PARISH COUNCIL UPDATE

With many changes underway it seemed a good time to update you on some of the things happening in your Parish Council. My name is Neil Bloomfield and I joined the Parish Council as Clerk at the end of May. Originally from the village I have returned to the area after 30 or so years away.

For the first time since its creation in 1894, the Parish Council is to have a fixed base with an office open to the public. The Council's new home will be Unit 7 North Street Workshops. The Parish Council are extremely grateful to the Duchy of Cornwall who have provided this space rent free for two years. During this period council will assess the effectiveness of having its own office space before it makes a final decision in 2025. We hope to get the keys by 1st October and we will publish opening times as soon as we can.

The Parish Council recently commissioned an independent audit of council spending which revealed some failures and areas for improvement. As a result, a full review of policies, procedures and a training program will ensure the Council is prepared for anything going forward. Council business of course continues with ongoing projects and new ones to come.

AROUND THE VILLAGE

EMERGENCY VEHICLE ACCESS

We would like to raise an issue about emergency vehicle access in Stoke sub Hamdon. An ambulance was attending an emergency at end of Castle Street (Pound Lane) recently. The ambulance got to the emergency, but when the patient needed blue-lighting to Yeovil Hospital the ambulance struggled. It had to reverse down Castle Street because cars had parked on both sides of Bonnies Lane and it was impossible to pass. On this occasion the time lost probably did not make a difference to the outcome, but on another occasion that might not be the case. We appreciate that everyone needs to park their cars and that there are never enough spaces, however when parking your vehicle here or in the rest of the village, please think about the possibility that an emergency vehicle might have to pass through. Sometimes minutes are critical to saving someone's life or someone's house in a fire.

BIGGER, BETTER POO BINS

The Council is reviewing dog poo bins in the village. We are looking at dual litter/poo bins which are much larger in size. The current red bins are often too small, and the new larger bins would be collected by a specially equipped side lift vehicle from Somerset Council.



HAMDON YOUTH AND FAMILY CENTRE

The restoration of the Parish Council owned Hamdon Youth and Family Centre on West Street continues. Currently the side and rear elevation windows on this Grade 2 listed building are being restored by a local company. If you run or are planning to setup any youth group activity and need a venue contact the centre as they might be able to assist.

COMMUNITY ASSETS



The Parish Council is aware of concerns that the Fleur De Lis could become something other than a much-loved local pub and has commenced the process of registering the Fleur as an Asset of

Community Value. If granted it would give 6 months breathing space for interested groups to put a bid together should the site be put up for sale.

IMPROVING FACILITIES

Stonehill is getting a new Parish notice board near to the entrance and work is underway to carry out improvements and repairs to the children's play area. A big thank you to the Sports & Rec trust who are assisting with this project.
