Age 65 and over? Anyone aged 65 and over (Flu). COVID vaccinations only available to those 75 and over or immunosuppressed
- Clinical Risk Groups: Those aged 18 and older with specific clinical conditions as defined by the Green Book
- Pregnant Women: All pregnant women
- Care Home Residents: People living in long-stay residential care homes

- Carers: Individuals receiving carer's allowance or who are the main carer for an older or disabled person
- Household Contacts: Those living with immunocompromised individuals
- Frontline Staff: All frontline health and social care staff

**New this year:** We're also offering nasal vaccines for children.

#### **Supporting the NHS**

Community pharmacies have been asked by the NHS to help improve the uptake of vaccinations. By using our pharmacy service, you're helping to free up valuable GP appointments for other patients who need them.

## Maidstone Museum awarded £75,000 to bring Japanese heritage to life

aidstone Museum has been awarded £75,000 from the Museum Renewal Fund, a UK Government funded initiative administered by Arts Council England to help civic museums build sustainable income streams and strengthen their resilience.

A key focus of the funding will be The Tōkaidō Way, a new touring and temporary exhibition exploring the historic Japanese route that once connected Edo (modern-day Tokyo) to Kyoto. Drawing on the museum's renowned Japanese collection, the exhibition will offer a visually rich and immersive journey through art, culture, and travel in Edoperiod Japan.

In addition to this exciting exhibition, the funding will support the development of a new online system that will bring Maidstone Museum's collection to a global audience. This digital platform will make artefacts accessible to researchers, educators, and the public worldwide, enhancing the museum's reach and relevance in the digital age.

The funding will also contribute to early research into a potential future exhibition about William Alexander, the Maidstoneborn artist known for his depictions of 18th-century China. While still in the exploratory phase, this project aims to better understand Alexander's legacy, his important artworks in the collection and how it might be presented in a future exhibition.



Money will also be put towards more improvements in the museum's "Withdrawing Room", a stunning, woodpanelled space that has been transformed over the past year. Previously dull and underused, it has been given a new lease of life through the installation of events lighting, the stripping of old cabinets, and the addition of new chairs.

Further plans include modernising the museum's facilities to elevate the room hire services, opening the door to more vibrant community events and expanded opportunities for evening functions. It is hoped this action will grow the evening hire offer and host a wider range of events in this revitalised space.

The Museum Renewal Fund is part of a wider £20 million government investment in civic museums across England.



## Introducing the Kentish Stour



he Kentish Stour is the major river catchment of East Kent. Its largest river is the Great Stour, the second longest river in Kent (58 miles), which has its source right here at **Glebe Pond** in Lenham, which is owned and managed by Lenham Meadows Trust. The river flows out to sea at Pegwell Bay. The catchment encompasses many other watercourses from the smallest streams to major tributaries like the East Stour.

The **Kentish Stour** is an important river system, of great value to human and natural communities alike. It supplies water for agriculture and industry, provides drainage, recreation and wildlife habitat. Some of its rivers are chalk streams of global significance. Some flow through areas of international importance for conservation. Most pass through settlements; loved and celebrated in some places, flowing underground and forgotten in others. They are part of the

history and folklore of this part of Kent and have powered industries in the past.

The Kentish Stour Countryside
Partnership is at the forefront of efforts
to improve rivers in the catchment,
working together with a range of other
bodies, with landowners and the
community.

#### **Upper and Middle Great Stour**

The Great Stour starts its journey as a number of small springs near the village of Lenham. From here it travels in a roughly south-easterly direction. Despite flowing over the rocks of the Greensand Belt, it has many of the characteristics and species of a chalk stream.

The river is rural and the channel is quite natural in many parts and good for wildlife, although surrounding agriculture does impact on water quality. It flows through attractive settlements like Little Chart, and through scenic Godinton

Park. It then enters its first major town – Ashford – running through the Ashford Green Corridor. It changes direction, now heading north-east, before being joined by a major tributary, the East Stour.

The Great Stour leaves Ashford then flows into a breach in the North Downs called the Wye Gap. From this point, it becomes a true chalk stream, flowing through the Downs in a wide valley. Beautiful riverside spots include Olantigh Park, Godmersham, and Chilham Mill. Running past Chartham and several flooded gravel workings, the Great Stour flows into the historic cathedral city of Canterbury, passing Hambrook Marshes and the Westgate Parks on the way.

#### **Lower Stour**

Upon leaving Canterbury the river flows on to Fordwich, Britain's smallest town, where it becomes tidal. It then enters the Lower Stour, a marshland landscape where intensive agriculture contrasts with important wildlife areas. At Stodmarsh National Nature Reserve, superb wetland habitats support internationally important communities of birds, plants and invertebrates. The Lower Stour as a whole

is a stronghold for the declining water vole and has seen the return of otters and beavers.

At Pluck's Gutter, the Great Stour is joined by the Little Stour, and becomes the Stour. From here it flows across a landscape that was once the sea – the Wantsum Channel separated Kent from the Isle of Thanet during the Roman and Early Medieval period. Beyond Sandwich, the Stour is near the end of its journey, and what a finale! Here the river and its associated habitats are protected as part of much larger conservation areas. The bird life is second to none and diverse habitats support a rich variety of plants and insects. At Pegwell Bay, the Stour finally completes its journey to the sea.

Ithough 2025 has not seen us fund any significant renovations to the church building, we have consolidated funds ahead of major repair works planned to the tower roof. September saw us back in the Tithe Barn for the Annual Village Barn Dance with dancers young and old enjoying the music of Whirling Skirmish; the Barn Dance is always such a fun evening and we're pleased to say that our profit was £1,300 on the night.

We have, as always, been assisted throughout the year by the generosity of the wonderful Lenham community, businesses and individuals. We're very grateful for the donations, the support and attendance at events, all of which have helped us raise funds to carry out renovations to the church building. I'd like to particularly thank The Lenham Focus for their generous donation towards the cost of the band at the Barn Dance and Kent Loves... for selling guiz and Barn Dance tickets for us.

The Friends of St Mary's has now been in existence for 13 years and we have achieved so much as we work to preserve the ancient church building. The Friends continues to grow and to keep up with the times. We now have 145 members, 321 Facebook followers, an active mailing list and a popular website. The funds we raise are used solely to pay for the repair and renovation of the building and never for the day to day running costs of the church.

We look forward to a positive year ahead thanks to support from our members and the Lenham community, the replacement of the lead on the tower roof will see us complete another vital repair to the wonderful and important building that is St. Mary's, Lenham. 



# LIVERTON part 2

erhaps you remember that we discovered a long closed, second public house in Liverton? On this 'stroll' through Lefferton (Liverton) papers we also encountered John Baker. In 1469 he lived

with his wife Isabella and his 5 children in a hall house. It was the time before the reformation and he was a good catholic man leaving some money for the poor of Lenham. He wanted to be buried in Lenham churchyard and candles to be lit at the 'shrine' of St. Nicholas, St. Catherine, Mary and the altar of the Holy Cross at St. Mary's in Lenham.

In his will¹ he made sure that his wife, Isabella, could stay in their marital home, in one upstairs room to one side of the hall and that she had use of the hall and front door for her coming and goings, as well as the use of the kitchen. His oldest son inherited the estate in Liverton. However, there were two fields set aside to produce income for the daughters. Another son inherited land in Frinsted and the youngest inherited land in the heath.

John Baker was aware how important it is to bring produce to the market quickly because he left also money for the upkeep



of the road between Lenham and Liverton.

The will of 1469 prompted our search for Hall Houses on Liverton Hill. We don't know whether there were more, but there are two still standing. One is Churchill Cottage, which

is situated at one end of the hamlet.

The other building is Mansion Farmhouse, which was the centre of farming on Liverton Hill, at least in recent history. The farm was later part of the Chilston Estate<sup>2</sup>. Sale details<sup>3</sup> from 1912 show the extent of the farm comprising a barn, an oast house and several other outbuildings. In 1987 the barn, the oast and a building plot, on which had been three derelict labourers' cottages, were given planning permission for conversion to domestic use.

Of course, we cannot be certain that John Baker lived in Mansion Farmhouse, but it was the most likely and therefore prompted a visit by the Historic Buildings Group of the Kent Archaeological Society, which resulted in a detailed report about the building and its interesting features.

Unusually for a non-religious building of this period, the frame of the entrance





door is decorated with a foliate head, also known as a 'Green Man'.

Near Liverton is the conservation area of Elmstone Hole, which boasts a spectacular setting for another hall house: Elmstone Hole Farm. There are the remains of a building which could easily be an old chapel. Some of the

members of the Elmstone family were rectors in Boughton Malherbe and one of them was churchwarden in Lenham in 1622. Did the door frame with the Green Man come from this possible chapel? A mystery still to explore<sup>4</sup>.





### What is a Will?

A Will is a legal document that appoints one or more Executor to distribute your Estate based on your wishes,

### Why should I write a Will?

There are a number of benefits to writing a Will, not only to you but also to those who will be dealing with your Estate when you pass away.



### Control of Assets

Writing a Will allows for you to have control over how your assets, bank accounts, shares and property, are distributed when you pass away. For instance, if you would like to include a provision for a family member to continue living in your house when you pass a 'Right of Residency' clause can be included – giving not only you, but your family peace of mind.

### Avoiding the laws of Intestacy

Intestacy laws set out who deals with the distribution of the Estate and who the Estate is 'given to.' This can result in many

different issues, especially if the person who has passed away had no immediate family or did not get on with their family. By not having a Will in place it is possible that your assets will end up with relatives that you would not wish to give anything too.

### Ease the burden on your family

As mentioned above a Will appoints one or more Executor who deals with the Estate. This allows you to appoint people who you know will be capable of doing so and also appoint people who you trust and know will execute your wishes. It is also possible to appoint Solicitors as Executors

within your Will. This would take the pressure off of family members, at an already difficult time, and provide reassurance that everything will be done correctly.

### Can Wills be changed?

A Will can be updated as often as you would like. This could involve adding in gifts for children or grandchildren or changing Executors if needed. A Will is a very flexible document and can be customed to ensure your wishes are carried out and those who you would like to care for are.

# Recipe of the Month Christmas Star Biscuits

This is a great recipe for a children's baking day. The biscuits make great tree decorations.

### Ingredients:

100g butter, softened
100g castor sugar
1tsp vanilla extract
1 large egg
200g plain flour (extra for dusting)
½ tsp baking powder
Cake gold glitter spray
Chocolate for melting
Sea salt, pinch

### Method:

Pre-heat the oven to 160c, gas mark 3.
Use a large baking tray, lined with parchment.
Using an electric whisk, cream the butter and sugar together in a large bowl until pale. Add the vanilla extract and the egg, whisking until well mixed. Stir in the flour and baking powder with a generous pinch of sea salt. Wrap and chill for about 30 minutes.

Roll out the dough to the same size as the parchment to about 0.5cm thick, dust with more



flour if needed. Cut out the stars – as many as possible – use up the trimmings, using another baking sheet, if necessary.

Bake for 12-14 minutes until starting to turn golden at the edges. Remove and leave to cool completely on a wire rack. Using gold glitter decorate the stars or melt chocolate and pipe over the biscuits.

Note: If using as tree decorations pierce a 3mm hole near the top of each star before baking and use thread to hang them. These cannot be eaten once they've been on the tree.

I remember that resolution but inevitably too late. I know I'm not the only one.

Small Business Saturday is a good chance to try to make this year different. It's the first Saturday in December, and the aim is to rally the community around the small businesses that help make our local economy tick. In practice, the biggest difference we can all make for our local shops is to buy things in them.

This year it is more important than ever to back our small businesses as they are going through tough times. Over the last 18 months many have seen their business rates double and been hard hit by the rise in employer national insurance (the 'jobs tax'). the Jasmin Vardimon Dance Theatre Company. I was fortunate enough to see their performance of "Alice". It was so powerful that afterwards, my wife and I were unable to speak—for fear that doing so would reduce us to tears. Later, in the café, I saw Jasmin herself. I still could not speak, but I thought I might catch her eye and bow in gratitude... I couldn't even manage that. The gesture alone would have reduced me to a sobbing wreck.

And although I was in a space where many would have understood my reaction and wouldn't have judged me, I still couldn't allow myself to let go of the fear of showing emotion. I couldn't free myself from that prison.

Looking back, I asked myself: Why was I so overwhelmed? The answer is painfully clear. I've kept my emotions locked away for so long that when something finally breached the gates, there was a flood waiting. Can I truly say that I am free, afraid to show – even, and especially – my strongest positive emotions? I urge you to ask yourself the same question.

Finally, I'd like to offer a small piece of advice, which I'm beginning to practise myself, alongside the words of the great minds quoted throughout this article: "With emotions, learn from the negative and be driven forth by the positive – this will set you free."

# New & Trending Scams to Watch Out For

	•	
Scam Type	What It Is / How It Works	Why It's Dangerous / What Makes It Novel
Pig-butchering / romance-investment hybrid	The scammer builds a long-term "relationship," gains trust, and then persuades the victim to invest (often in crypto or a fake fund). Eventually the scammer vanishes with the money.	Because of emotional connection, victims may invest large sums. The scam may also have multiple phases, e.g. pretending to "help recover" lost funds later.
Fake regulator impersonation	Scammers pretend to be the FCA (Financial Conduct Authority) or other regulatory bodies, claiming you owe money, are subject to legal actions, or to help "recover lost funds."	Because many people trust official- sounding institutions, scammers exploit that. In 2025, nearly 5,000 fake FCA scams were reported in the UK in just the first half of the year.
Remote purchase / OTP passcode fraud	Scammers trick people into giving one-time pass-codes (OTPs) or login codes, which then allow them to use your account or make purchases.	This is rising sharply. UK Finance reports this kind of fraud reached it's highest-ever levels, often via social engineering.
Fake parcel / delivery notification texts ("smishing")	You receive a text saying there's a "problem with your parcel" or a "cost to deliver," with a link to click or pay.	This is one of the fastest-growing scams. Many people fall for it because deliveries and parcels are common, so it seems plausible.
Al voice / deepfake impersonation / cloned voices	Scammers use AI to replicate someone's voice (or appearance) — e.g. your child, grandchild, or a trusted authority — and call/video-call to ask for money or sensitive info.	Because the voice sounds "real," many victims believe the call is genuine and comply. This is especially dangerous for older adults.
Cloned / impersonated websites & services	Fraudsters copy a legitimate website (bank, investment platform, etc.) with small tweaks (URL changes, misspellings) to trick users into inputting credentials or making payments.	These cloned sites look very convincing. Many people miss small differences in URLs or SSL certificates.
Scam "recovery services"	After someone has been scammed, fraudsters pose as "recover your money" agents or regulators who will help—but ask for advance fees.	Victims already in distress may accept these offers hoping to recover money, and then lose more.
Fake travel / booking sites / deals	Fraudsters set up convincing fake websites for hotels, tours, rentals, flights, etc. You pay for a "booking" which either doesn't exist or is substandard.	With AI and better graphics, these sites are becoming more persuasive. Many people assume they're genuine.
Social engineering / helpdesk attacks in	Hackers impersonate staff, managers, or support personnel to trick you into

# The season of the fungi

Il through the autumn months you may have noticed in the gardens, under trees or in the woods a large number of different mushrooms and toadstools making an appearance. What is the difference then? Mushrooms can be described as a fungal growth that takes the shape of a domed cap with gills underneath and is supported by a stem. On the other hand, a toadstool is the fruiting body of a fungus that bears spores and usually takes the shape of a round cap on a stem, often one that is perceived to be poisonous or inedible.





### Where to find them?

A mushroom typically grows in lawns or open paddocks (like this parasol mushroom in the picture) rather than on shrubs and under trees like a toadstool. You'll find most types of toadstools growing above scraps of wood or lumber and dead tree roots.

# So many different fungi

There are roughly 15,000 different types of mushrooms and toadstools in the UK. Fungi are a huge and fascinating kingdom and they live on land, in the water, in the air and even in and on plants and animals. They vary widely in size and form, from the microscopically small to



the largest organisms on Earth (at several square miles large).

# **Appearance**

The outside of a mushroom cap is typically smooth and white or brown. Toadstools have a textured cap that's usually red and is filled with raised scales that are white or yellow. Mushrooms have gills in the underside of the cap, whereas toadstools have gills that can be found on the stem coupled with a bulbous base. Mushrooms and toadstools have even made it into myth and legend like this Fly agaric, pictured, which looks like the house of a fairy or elf.



# Myths and legends

In British folklore, mushrooms and toadstools appear in some of the earliest stories and superstitions. Records from medieval texts describe fairy rings as places where the Good Folk danced and writers have linked the red-capped

fly agaric with enchantment and danger.

One of the most famous images tied to fungi is the fairy ring. People believed these perfect circles of mushrooms marked places where fairies had danced under the moonlight. To step inside was thought to be dangerous, for it might whisk you away into the 'Otherworld'. While we now know fairy rings are formed by the growth pattern of certain fungi, the sense of magic lingers. Next time you come across one, it is hard not to feel a tingle of ancient enchantment. However I can tell you with

certainty that stepping inside a fairy ring like the one pictured, does NOT transport you to the fairy realm.

# What do they do and what are the gills on the underneath for?

So what do fungi do?
One of the most vital
roles of fungi in nature
is decomposition. Along
with bacteria, fungi are
the great recyclers.
Without them, the world
would be buried under
dead wood and fallen
leaves. They break all



the dead bits down and then release the nutrients back into the ground. And fungi do not reproduce like plants and flowers; they don't have seeds, but release spores that are then spread around.

The gills on a mushroom are the thin, papery structures located on the underside of the cap. Their main function is to dramatically increase the surface area available for the production and dispersal of spores.

# Not only on the ground or fallen trees

Sometimes you will see a tough, woody,

shelf-like type of fungus that is attached to the side of a tree, usually very low down. They are different from normal fungi as they have pores on their underside instead of gills. While they can look amazing they do have a dark side though. They can play a role in the decay and rot of the heartwood of trees.

The one shown in the picture (left) is known as Turkey Tail, because of its shape and colouring that resembles a turkey's tail.



# Heathlands 'Public Consultation' on the draft Supplementary Planning Documents



aidstone Borough Council is inviting residents, businesses, and stakeholders to take part in shaping the future of two major developments that aim to deliver a significant proportion of affordable homes across the district.

The Council says: 'Public consultations began on Monday 3 November 2025 for six weeks and will close at 23:59 on Monday 15 December 2025. During this period, the draft documents and supporting materials will be available on the council's website and at libraries and council offices throughout the borough. The consultation is to gather feedback on the draft Supplementary Planning Documents (SPDs) for Heathlands Garden Settlement and Lidsing Garden Community.'

'These documents set out the vision and framework for creating sustainable and inclusive communities that meet local housing and infrastructure needs while protecting the borough's character and environment. The allocation of these sites for development has already been agreed through the Local Plan Review (LPR). The designation cannot be changed and the purpose of this consultation is to gather people's views on the content of the SPDs, which, together with the LPR, will form the planning framework for future planning applications.'

'The Heathlands Garden Settlement is proposed for development between Lenham and Charing and could deliver up to 5,000 homes, with 40% designated as affordable housing. The plans also include a new railway station, healthcare and education facilities, and a country park.'

'Residents are encouraged to read the proposals and share their views via the consultation platform at maidstone.oc2. uk, by email to Idf@maidstone.gov.uk, or by post to Strategic Planning, Maidstone Borough Council, Maidstone House, King Street. ME15 6JQ.'


