NATURE NOTES

14th December

The low angle of the winter sun shining through the white, fluffy seed heads of the wild clematis light up the hedgerows.

It is these seed heads that give our only native clematis species the name Old Man's Beard. Its other popular name is Traveller's Joy, probably because in July and August it is covered with lovely little cream flowers; these are not only a joy to the eye but are also a popular nectar source for insects. There is an abundance of this around the village; our chalky soil is its preferred location.


21st December

WELL READING

Since the flooding in February and March 2014 the well level has steadily dropped until it bottomed out at -17.33 metres at the end of November/beginning of December. Since then the water level has risen just under 2 metres and it now stands at 15.43 metres. This is some 2.1 metres higher than the reading at the end of December 2013. However unlike last year, December 2014 has been quite a dry month and as long as the coming January and February aren't very wet, I don't think we need fear a repeat of the floods in the coming months - the Pang will stay safely underground!
