April is National Bowel Cancer Awareness month and much work is being undertaken within the community and hospital to raise public awareness of risk factors, symptoms and of the bowel cancerscreening programme. Plans will centre on attending community events and highlighting these issues. Several members of the Support Group have kindly offered to be involved and their help will be invaluable. A training day is being arranged with Stephanie Futcher from NHS Sheffield to help guide our members on what is expected of them and how we can support them in turn. In addition to these events, articles will appear in the local press and on radio.

To coincide with April, a health promotion campaign will also be launched with

posters on buses and beer mats in pubs and clubs encouraging members of the public to partake in the bowel cancer-This will focus on more deprived areas of Sheffield where participation is at lower levels than hoped.

We should all continue to encourage our friends and families to be aware of symptoms and participate in screening if given the chance.

Persistent symptoms of more than 6 weeks duration, which should be checked by your GP, are:

- Bleeding from the rectum (bottom)
- Change in bowel habit
- Pain in the abdomen
- Unplanned weight loss

Our last talk was given by Margaret Etches when she described the work of the Cavendish Centre, which offers supportive care to cancer patients and their carers. The type of activities she described were counselling, relaxation, acupuncture, aromatherapy etc. They have seen an increase of 70% in clients attending the centre in the last 2 years.

She also explained the difficulty of obtaining finan-

cial support, which largely

relies on donations.
