Important Information From Boughton Malherbe Parish Council

Government Help for the most medically vulnerable residents who have been advised to self isolate at home for a period of 3 months and do not have support from family and friends to help with shopping, collecting prescriptions etc.

In response to Government requests, Maidstone Borough Council (MBC) has set up a Community Hub to assist vulnerable residents within the Borough during the **Coronavirus** emergency.

The Hub aims to provide similar assistance to that set up by the Boughton Malherbe Parish Community Emergency Plan, which you can read about elsewhere in this magazine and on the Parish Council website.

It is understood that the Hub can provide the added benefit of free Grocery parcels which is something that our own Emergency Plan could not do on a regular basis.

We hope to co-operate with the Hub to ensure that its supplies and services get to the needy within our Parish, as and when required.

The news of the MBC Hub came after our own Community Emergency Plan was set up, and too late for us to establish and publish in this magazine the full details of exactly how the Hub will work, and how our Community Emergency Plan can work alongside it.

Neighbourhood Watch - Covid 19 Advice

Covid 19 Scam Prevention Advice

Scammers and criminals are already looking for opportunities to scam people as a result of the Coronavirus / COVID-19 pandemic. Happily, there are many more stories of kindness and generosity but we want to make people aware of the scams as they emerge – which they seem to be on a daily basis.

There have been reports received by Kent Police of people door-knocking and claiming to be from the Health Authority.

What happens:

- The criminal knocks on your door.
- They claim to be from the Health Authority.
- They offer to do COVID-19 testing on residents.
- There are also reports of the criminal offering to take the residents temperature.

THIS IS A SCAM!

What to do:

- Do not let them in.
- Do not allow them to take any money or details from you
- Report to Kent Police on 101.
- If you ask them to leave and they don't, contact the police on 999.

Please warn vulnerable family members, friends and neighbours.

Report

There has been a report of an elderly Kent resident who lost money when they gave their bank card to someone who offered to do some shopping for them. They received one of these cards through their door and an individual offered to help, however, they actually stole money from the resident and were not seen again.

Payment

Don't ever give your bank or card details to anyone, even if you think you know them

very well. You could either agree to pay in cash after they have delivered the shopping or pay them online if you have the facility to do so. Or maybe you could agree another method of payment - **but never give your bank or card details.**

Grafty Gourmet

This is a traditional Tuscan recipe. Although the fortified wine Marsala comes straight from Sicily, it is used a lot in Tuscan cooking. You can't miss with the delicious combination of Marsala and red peppers in this quick recipe.

Chicken with Marsala and Red Peppers

6 boneless, skinless chicken breasts halved
½ cup flour
2 tablespoon of extra-virgin olive oil
salt and freshly ground pepper
1 red pepper, thinly sliced
1 cup Marsala wine
½ cup of water
chopped parsley for garnish

- 1. Butterfly the chicken breasts by carefully cutting them open horizontally. Flour each breast on both sides.
- 2. In a large pan, brown the chicken breasts in olive oil. Lightly salt and pepper each side. Remove chicken breasts, and set aside.
- 3. Add sliced red peppers to the pan and sauté on high heat for 2-3 minutes until lightly browned. Return chicken to pan and add the Marsala and water.
- 4. Cover the pan and cook until juices run clear, not pink, when chicken is pierced with a fork (6-8 minutes). Serve garnished with chopped parsley.

It is a regret that we have to cancel our April meeting and Spring Show in the village hall. Lucy Adams (Head Gardener at Doddington) has been advised and has offered to come to talk to us at a later date. We are sorry to also have to cancel the planned coach trip to Leonardslee 9th May

The Plant Sale Saturday 2nd May will only go ahead if the weather is fine and it can be held on the Village Green. Members will be advised of other changes to our programme of events as and when they happen.

The Garden in April - On a brighter note Spring is here and the sun has made a couple of appearances to remind us to get busy in the garden. Penstemons can be cut down to the new shoots to keep plants compact and Dahlia tubers can be started off in pots to be planted out in early June. Lavender and other silver leaved plants should be trimmed back once they have reached the size you want them to grow. Weeding is easy at the moment when the earth is still damp. In the kitchen garden seedlings can be thinned out and leek sown. Sowing crops in succession will avoid having a glut of produce at any one time.

Finding different housing solutions

It's been a busy few months of campaigning as we continue to challenge Maidstone Borough Councillors and persuade them to think differently about their garden community proposal.

We supported the parish council's recent consultation on the Local Neighbourhood Plan (LNP) and attended the open days to field any questions from residents on the garden community proposal. We believe that once the LNP is adopted it will help local residents take back control of strategic planning for our village, and make it more difficult for MBC to secure planning permission for the scheme.

On 22 April the Council will consider a progress report on the garden community at its Policy and Resources Committee. This report will review the outcome of the negotiations with the landowners, along with an update on the survey work they have undertaken. We should then have a better view of how likely the scheme is to proceed further and will keep you updated.

SOHL committee members continue to put challenging questions to the local councillors at their committee meetings to keep them on their toes and the scheme in the public eye.

We need to persuade Maidstone Borough Council that Lenham Heath is not the right location for a garden community and it's not about NIMBYISM.

Our focus over the coming months is to embark on a programme to identify alternative solutions to get MBC to think differently about its approach to local housing issues in the borough. This will include encouraging the Council to be creative and ambitious in its vision for reinvesting in Maidstone town centre, taking into account the changing retail landscape, making more efficient use of redundant or under-utilised buildings and earmarking commercial and industrial areas for residential housing.

The recent landmark ruling on the Government's aviation national plan policy statement was significant. Developers and public authorities are going to be held more accountable when it comes to the climate impact of their new housing schemes. Maidstone Borough Council declared its own climate emergency last April and agreed to be carbon neutral as a borough by 2030.

Yet this is contrary to their plans for a garden community which would involve a motorway junction generating thousands of car trips each day and the loss of nearly 900 hectares of biodiversity and greenfield land.

Air pollution, transport and landscape issues are just some of the key areas we will need to challenge if they decide to go ahead with the garden community. That's when we will be calling upon local residents to help us raise vital funds to engage a planning lawyer and experts so that we can build a case to fight this proposal.



Christian Message - April 2020

Somebody challenged me the other day to define what I meant by 'shame'. I was stumped because I'd never thought about it although I had felt it! Here's what the dictionary says; "A painful feeling of humiliation or distress caused by the consciousness of wrong or foolish behaviour".

We don't talk about it, but I think there's a lot of shame around. There's shame that we haven't done well enough in education or in life, there's shame that we have been too privileged when others in the world are so poor, there's shame that we haven't done as well as our parent would have expected, and so on. The list is huge. Nearly everybody feels shame because we are all messed up people. We're not only messed up: we're also full of potential and hope – but we know we're messed up too. The Bible calls this messed-upness "sin".

The things we're ashamed of are getting much bigger these days as we realise the mess we've made of the planet and the danger of actually destroying it. Sin isn't just individual, it's also communal.

Easter turns this around. Easter is hope like a yellow daffodil blooming on a dark day. Easter when Christians remember that Jesus, as God-on-earth, died a nasty and messy death, but then overcame all that messiness and rose again to life. If we look into the face of Jesus on the cross, or walking with his disciples after he rose again, our shame can be removed and released.

For those of us who feel we have person reasons to feel shame, experiencing God's goodness as that shame is released can be utterly transformational. It is like feeling the warmth of the sun for the first time. Gratefulness is good but gratefulness leads us to live transformed lives, individually and communally.
