SHAPE has made great

progress in the last year and, whilst there are a few procedural tasks still to complete and we await the outcome of our grant applications, turning our plans into reality now comes down to the money!

We launched our big Fundraising Appeal last month (with many thanks to the Village Voice distribution team for delivering all those envelopes). We are extremely grateful to all of those kind and generous people who have already responded – though with only 16 donations out of the 400+ household in the village, we hope that there are more to come.

It would be wonderful if all those in the village who would like the project to happen would consider making a contribution. Whether you have children (or grandchildren) who will enjoy the new play areas, or if you would like to support this community initiative, your support is invaluable. Every bit counts and the more we can raise locally, the more exciting our new play areas will be.

The donations we have received so far, and the events held this year, mean that we are now nearly halfway towards our local fund-raising target of £20,000. Everything is looking positive and if we are able to raise the necessary funds, we may even be able to develop the sites in the autumn.

We have been asked several times about what would be done with donations if the play areas never actually get developed, and we would like to offer potential donors some reassurance. All donations are being paid into the SHAPE bank account - this is entirely separate to the Parish Council's account (though transfers will be made to facilitate invoice payments and allow VAT to be reclaimed). The funds held by SHAPE will only be used for the play areas project (this does include potential highways work to provide safe pedestrian access). We have got further with the project than ever before and even in the event that we receive no grant funding, we should still have sufficient funds to purchase some play equipment which can then be added to over time. If for some unforeseen reason, SHAPE's plans for the play areas cannot proceed in any form, all donors will be consulted on what happens to the money they gave.

The installation of the Gigaclear ultrafast fibre-optic broadband network is nearing completion with many customers now connected and enjoying the delights of a 21st Century broadband in Stanton Harcourt and Sutton. As with any new infrastructure project there have been a few delays and issues to overcome and also some important learnings.

Gigaclear have expressed regret that they were not clearer in advising the residents in Sutton that they formed what was in effect a second phase of the network build and that their go live would take a little longer. In the 6 weeks since the network first went live Gigaclear's approved installers Boxcom have connected 98 customers to the network. Boxcom were somewhat overwhelmed at one point and apologise for the struggle that some customers had in making contact during that period. With the majority of customers now online Boxcom are working hard to complete the process yet they still have a list of 21 remaining customers who either have not been able to be contacted or have agreed dates in the near future. If a customer is still not live and to date failed in making an appointment with Boxcom then can they please make contact either by email or by phone as the rush is very much over and Gigaclear and Boxcom are both very keen to ensure that these remaining customers are able to enjoy the service soon. SHPC AGM REPORT

Below is a summary of the Parish Council AGM, for a full copy of the minutes see the PC website noted at the bottom.

Thames Valley Police - Inspector Ollie Holland

For the Eynsham neighbourhood area including Stanton Harcourt, the following statistics were reported:

All crime is down 25%

Burglary is down 42% (Dwelling by 47% and non-dwelling by 39%)

Theft of motor vehicle is down by 60%

Theft from motor vehicle is down 40%

All other theft is down 35%

Criminal Damage is down 19%

Violent crime against the person (assaults) is down 20%

Stanton Harcourt Primary School – Karen Jupp, Head Teacher

Karen Jupp provided an update on the School, outlining the transition to an Academy and its benefits.

- Advantages: procurement, services, more of our own money, no changes for staff other than more accountability which is a good thing, centrally employed staff to oversee school imp, finances etc a critical friend always at the ready
- Further advantages for children more interaction with other children with whom they will end up at secondary school, money for provision for more sports and arts events across the partnership, closer working relationships amongst staff and training opportunities -

- very positive result of closer financial as well as professional collaboration
- LA recently audited provision at the school as part of conversion process and are happy with our current grading as Outstanding
- How the MAT will work Directors me as primary expert, secondary head, members of secondary community, DBE appointed directors, 2 from community primary sector, 2 further directors, chosen for their skills once a skills audit has been done
- Our little school is on the map at national level as no group of schools has done what we have done and I've made sure we're known at the highest levels

Report from the Parish Council – Glyn Jones, Vice Chairman

The Vice-Chairman provided a report for the past year: When I was thinking of what to say tonight, I went through all of the Parish Council Minutes for the past 12 months. I must say that I feel we have had a productive and harmonious year.

Planning is a major part of our work. So what does the Parish Council do?

Given the importance of planning, I thought, therefore, I'd outline how we go about it.

All applications are sent to the Parish Council Clerk. Trudi will then circulate it to the members of the Parish Council. Importantly, this is done on a one-by-one basis. Importantly, we don't receive the application, get together and agree a collective view. Rather, once we receive the application, we would visit the site, mark up our comments and pass it on to the next Parish Councilor, who does the same.

There are a number of other small but vitally important responsibilities we do that I think makes Stanton Harcourt and Sutton such a great place to live. This includes — organizing the dog fouling bins, grass cutting, bulb planting and the annual litter pick. Incidentally, it was really heartening to see such a wonderful turnout for this year's litter pick.

We also represent the village at key events – such as the Poppy Day service; we also recently represented the village at the induction of the new Reverend, Andrew Tweedie, and his wife Billie – who is a licensed lay minister. At the induction, the Bishop of Dorchester quipped that we had got a 'two for one deal'.

Another important event has been Gigaclear going live. I suspect that this will have all sorts of very positive social and business benefits for the village – people being able to set up businesses here, being able to work from home etc. The Parish Council, of course, had no direct role in this, other than facilitating, where it could, what Stanton Harcourt and Sutton wanted.

In particular, we have had, I feel, a very constructive mutual working relationship with the SHAPE Committee who are doing some great things and it has been a pleasure working with them and supporting them.

The year, however, has not been one of unrestrained success. In particular, the three points that concern me most are:

- The continued problems of lorry movements around the village.
- 2. The very real encroachment of the industrial estate on the village.
- 3. The ever-present problem issue of the traveller's site. This is always there in the background.

Please be assured that the Parish Council will do its very best to resolving all of these issues.

One final point. I would like to thanks Charles Mathew for all of his hard work over the year. It is a fact that Charles shoulders by far the greatest volume of work of the PC and puts the rest of us to shame. He is also constantly pushing for our best interests at district and county levels. Also, to be frank, I suspect he is the only one of us – or even in Oxfordshire I suspect – that really understands OCC's policy on Minerals and Waste
