Volunteers for Broseley Library

The Town Council is looking for volunteers to run two regular activities at Broseley Library: Rhyme Time and Time to Listen.

Rhyme Time sessions are for children under 5 and their parents/carers. The sessions last around 30 minutes and include stories, songs and rhymes. Appropriate resources are provided. The sessions are currently held monthly on Thursday mornings but time and frequency may be flexible.

Time to Listen is an opportunity for adults to come and listen to stories and poems read aloud in an informal and friendly atmosphere. The sessions have a theme

(e.g. music and song, childhood) and participants are encouraged to bring along their own literary choices to share with others. The volunteer leading the session would need to select suitable material in advance. Sessions last for one hour and have previously been held monthly.

Support and guidance would be provided for volunteers.

Reporting Anti-Social Behaviour

Anti-social behaviour is a fundamentally local issue that can have an extremely negative impact on people's quality of life. It can include graffiti and vandalism, playing loud music in the early hours of the morning, and offensive and threatening behaviour.

Shropshire Council and its partners take community safety concerns very seriously and really want to encourage people to report anti-social behaviour when it occurs. Reports of Anti-Social Behaviour can be made via the single reporting line on **0345 678 9020.** All calls are treated sensitively. Anti-social behaviour can be reported confidentially but in some cases details are needed in order to respond to the anti-social behaviour being reported and to provide support to the victim.

If you or someone else is at risk or a crime has being committed please call the police on 101, in the event of an emergency call 999.
