### The Local Plan

Patrik Says .....

Dear Residents

Welcome to my second Councillor's News-Letter. I'm starting to enjoy writing these.

This month was marred by the forthcoming Local Plan. In a last ditch attempt, our MP Helen Whately called in the Plan to Sajid Javid, the Secretary of State for Communities and Local Government.

As a result, all work at MBC ground to a sudden halt. Many committee meetings were cancelled and for me, as a Councillor, it appeared that August was extended (usually there is very little work for us during August). The officers however were busy running around and trying hardest to organise the chaos. The Full Council Meeting of 27 September was cancelled and the Local Plan was held in limbo.

Helen's intention was well meaning, hoping to reduce the housing numbers and stopping the controversial Junction 8 development.

Shock & horror!! - when just days after call-in, Mr Javid announced his plans for even higher housing numbers nationally! – you can't win in local politics!

As it stands, while I am writing, next Wednesday 25 Oct, the Local Plan will come before a special meeting of the Full Council. – Did you notice something? Yes, the Borough's most important meeting for the next 15 years is held during school half term – Ooops! -- I, for one, won't be able to attend.

As this may be, the Plan will most likely be ratified with the votes of the Liberals and some Independents.

We Conservatives will have a free vote, and many of our rural councillors will vote against it, in loud and strong protest: The Plan will expand excessively many villages, most of all Lenham, contains many unsuitable rural development sites (Hollingbourne and Staplehurst are amongst them) and it will give a green light to a business park near Junction 8. Traffic and infrastructure improvements are minimal, if not even counterproductive.

On a positive note, the Plan has no serious implications for us in Stockbury nor the AONB. A proposed development near Bimbury Lane/Aerodrome will be kicked in the very tall grass for now, and the Plan gives MBC some powers to defeat inappropriate enlargements, which otherwise may be thrust upon us by developers.

The choice is between a rock and a hard place.....

If you are not too busy, drop by to the Parish Council meetings and I would be very pleased to meet you there.

There are rumours, that afterwards I can be found in our Harrow Pub. (Are those rumours true, Patrik?) - Ed

Over the past couple of months we've read 2 fairly short books; both were light reads and very entertaining.

The first was a biography by Jean Trumpington entitled "Coming up Trumps". Jean writes about her long and remarkable life in a witty, very opinionated style.

We enjoyed reading about her varied and colourful life, from when she studied art in Paris, became a land girl during World War II, was involved in Naval Intelligence at Bletchley and had some very happy years as a Headmaster's wife in Cambridge. She finally embarked on a political career and many of her tales feature well-known names.

We found it interesting to learn about the opinions of these people and we all enjoyed reading about her life when at Bletchley. We gave a score of 6 out of 10.

The second book was the very popular "A Street Cat Named Bob" by James Bowen. We gave it a score of 7 out of 10.

At the start, we read about how James, a busker in London, struggles to control his drug addiction and improve his life.

He tells us about how he found Bob, a stray ginger tom cat and how the relationship between them made a huge difference to his life. James takes on responsibility for caring for Bob, takes him busking with him and by the end of the book has managed to look forward in a positive way and make improvements in his life.

We thought that James's story gave us a thoughtful insight into the life of him and others who work on the streets as buskers or Big Issue sellers and we found the conclusion quite moving and positive. One comment was that the book gives a voice to someone who wouldn't normally be considered to be a writer. There is a sequel to this book, "The Further Adventures of Bob" which most of us would like to read and we plan to watch the film of Bob and James at Christmas.

#### **Stockbury Gardeners**

I have just returned from a long walk with my dog's through Stockbury. Before settling down to write this piece I always try to focus on what's happening outside in the garden. The wind has just stopped blowing hard after "Hurricane Brian" and he has stripped a lot of still healthy leaves from the trees, it is lucky that we have not had a repeat of 1987. The Autumn has started to change the colour of the trees now and it's my favourite time of the year, looking at the assorted colours from brown to green and yellow and red. This year the berries are in abundance, pyracanthas is one example where the birds will be able to feed well into the winter.

I have seen reports that Red Admiral butterflies have made a healthy return this year, mainly due to the warm weather at the start of summer. That is good news, apparently they have been reported as increasing in numbers by around 75%.


This month the following can be carried out, don't think that because its nearly winter that you can put your feet up!! The following list is extensive so come on get stuck in.

- Collect seeds from seed heads and dry them for use next year.
- Prune roses to stop wind rock, take out wood which once removed will stop the wind damaging fine roots
- Prune shrubs that are overcrowded or out of shape.
- Maintain garden tools, clean with wire wool and oil blades
- Check for vine weevil in indoor pots and treat as required
- Take hardwood cuttings especially roses.
- Sow sweet peas now.

This month in the Gardeners we have a talk from Tom Hart Dyke, which was mentioned last month; he will be at the village hall at 8pm on the 2<sup>nd</sup> November, we should be able to purchase his latest book as well. For those of you who may be at The Harrow that evening, Tom will be having supper prior to the meeting. All are welcome, the cost is £3.00 per person, members are free.

- Following attendance at a Police Liaison meeting, the Parish Council was informed that PCSO's will no longer attend Parish Council meetings or presumably send any reports. The connection between them and the PC would appear to be discontinued. In view of this and general concern regarding any Police presence in Stockbury, a letter will be sent to the relevant Police representative asking for some dialogue on this matter.
- Concern was expressed on behalf of a resident about lorries parking for extended periods on Chalky Road.
   Considerable amounts of litter is being left behind.
  - A resident brought the PC's attention to a 'Quiet Lanes Project' being administered by the Campaign for the Protection of Rural England. He asked the PC to consider adopting this in the Parish as his experience of this in other areas was that it had made some improvement to local lanes and had not cost much to implement. The PC agreed to consider the matter.
- Another resident (busy month!) raised the matter of the bus stop at the bottom of Honeycrock Hill. It would seem that an Arriva bus driver had informed one of her family members that buses would no longer be stopping there as it was considered too dangerous and difficult to exit the lay-by. The question was therefore asked – where is our nearest bus stop? Our MBC Councillor, Patrik Garten, agreed to take this up with Arriva, in an attempt to clarify and resolve the issue.
