

It is one of the highest accolades a parish can bestow, symbolizing deep gratitude and respect for the recipient's dedication, achievements, or leadership.

Key Aspects of Freedom of the Parish

·Significance:

 It acknowledges those who have gone above and beyond to support and enhance the parish, often through long-standing service, voluntary work, or outstanding achievements.

•Historical Roots:

 The concept dates back centuries to when "freemen" of towns were granted special privileges. Today, it is a symbolic gesture rather than a legal status.

•<u>Recipients:</u>

 Individuals who have served on a parish council for many years, contributed to community projects, or demonstrated exceptional leadership may be considered for the honour.

•Recognition:

 The award is usually presented in a formal ceremony, often accompanied by a certificate or plaque, and is recorded in parish records.

So what has changed with me the last few months? Well firstly, once I knew more people within the local community were willing to stand as Trustees for Bobbing Village Hall. I stood back and then resigned from being Trustee, leaving me being able to commit more time to being a Councillor, both for Bobbing Parish and also for wider Swale. Now the Willage Hall has a healthy number of Trustees, both from the Parish Council and also from groups using the Village Hall.

You may have seen that in December last year there has been a White Paper published about devolution of local councils. What exactly this will mean for local residents is not at the moment totally clear. However I san reassure you that there is a lot of work taking part behind the scenes to ensure that Swale can get the best possible outcome.

The Friends of Rose Hill is a group set up to promote and enhance the Rose Hill woods - the woodland behind the Grove Park playing fields.

We meet monthly and arrange litter picks, bird walks and bat evenings etc, as well as helping to implement the Swale Borough Council Management Plan for the area.

We liaise with the Borough Council on a regular basis to get dumped rubbish removed from the woods or to get dangerous fallen trees made safe.

Last year we planted over 100 new trees and worked on reducing the predominance of sycamores in the woods to enable a wider variety of trees to become established.

Currently we are putting the finishing touches to an information board that will be set up in the eastern corner of the woods where the path leaves the playing field and enters the woodland area.

Our Facebook Group is Friends of Rose Hill where we let people know about upcoming events and encourage the sharing of photos of the woods throughout the year.

One of the roles we carry out is to conduct surveys of the flora and fauna in the woods, and we have established the presence of rare species including both gold crests and fire crests - as well as regular bat surveys and reports on the Tree Preservation Orders (TPOs) across the woods.

This tree, adorned was purchased by the Parish Council in 2022, has brought joy to children, parents, and parishioners for the past three years. The tree, which cost over £2,250 plus VAT, was funded through the parish precept—contributions from every resident of Bobbing.

This theft has cast a shadow over our community's festive spirit, and we are determined to seek justice. A reward is being offered for information leading to a successful prosecution of those responsible.

2025 could be a busy year for councillors, as the Government looks set to move forward their Devolution Priority Programme.

What is the DPP? The Government say that it's the framework of how they will hand down powers, functions, and funding to local government. It's likely that all council's will be made to do this, but councils can apply now for additional funding and a fast-track programme. Kent County and Medway Councils have submitted a bid to be included in this.

Swale Council, and other district councils have had no say in this, but the decision, if accepted by government, will mean the end of Swale Borough Council. In basic terms, the KCC elections this year could be scrapped, an election in 2026 will see a Mayor for Kent elected, and in 2027 it will be all out elections for the new councils. No more KCC or Swale Borough Council.

There is a lot of work to be done, and of course, it isn't guaranteed that Kent will be accepted, but what this could look like is three or four councils across Kent, with Swale joining with Medway (or/and other areas) to create a North Kent Council.

There are a lot of questions that need to be answered, and my first was what impact will this have on residents - at this stage nobody knows.

My personal view, at this time, is that this could be a good idea. Too often I come across issues that I am unable to deal with because it is down to KCC, and explaining the different tiers of local government isn't easy. It is difficult for residents to understand which council does what, and who they need to go to. Having just one council for an area fixes this.

The downside is there will be less councillors, looking after a bigger area, meaning less visibility and accessibility of councillors. I think it will also be seen as a more permanent role, with daytime meetings, excluding a lot of current councillors who work or have families - limiting the diversity of the representation of communities.

I think that things will move quickly on this, and we may know an outcome by the time you read this article. I will always update residents via my Facebook page, Cllr James Hunt, as soon as I have the latest information.

Friends of the Meads Woodland Community Group


The Meads Woodlands is a treasured community space that blends nature with a rich historical connection. Among its highlights is the re-creation, of an ancient henge site, positioned close to its original location.

These reconstructions honour the heritage of the area, with the poles carefully aligned and arranged to reflet their historical configurations.

The Woodland was planted in the 1990s and left to mature. As time went by it became an important stopover for migrating birds as well as home for the resident birds which include woodpeckers, jays, sparrowhawks, buzzards and finches, to name but a few.

This site is extremely important to our community but has been neglected over time, so Cllr James Hunt has set up this group to assist in the management of the community woodland.

We are a small friendly group and would welcome more volunteers to give a couple of hours a month to litter pick etc. We also meet once a month at the Jenny Wren to discuss and plan going forward. All our details are on facebook Friends of The Meads Community Woodland





How to Take Part:

- 1. Choose an Hour: Pick any hour between 24th and 26th January 2025.
- 2. Watch and Record: Spend the hour watching the birds that land in your garden, balcony, or local green space.
 - Only record the birds that land.
 - Note the highest number of each bird species you see at one time.

3.Submit Your Results: Share your findings online or by post, even if you don't see any birds—it's all helpful data!
