

The Malthouse well water level has dropped 1.94 metres (approximately 6ft 4ins) since last month, but it is still fractionally higher than this time last year. Looking at levels over the last 10 years for the beginning of August, this month's reading just about falls within the normal range for this time of year.



FARMING NEWS

This year's harvest commenced 14th July, ten days earlier than in 2013! So far we have been blessed with some perfect sunshine and heat and this has been a great benefit to us since, as you will all have noticed, we have barely used the drier for, firstly, the Winter Barley and, secondly, the Winter Oilseed Rape.

The yields for the Winter Barley were very satisfactory but the Oilseed Rape was disappointing as the little black seeds were smaller than expected. We now have a few days

to catch up with some jobs before starting on the Winter Wheat and Spring Barley harvest.

Alongside the harvest we are also making some hay to the north of the village alongside Bury Lane and hopefully the weather will hold until this is baled. The beef cattle are loving the sunshine and are very content grazing their fields and fattening nicely.

Two batches of fat lambs have departed catching the better, earlier market price and the remainder have now been weaned to allow their mothers some recovery time before October when the rams are reintroduced!

NATURE NOTES

You don't have to travel far to enjoy the wildlife of the area, both the following observations were made whilst gardening.

Tiger in the garden - a scarlet tiger moth that is!

A day flying moth with black fore wings blotched with white and yellow. The hind wings are bright red, spotted with black, the colours of a flamenco dancers dress, these are hidden beneath the fore wings while at rest. On taking flight this large moth explodes into colour which may give potential predators a fright? It also provides a warning that this insect may be poisonous? The closely related garden tiger moth certainly is, it's body fluids containing a neurotoxin. The scarlet tiger is normally found in damp places such as river banks and marshes. The centre of activity in West Ilsley seems to be at the bottom of the track to the summer gallops, aptly known as Water Gap Lane. For pictures, click

Perhaps this was one of the birds that nest on the, soon to be demolished, cooling towers at Didcot Power Station? Pity Fred Dibnah is still not with us, he would have enjoyed knocking those down. 

note from the PC minutes

At the July Parish Council meeting the proposed new procedure for allocating any precept money to village committees was underway and three applications had been received: All Saints Church, Village Hall and WI Website. Each was reviewed in turn.

All Saints up to £6100 to replenish reserves after repairing the church roof plasterwork.

Village Hall £5000 to match grant received and to be used for upgrading heating, insulating and lighting. Decoration was underway and self funded.

WI Website £62 for annual domain name registration and site hosting fee.

A few further details were requested. The website is likely to be funded by WIN, but all three will be summarized* in WIN for opportunities for queries and comments from the village followed by a Parish Council funding allocation/decision at the September PC meeting.

I currently host and maintain the site and purchase the domain name on an annual basis (and am more than to be happy to continue this in its current form) but for the above proposal I recommend hosting separately and to start considering the site as a separate entity.
