It's been a busy few weeks outdoors, with lots happening quietly in the background. Some projects are now complete, and there's plenty more still to come.

You may also notice a few slower responses from the Parish Council just now. Our Parish Clerk is currently on compassionate leave after a particularly difficult spell, and we're very grateful for your patience and understanding while she takes some much-needed time out.

Moulsford's Green Spaces - Autumn Update

Down by the river

The biggest change you'll notice is along the Thames Path, just south of the Beetle and Wedge. After a long wait, the repair work is finally complete - and what a difference it makes! Huge thanks to the Thames Path Partnership

and Smallwoods teams for restoring this much-loved walk. The new surfacing is designed to withstand occasional flooding, though running water along the path can still cause erosion. However, the path is being regularly monitored, so any signs of damage can be addressed to prevent further deterioration.

At the recreation ground

The Pavilion will soon have a new feature tree. We previously tried two oaks, but neither survived. This time, we're selecting a species that is more resilient and low-maintenance - one we hope will thrive and become a lasting part of the scenery for generations to come.

Our notice board by the car park entrance is also scheduled for refurbishment, which should be completed in the next couple of months.

On the football pitch, you might notice the goalposts have been moved slightly. The pitch is now a little longer and over to one side a few paces, so the previously muddy areas should have a chance to

previously muddy areas should have a chance to recover. We've also tidied the long grass and scarified the area, which should help wildflowers spread more strongly next spring. Hedge-cutting around the Pavilion car park is booked for Saturday, 27th Sep.



Playground spruce-up

Good news for younger villagers: the playground is

due a bit more TLC. At the end of September, the surfacing under both swing sets will be replaced, and the wooden bridge on the multi-gym is being repaired. Hopefully, that means plenty more fun - and fewer muddy knees - this autumn.

A special note

Finally, a lovely surprise: one of our school-aged villagers left a thoughtful letter anonymously at the Pavilion. Among other suggestions, they proposed a bigger bus shelter. We enjoyed pinning our reply to the fence post by the pony field, as requested! The shelter idea will be discussed at the next Parish Council meeting.





Dear Friends,

Share a little light this Halloween

Some parents aren't sure quite what to feel about Hallowe'en – is it just harmless fun, or are there aspects of it that don't fit in with how we want to see the world?

A child's christening service is very honest about the reality of good and evil, and Hallowe'en can be a good time to talk about those things and how the love of Jesus can be a 'Light in the darkness' for everyone.

If you'd like to mark Hallowe'en, these are some ideas that will bless others as well as being fun too.

What's happening in church? There is a 'Light Party' with fun activities for children and young people at **St Mary's Church Cholsey on 31st, October 4-6pm** which includes food.

There is Streets of Light, https://www.streetsoflight.co.uk/, whereby we encourage people to decorate their windows with messages of hope and love and light.

All these events are a lovely way to focus on all that's life-giving and positive around All Hallows.

St Mary's Church Cholsey also has a special service for **All Souls Day** – a time when we remember our loved ones who have died, which is on **Sunday, 2nd November 3-4pm**.

There will be an opportunity to go and light a candle to remember someone.

Carve a pumpkin. Did you know that gargoyles (the scary looking faces carved in stone on churches) were originally made in medieval times to scare away evil spirits? The pumpkins with scary faces carved into them at Hallowe'en are a bit like that.

But Christians believe that you can't fight evil with evil – you can only fight evil with good, and that good will always win in the end. So why not see if you can carve a friendly looking pumpkin this year, as a sign that you and your family are going to be a force for good this Hallowe'en?

You can do the same with Hallowe'en costumes. Superheroes make a great, positive alternative to scary witches and ghosts.

Say a goodnight prayer. Even if you've steered clear of scary costumes, and even if your child has loved the evening, it can be reassuring to have a goodnight prayer that reminds them that love, and light, and good, are always going to be stronger than fear and evil.

The ancient service of Compline (Night Prayer) has been used as this reminder for centuries, and many of its prayers are still well known today: 'Visit this place, O Lord, we pray and drive far from it all snares of the enemy; let Your holy angels dwell with us to preserve us in peace; and let Your blessing be upon us always, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.'

Or, in a simpler children's version: 'Be with us, Lord, and take away all fear, may your angels protect us and give us peace. And bless us always. Amen.' You can use these lovely prayers any time when you need a reminder that God is with you – especially at the end of a difficult day, or when something sad has happened, or when your family is worried about something.

You would also be welcome to come to church to say a prayer St John the Baptist Moulsford is open during the day or you are welcome join us in prayer, at our Sunday services at 9am, St John the Baptist Moulsford.

Is it really your bank calling?

Sadly we know that one of the most common crimes that we can all be vulnerable to is fraud. It can take many forms but impersonation of your bank, a government agency or even the police is a tactic that many criminals will use.

If you receive a suspicious call, independently contact your bank or the relevant agency using an official telephone number – do not use numbers given to you by the cold caller. But who has the time to dig out and verify a number for your bank?

That's why the 159 service was created. If you get a call from someone claiming to be your bank you can simply call 159 and you'll be put through to an automated service which can put you through directly. The system is supported by most of the major banks.

The idea is to give one trusted number that the public know they can call safely in order to be put through directly to their bank.

In some cases however, fraudsters will try to keep the line open, so that when you call back, you're actually talking to the fraudsters again.

The best way to avoid that is to wait for 15 minutes, to ensure the line is clear, or call from another phone if you have one available. Then simply call 159 to be put through directly to your bank.

NEVER disclose any personal or sensitive information over the telephone.

Whilst fraud is one of the biggest risks to us all from criminals it is also one of the most easily prevented crimes. A dose of healthy scepticism goes a long way, and always be cautious with unsolicited calls, emails and texts.

If in doubt, take a moment, do not be pressured into sharing information or handing over money. Check with someone else if you're suspicious.



Another month, and another story about village history. We are so fortunate to have the mighty Thames River flowing past us on its way to London. The river has been home to various wildlife for centuries. Swans, geese, mallards, herons, and many others find the riverbank at Moulsford a haven. Raise a glass to the boats passing by.

Fishing



Moulsford's envious position on the Thames River leads to many activities. In the past, fishing was a popular pastime as shown in this 1890's photo. While the cows grazed, an angler might catch pike, bream, chub, roach or perch. Two of these species were so popular that a pub in South Stoke across the river was named in their honour.

Sadly, the Perch and Pike is now closed 'temporarily'. But good fortune smiles – the Beetle runs a ferry to bring the villagers to Moulsford should they desire a pie and a pint or two.

Today's fisherman can sit on a comfortable bench, listen to his favourite music through earphones so as not to scare the fish, drink a pint, and watch the river life pass by. (Photo taken 01/09/2025). No messy fish to unhook, no smelly bait pot, no media services clamouring for your attention.



Boating

Many boats pass us every day, with their passengers raising a salute to those of us raising a glass or two— All adhering to the rule of maximum speed of 8 kph (just over 4 knots). This helps preserve the embankment from erosion caused by a boat's wake. A boat trip from London would take quite a while!




Oxford rowing teams once practiced here. This is a photo from 1930, showing an 8 + racing shell. We can still enjoy rowing from spectator seats at our riverbank, as this more modern photo shows. The style of clothing may have changed, but the boats look pretty much the same.

The Beetle and Wedge Hotel 'way back when' rented boats for a few bob. Ferries carrying agricultural and construction materials from the far shore were the main transport before bridges were built. Note the number of Ferry Lanes in our area – each indicating a long ago ferry landing. And of course, 'Three Men in a Boat' drifted by but Jerome K. Jerome forgot to mention Moulsford.

New forms of wet enjoyment include kayaking, paddle boarding, canoes, but no inner tubes have been seen - another thing of the past. No cruise ships reported so far. Be thankful.



The Ferry



The Beetle and Wedge Inn operated a ferry service from South Stoke to Moulsford for many years and the Boat House recently restarted a service for passengers. The hotel name was enumerated in 1851 and the building dates back before 1850 as a trading inn. A pub, possibly the Horse and Groom, from the early 1800's, was at the landing and likely operated by Mark and James Morrell.

This photo is dated 1910 and several old photos show much the same scene from at least 1870. Ferries were very important to farmers and crop dealers on the Berkshire side of the river to move produce to market.

The last ferrywoman retired in 1967. By then, the ferry was not needed for heavy cargo and a small punt was used.



Swan Upping

You may have missed the July 2025 pageant – several folks added photos to our Moulsford Facebook page. The Vintners and Dyers Livery Companies have been counting swans since the 12th century for the Crown.
