FESTIVE BIN COLLECTIONS - Any extra recycling that won't fit in the recycling bin can be put in clear sacks next to the bin for collection. In dry weather residents can also leave large, flattened cardboard boxes (max 1m x 1m) next to their green bin but make sure polystyrene and plastic packaging is removed first.

CHRISTMAS TREES - Garden Waste customers can leave real Christmas trees out for collection next to their garden waste containers from **January 8th** (on your next collection day). Trees over 6 ft should be cut in half and all decorations should be removed. Real Christmas trees can also be recycled at one of the drop-off points across the borough between Tuesday 2nd January and Sunday 28th January 2024. WRAPPING AND CARDS - If you are sending cards or wrapping presents, residents are advised to choose recyclable Christmas wrapping paper and cards. Wrapping paper often has glitter on it and is generally poor-quality paper so cannot be recycled and needs to go into the grey waste bin. Brown paper, with ribbon and sellotape removed, can be recycled. Choosing Christmas cards which do not contain glitter, ribbons or bows means they can be recycled too. If you are unsure about what can and can't be recycled visit **www.basingstoke.gov.uk/recycle** or call the council on **01256 844844**.

When to see a Musculo Skeletal First Contact Physiotherapist (FCP)

FCP's have extensive experience in the assessment and management of Musculoskeletal (MSK) conditions and see these patients as the first point of contact.

The aim of this service is to ensure timely access to a diagnosis and management of a wide range of MSK conditions, e.g. soft tissue injuries, sprains and strains, joint pains, arthritis or spinal pain. Once the FCP has completed the assessment and diagnosis made, advice and guidance will be issued regarding how best to manage the condition. This will often be accompanied with an exercise programme carried out independently by a patient. If needed, the FCP will also arrange further investigations or referral on to more specialist services.

Adult Flu and Covid vaccination programmes

If you have not had your Flu vaccination and are over 65 or have been invited (underlying health condition reason) please call the practice and book an appointment. Please note that the Flu vaccination programme goes on until the 31st March 2024 (or as long as Flu supplies last).

Child Flu Clinics

We are still working through contacting the parents of eligible children who are aged 2-3 yrs or aged 4-17 with an underlying health condition. Children in years R-7 will be vaccinated in school by the School Health Service.





The nights are well and truly drawing in and the first frost has just given the early morning a proper bite – but The Cricket Club is already looking forward to next season.

We had a fantastic end of season dinner (pie, mash and peas) and awards with nearly 40 people in attendance. The speeches of the two skippers, Steve Hanney and Charlie Richards, reflected on our Saturday and midweek league seasons.

All of our evening league home matches were played on the Park House Stables Ground – what a beautiful place to play cricket. We won our division of the North Hampshire Evening League! This meant we went on to play in "finals day" against the winners of the other two higher divisions. (Let's just put that day down to experience, shall we?)

On Saturdays, in the Hampshire League Division 4 North, we finished fifth with a record of played 12, won 8, lost 4. All home matches were played at the Fieldgate and it's a huge credit to Norman Howe that throughout the season the wicket played the best it has ever done. The end of season batting awards went to Ross Andrews (League) and Jack Grove-White (evening league. Bowling awards went to Ed Lyle (League) and Alfie Thompson (Evening League). Player's Player award in League matches went to Pete Frith and the Evening League Captain's Player award to Jack Grove-White. Clubman of the year was Charlie Richards.

The Club also owes huge thanks to Anna Lisa and Andrew Balding and everyone at Park House Stables who make the club so welcome for our evening league fixtures.

Citizens Advice Bureau



Have you changed your mind about something you've bought?

If you just change your mind, no matter how expensive - it's down to the seller whether they offer you anything.

If you bought the item from a shop

Check the shop's returns policy. Shops may say you can return items within 14 or 30 days, as long as they're not used. You'll always be protected if something is faulty. Take your receipt with you and return the item in its original packaging.

If you bought the item online, over the phone or by mail order

Check the seller's terms and conditions to find out if you can return the item. Check who will pay for the return postage and if the original delivery cost is refunded. Your rights might be different for purchases from abroad.

You get a 14-day **'cooling-off period'** from the day after receipt when you buy something you haven't seen in person (unless bespoke/made to measure). There doesn't need to be anything wrong with the item to get a refund. If you paid for standard delivery, the seller has to refund it. Some items don't have a cooling-off period, e.g. perishables, bespoke items, anything from a private individual (social media or online auction site), CD/DVD/software if you break the seal on the wrapping, an item with a broken hygiene seal - like an earring.

The Church Pages




Hello,

December is upon us, and with it the close of another year. I wonder how 2023 has been for you? It has certainly been a big year for us, moving from Cambridgeshire to become your new vicar, getting to know so many new people, and creating a new home among you.

December also brings the shortest day. The speed with which the days shorten once we've put the clocks back always surprises me, and on the 22nd it will get dark by 3:30 pm! With colder and wetter weather too, it can be a troubling time of year for many, especially for anyone suffering from Seasonal Affective Disorder (SAD). The charity, Mind, quotes a sufferer describing the symptoms on their website, "it's like having your own portable black cloud". There really is something we dislike about the dark. We use the term to describe things which worry us or that cause us fear. "These are dark times" is a familiar sentiment, especially if you read or watch the news. The headlines today, as I write, are about the Israel/Gaza conflict, the protests and counter-protests this has caused, Storms Ciaran and Debi, and the cost-of-living crisis.

December also brings us Christmas, when we celebrate God coming to earth in human form in the birth of Jesus. Jesus said, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will never walk in darkness, but will have the light of life." In the book of Genesis in the Bible, at the very creation of the world, we're told that "the earth was formless and empty, darkness was over the surface of the deep, and the Spirit of God was hovering over the waters". At the very beginning, there was just emptiness, darkness, and God. Then God said, "Let there be light". And there was light. Where did it come from? Certainly not from the emptiness or the darkness. His light makes everything look different, even storms or wars, nothing will be the same again when you have Him as your light. As we head into 2024, I pray that each of you will have the new year illuminated by the Greatest Light, and that darkness will be a thing of the past.

The Garden in December

24

As the year comes to an end, gardening has been difficult this winter. Rain has delayed gathering up the fallen leaves. The result of this can be seen when it's been dry enough to gather them up, the grass has turned slightly yellow and, in some cases, areas more bare. When retrieving the leaves that are on the lawn, a plank could be used to stand on to prevent damage to the grass.

If the weather permits, a few jobs can be done, sow hardy broad beans under cloches or in the greenhouse, also sow winter lettuce. Bare rooted roses can be planted now as can deciduous shrubs and trees. Last chance to plant tulips. Pot up amaryllis bulbs for the house, they grow quickly and make a lovely plant.

When the weather gets really cold and frosty, protect plants grown in pots. If you have some sacking, this will help.

The plants in the borders and beds that have finished flowering should be cut back, most have been spoiled by the rain, so will look unattractive if frosted. Take a moment to look at any brassicas that are in the garden, brussels sprouts will be ready to harvest. Yellow leaves on brassicas need to be removed to prevent diseases, also makes them look very untidy.

Trim any branches from trees and shrubs if they become a nuisance, taking into account, that some shrubs flower early in the spring, so avoid these as you will be cutting away the flowering shoots.

As we store our tools away now till the spring, consider having any sharpening done before they are stored, so they are ready to use for the new season, as we all know good tools make a job easier.

Planting and winter-potting is a nice thing to do: Heuchera, outdoor Cyclamen, Skimmia and Ophiopogon (which is a black grass like plant) - all will look great in the winter. This time of year, the garden depends on good foliage to give colour. Many of the hardy shrubs are variegated, so they stand out well on dull days.



The lovely autumn colour of the trees that seemed to be late this year have finished. We are grateful for the winter flowering Viburnum, Mahonia, Elaeagnus, Winter Jasmine, plus the berries of the cotoneaster and holly.

Hopefully, December will be a dryer month and we will have the opportunity to catch up in the garden.

Nature Notes

I like Autumn. It gets colder, the leaves change colour and I get to wear my woolly hat and gloves. During October half term, I went on a bike ride with my family through a forest in Farnham. The woods were very mysterious, dark and had a very earthy smell. I found out afterwards that the Mary Rose was built using oak trees from the same forest and Romans used to make pottery there. It must be a very old place.

While cycling through, we stopped and saw so many different types of mushrooms growing in all sorts of places. Purple mushrooms growing around a chestnut tree. Tiny translucent (that means light shines through, but you can't actually see through) mushrooms growing on just one stick that was laying on the forest floor. Thousands of little yellow tube-like mushrooms, growing along the roots of pine trees and all over the moss. There were even three mushrooms growing out of one small pinecone! They were my favourites.



Recently, I have seen lots of robins in my back garden. I have left bird seed outside for them to eat but they don't seem to be interested in it. I went outside to see what they were all doing, and I noticed that they were flying into a clump of ivy growing up a tree and eating wasps straight out of the air. I even saw one robin eat a few of our honeybees! I don't think my dad will notice the bees are missing from the hive, but I haven't told him yet just in case he gets sad. Lily K
