

Bromley Indoor Bowling Club



- **Bromley Outdoor Indoor Clubs' League**

- **Teams**

- For the league, all outdoor clubs are invited to put in two teams of 3 players.
- No player may play for more than one Club in the league during the season.

- **Cost and timings**

- Each player will pay a green fee each time they play and the Club they represent will be liable for all green fees for their match if they fail to turn up or have not given the BIBC Reception at least 24 hours notice
- The schedule of play will be issued before the start of the season
- All games are expected to be of a maximum of 2hrs 30mins duration (1 session)

- **Rules**

- Teams will play according to the published league schedule – during the season each team will play every other team at least twice. All teams will play each week unless there is an uneven number of Clubs in the League.
- All games will be as many ends or 2hrs 30mins maximum duration. The last jack must be delivered and the first bowl left the player's hand 10 minutes before the session ends as signified by the bell ringing.
- No trial ends but only one shot can be scored on each of the first two ends.
- Dead end – jack is hit out of the rink – the jack be placed on the nearest of the two side spots either side of the "T". If the spot is covered by another bowl the jack will be placed directly behind the spot as close to the bowl without touching any bowl.
- No visits to the head by skips are permitted.
- Teams failing to turn up with a full team will be penalised as below.
- Teams are asked to make every effort to ensure a full team is available each week. If this is not possible a team can play with 2 players using 4 bowls each and their score is reduced by 33% (rounded down to the nearest shot). Their opposition can choose which one of their players uses only 2 bowls.
- Failure to turn up or to complete a game will result in the team being deducted 6 match points and the opposing team will get 6 match points-
- All participating clubs warrant that all players selected to play in the BOIL are FULL paid up members of the outdoor club for which they are playing and played or were eligible to play for that outdoor club in the previous outdoor season.

In the event that a player or players are found not to be members of that outdoor club then the Club involved will be penalised as for failure to turn up. This will be for the first offence. Should the offence be repeated by the same club then that Club will be removed from the League and not allowed to reapply for at least one season.

- Any disputes must be discussed with the BOIL league administrator who has the final word. These rules, EIBA rules and any agreed "local rules" will be used to resolve any disputes.
- Two points are awarded for a win and one point for a draw per team. Plus 2 points for the overall win when the scores are added together or 1 point each if the total scores are tied.
- Scorecards must state the full names of all players, be completed, signed by the skips and placed in the league box provided or handed to the league administrator.
- The Club with the most points at the end of the competition will be the winners. If teams have the same points, the following will be considered until a winner is found - shot difference, then shots scored, then results between the teams, then the number of ends won during the season.
- The winning Club will be presented with the BOIL Trophy which will then be engraved and then returned to BIBC for safekeeping.
